TS for new study on Polavaram by CWC

Demand made at meet of irrigation officials

BALU PULIPAKA I DC HYDERABAD, OCT. 7

Telangana has yet again urged the Central Water Commission (CWC) to order a study on the impact of backwaters of the Polavaram project being constructed by Andhra Pradesh on the temple town of Bhadrachalam.

The demand was made at a meeting of the CWC chairman R.K. Gupta with irrigation department officials from Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Odisha.

Telangana said a fresh study was required as the one based on mathematical model in the past did not match the actual flood situation as was experienced in July this year.

The drainage congestion and submergence also affects some 50,000 acres of cropland in seven mandals in about 150 villages, Telangana said.

It also reminded the Central Water Commission that afflux formation upstream of Polavaram due to the backwater effect was previously acknowledged by the commission.

Andhra Pradesh, according to a news release from the Telangana irrigation department, has agreed to a joint survey of all major streams on either side of Godavari river.

Chhattisgarh asked the CWC to take into consideration a probable maximum flood of 58 lakh cusecs, which a study by IIT-Roorkee had said might occur, before any permissions are finalised for the project. Odisha officials stated that it must consider the 58 lakh cusecs mark for both the design of the spill-way and backwater effects, and added that the previous backwater study by CWC and Andhra Pradesh had its limitations that also included operation protocol, hydrology, and statutory clearances for its 'convenience hypothe-sis'. Until these things are settled and finalized, the acceptance for public hearing and joint survey is not acceptable to Odisha, officials from the state told the commission

'Himachal Pradesh gets Rs 2,168 crore projects for flood protection'

SHIMLA: Union Minister of Information and Broadcasting Anurag Thakur on Friday claimed that besides Rs 3,650 crore worth projects on strengthening health, education, roads and infrastructure projects, the Centre has sanctioned Rs 2,167.72 crore funding for Himachal Pradesh in connection with flood protection works.

The state has been facing huge losses as a result of flash floods and natural disasters and the centre has cleared five major flood protection projects.

"I really thank Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Jal Shakti Minister Gajendra Shekhawat for approving five flood protection projects in Himachal Pradesh at a cost of about Rs. 2,167.72 crore," he declared at the function held at Una, part of his parliamentary

constituency. The projects will come-up at Suketi Khad, Swan River and Seer Khad. Necessary formalities have already been completed the by union government, he said.

"Prime Minister Narendra Modi has always considered Himachal Pradesh as his second home and has approved all necessary projects as per the requirement of Himachal.

Due to the divine calamity in the hilly state of Himachal, floods are common in every rainy season, due to which there is a lot of loss of life and property every year," Thakur said.

He recalled having takenup the matter with Union Minister of Jal Shakti Gajendra Shekhawat where he had recently raised the issue pertaining to damages being suffered by the state to crops, public and private properties in view of the flash floods in the state.



यूपी को मिले 482 करोड़, काशी-मथुरा समेत छह जिलों में होंगे कई काम

लखनऊ. केंद्र सरकार की ओर से राष्ट्रीय स्वच्छ गंगा मिशन ने यूपी को सीवरेज प्रबंधन समेत अन्य आठ नई परियोजनाओं को मंजूरी दे दी है। इसके तहत वाराणसी-मथुरा समेत छह जिलों में कई काम कराए जाएंगे।वाराणसी में अस्सी नाले की टैपिंग की जाएगी। वृंदावन में एसटीपी का निर्माण समेत इंटरसेप्शन और डायवर्जन नेटवर्क का काम होगा। मथुरा के कोसी कलां में एसटीपी के साथ छाता में इंटरसेप्शन और डायवर्जन नेटवर्क को बिछाया जाएगा।

इसके साथ ही प्रदेश के चार जिलों हापुड़, बुलंदशहर, बदायूं और मिर्जापुर में जैव विविधता पार्कों की स्थापना की एक बड़ी परियोजना को भी मंजूरी दी गई है। मुख्यमंत्री ने प्रदेश में निदयों को स्वच्छ रखने की मुहिम को प्राथमिकताओं में शामिल



किया है। राष्ट्रीय स्वच्छ गंगा मिशन की ओर से 8 परियोजनाओं की मंजूरी इसी दिशा में उठाया गया अहम कदम है।

मंजूरी दी गई है, जिसमें वाराणसी में अस्सी नाले की टैपिंग के लिए 55 एमएलडी क्षमता के एसटीपी का

निर्माण भी शामिल है। इन परियोजनाओं की अनुमानित लागत कुल 308.09 करोड़ रुपये है। वाराणसी की परियोजना का उद्देश्य राष्ट्रीय स्वच्छ गंगा मिशन की तीन नालों अस्सी, सामने घाट और कार्यकारी समिति की 45वीं बैठक नखीं से जीरो अनट्रीटेड डिस्चार्ज में सीवरेज प्रबंधन के लिए उत्तर का लक्ष्य हासिल करना है। अन्य प्रदेश में कुल 4 परियोजनाओं को परियोजनाओं में 13 एमएलडी के एसटीपी का निर्माण, मौजूदा संरचनाओं का नवीनीकरण शामिल हैं।

जौनपर में घाट को किया जाएगा विकासत

रिवर फ्रंट डेवलपमेंट के लिए प्रदेश के जौनपुर में 5.07 करोड़ रुपये की अनुमानित लागत से एक घाट विकास परियोजना को भी मंजुरी दी गई है। जिस स्थान पर यह परियोजना प्रस्तावित है वह एक पवित्र स्थान है, जो गंगा की सहायक गोमती नदी से संबद्घ है। यह जनता की आस्था का केंद्र है। परियोजना में हनुमान घाट को सद्भावना पुल से जोड़ने वाली 4 मीटर चौडी पैदल यात्रा का पथ, घाट. भू निर्माण, शौचालय ब्लॉक आदि का निर्माण शामिल है।
