BHAGIRATHA WATER AS PER WHO NORM: GOVT

Smita Sabharwal, secretary to Telangana Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao, has claimed that treatment of Mission Bhagiratha water is being carried out as per the highest standards of World Health Organisation.

Flood loss: Central team meets CM

CHIEF Minister Y S Jagan Mohan Reddy on Wednesday interacted with the Central team that toured the flood-affected areas in Andhra Pradesh for the last two days.

He thanked Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union home minister Amit Shah for sending the team, that called on him at the camp office here on Wednesday.

The team visited twin Godavari, Krishna, Guntur and Anantapur districts. The team visited Anantapur on the request of the Chief Minister as groundnut crop was badly damaged. The estimated loss is about Rs 8,084 crores, of which Rs 5,000 crore occurred due to infrastructure damages. Also, the agriculture and allied sectors suffered flood damage of Rs 3000 crore, as incessant rains occurred right before the harvesting period. The Chief Minister urged the Central team to help as much as possible on humanitarian grounds to cope up with the damage.

In addition to this, the Chief Minister asked the team to relax the norms while buying the damaged crops, else the farmers would suffer grave loss.

VP calls for change in lifestyle to make water conservation way of life

Underlining that water is a finite resource, Vice President Venkaiah Naidu on Wednesday called for a change in lifestyle and make water conservation a way of life.

He said reduced use of water also results in less use of energy required for pumping and supplying water to homes, offices and farming activities. In effect, it will also help in reducing pollution,

"Unless we reduce the wastage of water and take up saving and conservation of water on a war footing, there is a danger of potable water becoming a scarce resource in the future," Naidu

With the rising population, he said, urbanisation, industrialisation and expanding agricultural activities, the water requirement will continue to increase.

The key message that needs to be taken to people again and again is this:

the water that is available is finite. It is not unlimited. It is the responsibility of each and every citizen to save water and use it judiciously. The need of the hour is to change our lifestyles and make water conservation a way of life," Naidu said.

The vice president was speaking at the National Water Awards to honour the excellence in water management and conservation across the nation. Tamil Nadu bagged the 'Best State' award, followed by Maharashtra and Rajasthan.

Practises like micro-irrigation, drip and sprinkler systems have to be promoted in a big way for efficient use of water for agriculture, he said.

Reduce, reuse and recycle must be the watchwords if we have to handover a sustainable and liveable planet to the future generations," he said.

Naidu pointed out that watershed development is another area that can spur local economic development.
