# Pong Dam oustees' land sold in R'sthan using fake papers

Four Pong Dam oustees from Nurpur have fallen prey to the land mafia and lost their lands allotted to them in Jaisalmer district, Rajasthan, after their displacement in Himachal Pradesh.

Parkash Chand of Talara, Baldev Raj of Sukhar, Gorkhi Ram of Bhugnara and Sadhu Ram of Bhatolli-Fakorian (Haripur) were allotted 6.25 hectares each in Nachan of Jaisalmer district.

They had got ownership rights of the land after two decades and were cultivating it through hired labour. But during the pandemic, the land mafia allegedly sold their lands



to locals through sale deeds by using forged documents. The mafia made forged power of attorneys on behalf of the oustees by using their Aadhaar cards and got these attested from a notary public in Sriganaganagar. The notary public, whose stamps, name and signatures were used, had died five years ago. The gang kingpin first bought and got the lands transferred in his favour in August. He further sold these lands to the locals.

The victims, who had

returned to their native places after the lockdown, startled to know when someone from Rajasthan rang them that their lands had been sold. They have been running from pillar to post to get a forgery case registered against the mafia.

They have appealed to the CM. Hans Raj, president of the Pong Dam Ousteers' Samiti, said many had lost their land through forged sale deeds but no action had been taken against the mafia in Rajasthan which also had a nexus with some government employees in HP. He said these employees provided details to the mafia about the owners and their lands allotted in Rajasthan.

# Low-lying areas of Himayatsagar remain on high alert due to rain

Officials have sounded a flood alert in the Musi river in Hyderabad as water in the two reservoirs upstream, Himayatsagar and Osmansagar, has reached the brim following heavy rains in catchment areas.

The excess floodwater is likely to be released into Musi, which passes through the city. Officials said on Sunday night that Osmansagar is nearing its capacity and is receiving 2,222 cusecs.

Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply and

Sewerage Board (HMWS&SB) officials have alerted district administration of Ranga Reddy and Hyderabad along with Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) and police to secure hutments, encroachments in the course of the river.

"On Sunday night, depending on the rainfall received in upstream areas and flows into the reservoir, the water board is likely to release excess from Himayatsagar," an official said. The proposed opening of gates on Saturday was put off as the inflows reduced.

Himayatsagar has water

at 1753.45 feet against full tank level (FTL) of 1763.50 feet. At Osmansagar it is 1771.90 feet against FTL of 1790 feet. The reservoir has been receiving 555 cusec inflows.

Speaking to *Deccan Chronicle*, HMWS&SB official V. Renuka, who is monitoring water levels at Himayatsagar, said that inflows have been stabilised from Sunday morning. Venkatrao, monitoring Osmansagar, said that inflows were normal and that there was no need to release water.

The Hyderabad police has advised people in areas on the banks of the

river to be on alert.

Due to heavy rains in the catchment areas of the Musi river, flash floods are likely and it is better to be alert in low-lying areas like Kishanbagh, Ziaquda, Puranapul, MGBS, Chaderghat and Golnaka.

GHMC has asked deputy commissioners and zonal commissioners of Golconda, Asifnagar, Bahadurpura, Nampally, Charminar, Himayatnagar and Saidabad to be on high alert for inundation and evacuation.

Officials are also keeping a watch on the water level at other lakes including the Hussainsagar.

# All Vij barrage gates opened

All gates of Prakasam Barrage in Vijayawada have been lifted on Sunday to release Krishna floodwaters into the sea. According to officials, nearly six lakh cusecs of water is being released from the barrage.

District collector A. MD. Imtiaz held a teleconference with officials of various departments and asked them to be cautious about possible floods, as six lakh cusecs of water is likely to reach Prakasam Barrage by 10 pm on Sunday, when the second flood warning will be

Imtiaz said irrigation minister Anilkumar Yadav has reviewed the situation with district officials. He said the first flood warning was issued at 11.30 am on Sunday. He asked officials of various departments to be vigilant and plunge into action whenever an emergency crops up.

The collector instructed tahsildars of Kanchikacherla, Jaggayyapet, Penamaluru, Thotlavallur

and Kankipada to alert people in their areas and take all precautionary measures. Similar directions have been issued with regard Chandra-lapadu, Chinalanka and Pedalanka of Ibrahimpatnam mandal.

The teleconference was attended by joint collector K. Madhavalatha, sub-collector H. M. Dhyanchandra, Pulichentala project superintendent, apart from engineering and irrigation officials.

The Kondaveeti Vagu is continuing to overflow cutting off the connection between old Amaravathi and capital Amaravati, Mangalagiri and Vijayawada.

## Alert sounded all along Penna river

A high alert has been sounded all along the Penna River, including Nellore, as 1.02 lakh cusecs of water is being released downstream from Somasila Project. Revenue officials said measures are being taken to shift people living in

low-lying areas to safer places.

According to project officials, Somasila has 74.545 tmc feet of water and is receiving fresh inflows of 1,25,245 cusecs. As a result, 1,12,884 cusecs of water was being released as at 3 pm. This includes 1,01,764 cusecs released into the Penna River; 10,700 cusecs to Kandaleru dam and 420

cusecs to Somasila North Feeder Canal.

Fresh inflows are being attributed to heavy rains in Rayalaseema, especially Kadapa, during the last 48 hours.

Nellore corporation commissioner Dinesh Kumar has advised people living in vulnerable areas of 48th to 54th divisions to shift into six relief camps that

have been set up in the city.

Dinesh Kumar said arrangements for food have already been made at the relief camps.

He pointed out that the present release of 1.12 lakh cusecs of water is less than 1.50 lakh cusecs released a few ago from Somasila. The situation is under control, he added.

# Rains rejuvenate twin reservoirs

After three years, Himayath Sagar and Osman Sagar receive good inflows; Hussain Sagar also to the brim

After about three years, most of the 187 lakes in Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) limits are full to the brim due to the heavy rains that have lashed the city and suburbs in the last few days.

The twin reservoirs of Himayath Sagar and Osman Sagar have also received good inflows. Similarly, water level in Hussain Sagar continues to be over the full tank level of 513.41 mts. Though there were no heavy rains in the city on Sunday, the inflows continued into the twin reservoirs. The water level in Himayathsagar was 1,759.40 feet against the Full Reservoir Level of 1,763 feet at 6 pm on Sunday. Likewise, the water



level in Osman Sagar was 1,771 feet against the FRL of 1,790 feet. HMWSSB officials said flood gates of Himayath Sagar would be opened to release water downstream once the water level reaches 1,760 feet and depending on the inflows. Already, the revenue, police and municipal officials have

been put on alert in the wake of steady inflows into the reservoir. The water level in Hussain Sagar remained at 513.57 mts a notch over the FTL of 513.41 mts. Though, the inflows receded on Sunday, the water level continues to be over the FTL in the lake, said an official from GHMC.

## Respite for people in city

**HYDERABAD:** After the heavy rainfall on Friday night followed by moderate rainfall on Saturday, the intensity of monsoon has come down on Sunday with only a couple of parts in the city receiving light rainfall.

Except Secunderabad, which has received a rainfall (4.5 mm), most parts of the city either remained cloudy or witnessed slight drizzle today, according to Telangana State Development Planning Society (TSDPS).

During the last 24 hours in and around Hyderabad, the highest rainfall of 43.6 mm was recorded at Patancheru and across the State, maximum rainfall of 90.8 mm was received at

Lokeswaram in Nirmal district. The weather forecast with TSDPS said that light to moderate rain/ thunderstorms were expected at a few places in Greater Hyderabad for the next three days. Maximum temperatures were expected to be in the range of 30 degree Celsius to 32 degree Celsius while the minimum temperatures could be in the range of 21 degree Celsius to 23 degree Celsius.

Meanwhile, conditions were becoming favourable for withdrawal of southwest monsoon from west Rajasthan and adjoining areas in the next 24 hours, according to Meteorological Department, Hyderabad.

# Singur may touch full storage level

The hopes of Singur Project attaining full storage level (FRL) after a gap of three years have increased as the inflows to the projects have swelled to 23,000 cusecs on Saturday at 6 pm. The project has never attained FRL since 2017. Singur Multipurpose Project, built across river Manjira at Singur of Pulkal Mandal, is having 23 TMCft storage on Sunday at 6pm against its FRL of 29.91 TMCft.

Though the project has been getting moderate inflows since 10 days, the inflows have reduced to 3,000 cusecs by Friday evening. However, the fresh rains in the Manjira's catchment area have helped to increase the inflows into the project since Saturday morning. Since the river's catchment area has witnessed 45mm rainfall during the past 24 hours at 8.30am on Saturday, the inflows are expected to be consistent at least for the next couple of days. However, the inflows have come down to 9,286 cusecs on Sunday evening. Since the IMD is forecasting rains for next four to five days, the irrigation officials were expecting that that project will attain FRL.



## 20 crest gates of NSP lifted

**NALGONDA:** About 6,06,754 cusecs of water was being released downstream from Nagarjuna Sagar Project by lifting its 20 crest gates upto 20 feet height on Sunday. The NSP officials were operating the crest gates of the project based on the inflow for the last 20 days. The current inflow to the project was 6,06,754 cusecs. The water level in the project has reached a full reservoir level (FRL) of 590 feet and water storage reached a gross storage capacity of 312.045 tmc of water. NSP officials said that water equal to the inflow into the project was

being released to the downstream by lifting the 20 gates. In view of the holiday on Sunday, Nagarjuna Sagar also witnessed a huge number of tourists. Along with her family members, Badminton player P V Sindhu arrived at Nagarjuna Sagar and spent time at the project watching the water release. On the other hand, two crest gates of Musi project were also lifted releasing 2,570 cusecs of water to downstream while inflow into the project was recorded as 7,270 cusecs. The water level in the project touched 642.8 ft as against the FRL of 645 ft.

## Godavari receives heavy inflows

**NIZAMABAD:** Godavari received nearly one lakh cusecs from Maharashtra and another 65,000 cusecs received from local catchment area through Gadannavagu and river Manjeera on Sunday, authorities said.

With these heavy inflows, the river is in spate at Kandakurti and the ancient Shiva temple is submerged in flood waters. The water level was almost touching the Kandakurti inter-state bridge. Meanwhile, the SRSP received 1,64,922 cusecs inflows on Sunday, out of which 1.50 lakh cusecs of water was released into Godavari, by lifting 40 flood gates. The water was also being released into various canals. On Sunday, authorities released 1,68,913 cusecs of water from the SRSP project. The project now has 88.11 TMC of water. With the heavy inflows continuing, officials have begun to release more water than the inflow and were storing only 88 TMC's instead of 90.31 TMC's.

## Monsoon to withdraw from north in 2 days; rainy season to end on above-normal note

**NEW DELHI:** The south-west monsoon is set to retreat from parts of north India in the next two days, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said on Sunday, while data suggests that the rainy season is most likely to end on an above-normal note.

Overall, the country has received 9 per cent more rainfall than normal until September 26, according to data.

"Conditions are becoming favourable for withdrawal of monsoon from west Rajasthan and adjoining areas from September 28," the weather department said.

Mahesh Palawat, the vice president of private forecaster

Skymet Weather, said rainfall has reduced considerably.

"The withdrawal of monsoon from west Rajasthan is likely to start from tomorrow (Monday). It looks like monsoon will withdraw on an above-normal note," Palawat said. Rainfall in the range of 96 to 104 per cent of the Long Period Average (LPA) is considered as 'normal', while precipitation in the range of 104 to 110 per cent of the LPA is 'excess'.

Nine states have received excess rainfall, while 20 states have recorded normal precipitation, the data shows.

The official rainfall season in India is from June 1 to September 30. Monsoon arrived over Kerala on June 1, its normal onset date.

June recorded 17 per cent more rainfall, while July saw 10 per cent deficiency. However, there was an excess rainfall in August -- the month recorded 27 per cent more rainfall than normal.

Parts of north India -- Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir --- have recorded deficient rainfall.

The Union Territory of Ladakh has recorded high deficiency of rainfall this year.

Large parts of the country in west and south India, including Gujarat, Goa, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Karnataka, have received excess rainfall. Sikkim is the only state to have received large excess rainfall.

## 2.25 lakh affected by fresh floods in Assam

Guwahati: A total of 2.25 lakh people in Nine districts were affected and over 10,000 hectares of crops submerged on Sunday as fresh floods hit Assam, the state disaster management authority said. Dhemaji, Lakhimpur, Morigaon, Nagaon, Majuli, West Karbi Anglong, Sivasagar, Dibrugarh and Tinsukia districts have been affected, the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA) said in its report. Incessant rain in the last few days has triggered this year's third wave of floods in the state, claiming one life in Nagaon district on Saturday, it said. The fresh fatality has pushed the number of deaths in flood-related incidents in Assam this year to 118, the report said. The number of affected people was 1.8 lakh on the previous day. Nagaon is the worst-hit district with 1.51 lakh affected people, followed by Morigaon (32,711), Dhemaji (16,792) and Dibrugarh (10,622), the report said. Human habitations and farmland in 219 villages in nine districts are submerged, it said. The mighty Brahmaputra is flowing above the danger mark at Neamatighat in Jorhat district and Tezpur in Sonitpur.

अगले 24 घंटों के दौरान केरल, दक्षिण-पश्चिमी मध्य प्रदेश, जम्मू कश्मीर, गिलगित बाल्टिस्तान, मुजफ्फराबाद, बिहार के कुछ हिस्सों और विदर्भ के कुछ क्षेत्रों में हल्की से मध्यम बारिश हो सकती है। अगले इस दौरान उप-हिमालयी पश्चिम बंगाल, सिक्किम और पूर्वोत्तर भारत में कुछ स्थानों पर मध्यम से भारी बारिश जारी रहने की संभावना है। बिहार, उत्तर प्रदेश के पूर्वी और मध्य भागों, मध्य प्रदेश के उत्तरी और

मध्य हिस्सों, उप-हिमालयी पश्चिम बंगाल, सिक्किम, असम, मुंबई समेत कोंकण गोवा में मध्यम से भारी बारिश होने की संभावना है। अगले 24 घंटों के दौरान पूर्वोत्तर भारत, विदर्भ, मराठवाड़ा और मध्य महाराष्ट्र के कुछ हिस्सों में, दक्षिणी गुजरात में हल्की से मध्यम बारिश के साथ एक-दो स्थानों पर तेज वर्षा हो सकती है। तटीय कर्नाटक, केरल, ओड़ीशा, छत्तीसगढ़ और झारखंड में भी गर्जना के साथ हल्की बारिश के बीच एक-दो स्थानों पर मध्यम बौछारें गिरने की संभावना है। अगले 24 घंटों के दौरान हिमाचल प्रदेश, उत्तराखंड, राजस्थान, हरियाणा और उत्तर पश्चिमी उत्तर प्रदेश में हल्की बारिश संभव है। आंतरिक कर्नाटक, तेलंगाना और तमिलनाडु में बूदाबादी या हल्की वर्षा अपेक्षित है।
