Good rains double area under kharif crops

NEW DELHI, JUNE 27

As southwest monsoon covered the entire country yesterday, 12 days ahead of the normal date, farmers registered more than 100 per cent increase in sowing during kharif season helped by good rains during the season.

Despite the Covid-19 crisis, they have so far planted an impressive 316 lakh hectare, which is more than double of 154 lakh ha planted during the corresponding period last year and higher than the average 187 lakh ha in past five years, according to the Agriculture Ministry.

At a webinar organised by the ministry, Agriculture Secretary Sanjay Agarwal said: "The competence of Indian farmers and efforts of the industry during the crisis is evident from the fact that the area covered by kharif sowing

this year is 316 lakh ha as compared to 154 lakh ha last year and an average of 187 lakh ha during past five years."

The country also received 155.2 mm rains against the normal of 128.2 mm between June 1 and June 25, leading to a satisfactory progress of kharif sowing and doubling the average water storage in 123 reservoirs. As on June 25, live water storage in 123 reservoirs was 194 per cent in comparison to the corresponding period last year and 171 per cent of average in past 10 years. So far, 37.71 lakh ha area has been covered under summer rice compared to 32.05 lakh ha in the corresponding period last year and 47.96 lakh ha area under coarse cereals against 26.09 lakh ha of last year. About 49.69 lakh ha area has been covered under sugarcane against 47.77 lakh ha last year and 71.69 lakh ha under cotton as compared to 39.23 lakh ha last year.

Plain-paper ease for Amphan pleas

Calcutta: The Bengal government has done away with printed application forms and allowed people to apply for compensation by giving their details on plain paper amid growing complaints of graft in Amphan relief.

“A simple plain paper application would be treated as a valid application for consideration...an organised application process on pre-printed form should not be encouraged,” reads the order issued by chief secretary Rajiva Sinha on Friday.

Sources said this was one of the state government’s many steps to ensure no genuine victim of the May 20 cyclone is deprived of compensation following reports of anomalies and political bias from East Midnapore, North and South 24 Parganas and Howrah.

“The chief minister (Mamata Banerjee) received 2,100 such complaints. District authorities are receiving thousands of complaints against the ruling party-led gram panchayats, all alleging that genuine victims were denied compensation,” said an official.

For example, about 5,000 villagers of a gram panchayat

in Patharpratima in South 24 Parganas had gheraoed the pradhan recently, alleging that names of only 600 people figured on the list of beneficiaries for government compensation when dwellings of more than 7,000 people were razed.

“Allegedly, even these 600 beneficiaries were close to the ruling party leaders and their homes suffered no major damage,” said a source.

Apparently, the state government is trying hard to undo the damage even as Opposition parties are leveraging people’s anger to penetrate Trinamul strongholds ahead of the Assembly election in 2021.

Sources said that the state government decided to accept plain paper applications in an

attempt to uproot corruption at the grassroots.

A senior government official said it was observed that whenever villagers were asked to fill in printed forms for applications under government schemes, allegations of corruption cropped up. Either people with political backing take away all the forms, or villagers find their bureaucratic language hard to understand.

Chief secretary Sinha asked authorities to verify each application physically. He said that the list of beneficiaries should be rectified by the task force set up at block levels.

Sinha’s order stated the entire exercise should be completed by July 2 and a compliance report sent to Nabanna.

Sujan Chakraborty, CPM MLA from Jadavpur wrote a letter to the chief secretary pointing out that lists of beneficiaries were not put up at BDO offices so far despite the decision being taken at the all-party meeting held by the chief minister on Wednesday.

A source in Nabanna said lists of beneficiaries were already public in districts. Those who feel deprived can give applications on plain paper. The rectified list will be put up on July 2 at BDO offices.

पूरे राजस्थान में फैलने के बाद कमजोर पड़ा मानसून

दक्षिण पश्चिम मानसून राजस्थान पहुंचने के बाद कमजोर पड़ता दिख रहा है और अगले तीन-चार दिन में राज्य में अधिक बारिश होने की उम्मीद नहीं है। मौसम विभाग के प्रवक्ता के अनुसार, मानसून के कम दबाव के क्षेत्र के उत्तर की ओर स्थानांतरित होने के कारण अगले चार-पांच दिन राज्य के बीकानेर व जोधपुर संभाग में ज्यादा बारिश होने की संभावना नहीं है। हालांकि, कहीं-कहीं हल्की बूंदाबांदी हो सकती है।

सिक्किम: भूस्खलन से एनएचपीसी के बांध को भारी क्षति, रास्ते भी बाधित

गंगटोक। पिछले एक सप्ताह से जारी भारी बारिश से कई स्थानों पर भूस्खलन होने के कारण गंगटोक और चीन की सीमा से सटे उत्तरी सिक्किम के कई इलाकों के बीच सड़क संपर्क टूट गया है। अधिकारियों ने शनिवार को कहा कि भूस्खलन के कारण पूर्वी जिले में स्थित एनएचपीसी के एक बांध को भी भारी क्षति पहुंची है। भूस्खलन के कारण राजधानी गंगटोक और उत्तर सिक्किम जिले के मुख्यालय मंगन को जाने वाली दो मुख्य सड़कें कई जगह बाधित हो गईं, जिसके कारण यातायात भी प्रभावित हुआ। अधिकारियों ने कहा कि नामोक खोला में सड़क बाधित

होने के चलते गंगटोक से मंगन को जाने वाले वाहनों को अन्य वैकल्पिक रास्ते से भेजा जा रहा है। साथ ही कहा कि सड़क का मरम्मत कार्य जारी था। उन्होंने बताया कि पूर्वी सिक्किम के अपदरा में एनएचपीसी की तीस्ता चरण-5 परियोजना स्थल के एक बांध को भी भारी क्षति पहुंची है। इसके अलावा, उत्तर सिक्किम राजमार्ग के कई रास्ते भी लगातार भारी बारिश के कारण बाधित हुए हैं। अधिकारियों ने कहा कि भूस्खलन के कारण मंगन-गंगटोक, दिक्छु-गंगटोक और दिक्छु-सिंगतम के कई रूट पर सड़क यातायात प्रभावित हुआ है।

राज्य के सभी 33 जिलों को कवर कर गया, जबकि पूर्वानुमान यही था कि आठ जुलाई तक मानसून पूरे राज्य में

फैलेगा। इस बीच बीते चौबीस घंटे में राज्य के अनेक इलाकों में हल्की से मध्यम बारिश हुई।

Rains expose shoddy civic works

Old City residents complain of mosquito menace from stagnated water

Recent rains have exposed the shoddy work carried out by the GHMC and the HMWS&SB. Despite their claims that nalas and sewerage lines had been desilted, they overflowed and inundated several areas of the city, especially in the Old City, adding to the woes of people going through the Covid-19 crisis.

Yousuf Pasha of Osmangunj said the Old Topkhana road was inundated following a 15-minute rain. "Sewage water entering the nala has made matters worse. Every year, at least 50 persons of our area fall ill because of vector-borne diseases during the monsoon. Mosquito menace and stench from stagnated water is nightmarish. With Covid-19 crisis being here, residents are worried about visiting private or local hospitals for two reasons – the exorbitant fee and mandatory Covid-19 checks, since all vector-borne diseases have similar symptoms," Pasha stated.

Neelesh of Tolichowki said, "It is a waste of time asking for a permanent solution to overflowing drains. All governments have failed to resolve the issue. Leaders come to the area only to ask for votes. They fill their pockets in the name of nala de-silting. We have no other go but to request the corporation, HMWS&SB and elected representatives to resolve the issue, which has been left unattended since 20 years," he said.

Highly placed sources said senior officials at the GHMC and HMWS&SB feel pre-monsoon nala de-silting is not yielding results. They are in favour of annual de-silting instead.

The corporation, which removed 2.45 lakh cubic

metres of sludge last year, claims to have removed 2.60 lakh cubic metres of sludge since October last. Incidentally, the corporation did not finalise even 12 tenders of the total 42 works until March. Sources claim that engineers are hand in glove with contractors and delayed the de-silting process.

When asked about the subject, a senior official admitted that there has been a certain delay. He disclosed that de-silting picked up pace only in May. Other officials, however, said that the silt removed this year is very less compared to 2019. They said the inundation will increase with the full onset of the monsoon.

HMWS&SB officials said they would not like comment since higher authorities have asked them not to utter a word on the issue.

IMD issues thunderstorm warning for 4 days in TS

Heavy downpours accompanied by strong winds lashed several parts of the twin cities on Saturday evening, with reports of trees getting uprooted and localised flooding coming in from several areas in what could be considered the first big rainfall of the monsoon season.

The intense hour-long downpour in some parts of the city, with lingering showers in some other areas, included nearly 10 cm of rain recorded at LB Stadium.

some thundershowers were very likely to occur in some places in the state on Sunday. From Monday to Wednesday, the state can expect thunderstorms accompanied by lightning, or heavy rain, the IMD said.

The emergency wing of the GHMC deployed its teams to remove fallen tree branches and to clear clogged drains in the evening after waterlogging resulted in slow moving

traffic in many parts of the city. Power supply was disrupted in many areas with the authorities switching off supply as a precautionary measure with strong winds accompanying the rain.

While 8.1 cm of rain was recorded at Neredmet, 8.05 cm was recorded at Red Hills, 7.95 cm at Alwal, 7.65 cm at Narayanguda, 6.7 cm at Marredpally in Secunderabad, 6.4 cm in Vijayanagar Colony, 5.85 cm at Ghansi Bazaar, 5.78 cm at Padmaranagar, 5.75 cm in Khairatabad, and 5.05 cm at Golwliguda. Many other parts of the city received up to 4 cm of rainfall.

1 dead, over 2.6 lakh hit as Assam floods wreak havoc

90 relief camps set up across state, 15 districts are affected

The flood situation in Assam deteriorated further on Saturday with heavy rains rocking the north-eastern states, affecting over 2.6 lakh people in 15 districts of Assam. The mighty Brahmaputra, Puthimari and Dhansiri rivers are flowing above the danger level.

Informing that flood situation has worsened following the incessant rains for past few days, Assam chief secretary Kumar Sanjay Krishna told reporters that 90 relief camps have been set up across the state to provide succor to the flood-affected people.

The heavy rain has also caused landslides at various places blocking the vehicular movement on national highways. Mr Krishna said that PWD has been instructed to do the needful following the landslide at Raj Bhawan. The arrangements have also been made to move people from the landslide-prone areas of the city, he added.

The deluge has claimed

one life in Dibrugarh district, according to the daily flood bulletin of the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA).

Assam chief minister Sarbananda Sonowal has also directed the Deputy Commissioners of all the affected districts to address the needs of the flood-hit people urgently, while also adhering to Covid-19 safety protocols.

Assam state disaster management authority (ASDMA) officials however said that the flood-hit districts are Dhemaji, Lakhimpur, Biswanath, Udalguri, Darrang, Baksa, Nalbari, Barpeta, Kokrajhar, Nagaon, Golaghat, Jorhat, Majuli, Sivasagar, Dibrugarh, and Tinsukia. "Over 2.6 lakh people and over 11,765 hectares of crops were badly affected due to the floods. Around 19,000 people have taken shelter in relief camps," ASDMA official said. The official said that in the current wave of floods, one person died in Dibrugarh district, while the first wave of floods from May 22 claimed 15 lives in different districts of Assam.

Landslides damage Sikkim dam, snap key road link

Gangtok, June 27: Heavy rains for the past one week have triggered a series of landslides snapping road links at several places between Gangtok and North Sikkim bordering China, and causing major damage to a dam of the NHPC in the East District, officials said on Saturday.

Landslides blocked two major roads that connect state capital Gangtok and Mangan, the headquarters of North Sikkim district, at multiple places

affecting traffic movement. Vehicles going from Gangtok to Mangan are being diverted via Dzongu-Sankalang Road due to a road blockade at Namok Khola, officials said, adding that restoration work was underway.

A massive landslide caused severe damage to a dam of the NHPC Teesta Stage-V project site at Apdara in East Sikkim, they said. Incessant rain has also led to slips and slides all along the North Sikkim Highway. — PTI

The NDRE, Assam State Disaster Response Force personnel, along with local administrations, are continuously working to rescue the affected people and rendering the relief services to the villagers. Meanwhile, Regional Meteorological Centre in Guwahati predicted that the state is likely to receive heavy rainfall for next 5 days.

"Assam is likely to wit-

ness fairly widespread rainfall, along with isolated heavy to very heavy showers, for the next 5 days. Isolated heavy to very heavy falls on June 28 and isolated heavy falls on June 29, have also been predicted. Assam and Meghalaya are expected to be impacted in most places with isolated heavy to very heavy and extremely heavy falls till June 30," a bulletin said.

Assam floods: Over 4.62L affected in 1,289 villages

Two more persons drowned in Goalpara district on Saturday as flood situation in Assam worsened affecting over 4.62 lakh people in 21 of 33 districts.

Two more deaths took the death toll in this year's floods so far to 18. Landslides had earlier killed 22 people in South Assam and in Guwahati.

The Brahmaputra was flowing above the danger level at five locations including in Guwahati while heavy rains continued in most parts of the state.

Floodwater inundated 78 of 183 forest camps inside Kaziranga National Park and the ongoing operation to douse the fire at Baghjan gas well of OIL in Tinsukia district was halted due to surging floodwater.

The daily flood bulletin issued by Assam State Disaster Management Authority on Saturday evening said the flood had already left 19,496 people homeless and were taking shelter in 132 relief

camps. The bulletin said flood 1,289 villages were under flood water in Dhemaji, Lakhimpur, Biswanath, Udalguri, Darrang, Nalbari, Barpeta, Chirang, Bongaigaon, Kokrajhar, South Salmara, Goalpara, Kamrup, Morigaon, Golaghat, Jorhat, Majuli, Sivasagar, Dibrugarh and Tinsukia districts.

Baghjan op halted

A statement issued by OIL

said the flood inundated the entire area where the mishap took place at Baghjan in Tinsukia district forcing the disaster management personnel to halt the operation for the day.

"Floodwater inundated the debris area, pump houses and all approach roads. In view of these, working condition at the site has become unsafe and so it was decided to call off the operation for the day," it said.

Moderate to heavy rains lashed different parts of the city as southwest monsoon remained benevolent after providing the city with surplus rains this month.

Though the day began on a sunny note, by late afternoon, clouds gathered and rains began to lash.

Many parts of the city including Abids, MJ Market, Nallakunta, Himayatnagar and Puranapul had heavy rains with rain water flooding the roads. Caught by the surprise downpour, denizens tried to seek shelter while at some places two-wheelers were seen wading through the rain water.

According to Telangana State Development Planning Society (TSDPS) data, Narayanaguda recorded highest rainfall of 76.8 mm followed by LB Stadium (68.8 mm), Red Hills (56.5 mm), Begum Bazaar (53.8 mm) and Asifnagar

(50.5mm). The weather warning with Meteorological Centre, Hyderabad indicated thunderstorm accompanied with lightning were very likely to occur at isolated places while there was a possibility of heavy rain at isolated places over the State in next four days.

The forecast with TSDPS showed that light to moderate rain/ thundershowers are expected in Greater Hyderabad region in next three days.

The maximum temperatures are expected to be in the range of 34 degree Celsius to 36 degree Celsius and minimum temperatures could hover between 24 degree Celsius and 26 degree Celsius.

As per the data with Met Dept. Hyderabad has recorded a surplus rainfall of 147.1 mm against a normal rainfall of 96.1 mm between June 1 and 27, while Rangareddy and Medchal-Malkajgiri have received a rainfall of 121.3 mm and 134.8 mm, respectively.

Once lively Safilguda lake now turns an eyesore

Overgrown weed has taken over the Safilguda lake making the local residents wary of its impact and seek immediate action from the civic authorities in clearing it.

Residents in the colonies around the water body point out that the weed has taken over the lake completely and turning it into an ideal mosquito breeding ground.

“The entire lake is under a sheet of this unwanted growth aiding continuous breeding of mosquitoes. We are worried about,” a local said. The residents say they had complained to the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation couple of months back but as the pandemic stuck, no action has been taken so far.

“I have an elderly mother at home and we are really worried about the condition

in the lake. Since the monsoon set in, the mosquitoes breeding has become a major issue and we fear the mosquitos could end up spreading diseases,” says Aditya Sharma, a resident of Krupa Complex.

“The GHMC told us it is the HMDA’s problem. We are also told that the weed

could be plucked out only after monsoon rains fill the lake,” says Subba Rao, another resident.

The Safilguda Walkers Association had also approached the GHMC for a solution and awaits action to have the water body cleared of weed and of mosquitoes.

कार्यर म समन्वयक को पत्र भेजा गया है। इसमें कार्यों की नियमानुसार स्वीकृति के संबंध में निर्देश दिए हैं। इसमें सामुदायिक फीडर कैनाल, डिस्ट्रिब्यूटरी, माइनर, सब माइनर के निर्माण को कैटेगरी ए में रखा है। इस कैटेगरी में लिनिंग फीडर कैनाल, वाटर कोर्सेज कैनाल, रिनोवेशन के कार्यों को भी सम्मिलित किया है। वाटर कोर्सेज के निर्माण कार्यों को बी कैटेगरी में रखा है। वहीं फीडर कैनाल, वितरिका व माइनर की मरम्मत और रखरखाव के कार्यों को डी कैटेगरी में रखा है। इन कार्यों के अतिरिक्त जल संरक्षण व जल संचयन से संबंधित अन्य कार्य एनिकट, चैकडेम, अर्दन डेम आदि भी योजना के तहत स्वीकृत किए जा सकेंगे।

जल जीवन मिशन के लिए राजस्थान की कार्य योजना को मंजूरी मिली

नई दिल्ली। राजस्थान ने जल जीवन मिशन (जेजेएम) योजना के तहत मौजूदा वित्त वर्ष में 20.69 लाख घरों को नल के पानी का कनेक्शन की योजना बनायी है। केंद्र सरकार ने जल जीवन मिशन के तहत इस योजना के कार्यान्वयन के लिए 2,522 करोड़ रुपये की मंजूरी दे दी है। पिछले वर्ष के 1,051 करोड़ रुपये की तुलना में यह काफी बड़ी बढ़ोतरी है।

राज्य की ओर से तैयार कार्यक्रम की वार्षिक कार्य योजना को केंद्र सरकार ने मंजूरी दे दी है। केंद्रीय जल शक्ति मंत्रालय की ओर से चलाए जा रहे इस मिशन का उद्देश्य 2024 तक देश के प्रत्येक ग्रामीण घर में प्रति व्यक्ति 55 लीटर पीने योग्य पानी प्रति दिन उपलब्ध कराना है। इससे पहले केंद्रीय जल शक्ति मंत्री गजेंद्र सिंह शेखावत ने राजस्थान के मुख्यमंत्री को पत्र लिखकर राज्य में जल जीवन मिशन की धीमी प्रगति पर अपनी चिंता व्यक्त की थी। राज्य में कुल 1.1 करोड़ ग्रामीण परिवारों में से 12.36 लाख परिवारों को पहले ही नल कनेक्शन (एफएचटीसी) प्रदान किए जा चुके हैं। 2019-20 में, केवल 1.02 लाख नल कनेक्शन प्रदान

किए गए। अब राज्य को कार्यरत में के त्वरित कार्यान्वयन के लिए कहा गया है। राजस्थान ने फ्लोराइड, लवणता, नाइट्रेट और आयरन से प्रभावित 5,864 गांवों में रहने वाली राज्य की 57.77 लाख आबादी को पीने योग्य पानी उपलब्ध कराने की योजना तैयार की है। राज्य ने दिसंबर, 2020 तक सभी 3,700 फ्लोराइड प्रभावित बस्तियों में पीने योग्य पानी उपलब्ध कराने की योजना बनाई है।

पानी की कमी वाले क्षेत्रों, आकांक्षी जिलों, एससी/एसटी की बहुलता वाले गाँवों और संसद आदर्श ग्राम योजना (एसएजीवाई) के गाँवों पर अधिक जोर दिया जा रहा है।
