With reference to mentioned subject matter vide which desired information was sought by Shri. Suhrit Singh, NRI Residency, Tower-9, Flat- 203, Sector-45, Noida, UP, Pin 201301. In this regard, the reply to referred questions from Flood Management Organisation (FMO) is as under:

1.	According to UNEP, there has been a decrease of 20% in the amount of fresh water per capita over the past 2 decades. What are the long-term sustainability plans of the government to conserve fresh water?	No specific information available .
2.	Agriculture sector accounts for 19% of GDP of India, but it uses 80% of accessible fresh water. What sustainable measures are being taken to maintain the growth of this sector with the ever-increasing freshwater shortage?	
3.	What measures are being taken the Ministry to prevent flooding in areas such as Delhi due to high rainfall?	The Govt. of India has launched the Flood Management Programme (FMP) during the XI th Plan with an outlay of Rs. 8,000 Crores for providing central assistance to States for taking up works related to river management, flood control, anti-erosion, drainage development, flood

	<p>proofing works, restoration of damaged flood management works, anti-sea erosion and catchment area treatment. The scheme with an outlay of Rs. 10,000 Crores was continued during XIIth Plan also.</p> <p>A comprehensive scheme titled "flood Management and Border Areas Programme (FMBAP)" with an outlay of Rs. 3,342 Crores (FMP- Rs.2,642Crores & RMBA-Rs. 700Crores) for the period 2017-2020 with merged components from the existing Flood Management Programme (FMP) and River Management Activities & Works related to Border Areas (RMBA) schemes during XII Five Year Plan has been approved by the Union Cabinet on 07-Mar-2019, further extending the scheme till March 2021 and aims at completion of the on-going projects already approved under FMP.</p> <p>A total 522 schemes costing Rs13238.37 Cr were approved during XI Plan (420 projects costing Rs. 7857.08 Cr) and XII Plan (102 projects costing Rs 5381.29 Cr). Out of these 522 schemes, 427 schemes have been completed; 64 schemes foreclosed, dropped and shifted (47- foreclosed; 16- dropped & 1 shifted to RMBA component) and 31 schemes are on-going. These 427 completed schemes have given protection to an area of around 4.99 mha and protected a population of about 53.57 million.</p> <p>FMBAP 2021-26: The total amount recommended by EFC for FMBAP 2021-26 for XVth Finance Commission Cycle is Rs. 4,500 Cr. Approval of FMBAP 201-26 vide Cabinet decision dated 19.01.2022 is up to September, 2022.</p> <p>CWC issues flood forecasts as a non-structural measure of flood management to concerned State Governments with consent from them at identified locations. CWC also issues inflow forecasts to identified reservoirs for proper regulation. CWC issues flood forecasts as per standard operating procedure.</p>
