TS for emergency board meeting of KRMB

The State government has requested the Krishna River Management Board (KRMB) to convene a co-ordination committee meeting only after a full board meeting. If necessary, the State asked the board to call for an emergency board meeting.

In a letter to the board chairman, Telangana Irrigation Engineer-in-Chief (General) C Muralidhar said that the matter related to notification of jurisdiction of projects in Krishna Basin by KRMB is an issue having serious consequences on Telangana and Andhra Pradesh and it is to be discussed in detail in a full board meeting. As per Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act (APRA)-2014, any decision on important issues has to be discussed and decided in a board meeting.

Without having an opinion and guidance of the full board meeting, it is not possible to discuss any issues and decide directly in the coordination committee on operationalisation of various clauses of the

Gazette. Therefore, it is requested that the coordination committee meeting may be convened only after a detailed full board meeting and if necessary, call for an emergency board meeting, Muralidhar added.

Water row: TS skips coordination committee meets

Telangana abstained from the meetings of coordination committee of Krishna River Management Board (KRMB) and Godavari River Management Board (GRMB) on Tuesday citing that a full board meeting and, if necessary, an emergency board meeting should be called for to discuss various issues pertaining to the State.

"Let board first convene its meeting and clarify its plan of scheme implementation. In the board, we are member States and we also want to discuss our issues to protect our rights. Any deliberation should be conducted in the board meeting only," a senior official said.

The official said the department wrote letters to KRMB and GRMB requesting them to convene the board meeting.

The Ministry of Jal Shakti said the coordination committee is to facilitate departments concerned in the two States in time-bound implementation and operationalisation of various clauses of Gazette notification issued to take control of major and medium irrigation projects on Krishna and Godavari rivers.

"What is this coordination committee meeting? What is the problem in convening full-fledged board

meeting? Keep the board's plan of action as well as our issues in the agenda so that we can discuss them throughout the day," the official said. "How can we accept the decisions that are taken in Delhi and attend a coordination committee meeting?" the official asked.

He sought to know as to why the Ministry was not allowing Telangana officials to discuss various issues in the board meeting. "Why is the Ministry afraid of convening full-fledged board meeting?" he asked.

The Ministry should first address Telangana's grievances. "It could be an attempt not to allow our issues to be discussed during the board meeting," the official said.

As per AP Reorganization Act-2014, any key decision has to be decided in a board meeting. Without having an opinion and guidance of the full board meeting, it is not possible to discuss any issue and decide directly in the coordination committee on operationalisation of various clauses of the Gazette notification.

Meanwhile, AP requested the Centre to bring projects on the Godavari under the jurisdiction of GRMB. The AP Water Resources Department officials, who attended the meeting, said Telangana is attempting to get 241 tmc from Godavari to the Krishna basin.

TS to wait for AP's reply to CJI's mediation offer

Sources said Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao discussed with senior officials in the CMO and irrigation officials on the Supreme Court's mediation proposal on Tuesday and decided to take a call on this only after seeing how Andhra Pradesh responded and the conditions that Telangana had

AP to allow KRMB inspect RLIS work

The Andhra Pradesh government has welcomed the Krishna River Management Board's (KRMB) move to inspect the ongoing works on the contentious Rayalaseema Lift Irrigation Scheme (RLIS) being carried out at Pothireddypadu in Kurnool district — with a rider.

"The team comprising inspectors should not have anyone deputed by the Telangana state government," said Murali-

nath Reddy, chief engineer of Srisailem project.

The change in the stand of the AP government was in marked contrast to its resistance to the inspection, which it made known before the National Green Tribunal (NGT) via a sworn affidavit.

NGT's southern bench had directed KRMB to carry out inspections at the contentious Rayalaseema lift scheme (RLS) to assess the progress.

AP to take grievances on Godavari, Krishna Boards to Delhi for redressal

The Andhra Pradesh government intends to take up certain grievances vis-a-vis the declaration of gazette notification on Godavari and Krishna River Management Boards with the Centre for their quick redressal.

The first joint meeting of the coordination committees of GRMB and KRMB was held in Hyderabad on Tuesday to collect information from both Andhra Pradesh and TS for fixing the jurisdiction of the boards on the irrigation projects located in both the states and also on grant of funds to run the boards.

AP engineer-in-chief Narayana Reddy said, "We have informed the boards that we have certain grievances on some irrigation projects incorporated in

the gazette notification of GRMB and KRMB. We want to bring them to the notice of the Union Jal Shakthi ministry for redressal after holding talks with our government here."

"Our grievances are fact-based and reasonable. They will not be having any adverse effect on the other side (TS) and we are hopeful of getting them resolved. We have also informed the boards that once these are resolved, issues of organisational set up, funds and the permissible powers that can be exercised by both GRMB and KRMB can be decided."

"When we are asked to give the time-frame for implementation of these matters, we have informed them that we shall first consult our government (AP) and later share all information including on

the jurisdiction of the projects and about the detailed project reports (DPR) of the new irrigation projects. Now, we will brief our government and based on the directions we get, we will proceed further."

Officials including member secretaries from both GRMB and KRMB, representatives of the Union ministry of Jal Shakthi,

as also of AP water resources and managing directors of AP Transco and AP Genco were present. Officials from TS did not attend the meeting.

KRMB officials are likely to visit lift irrigation schemes in Rayalaseema region including the one coming up at Pothireddypadu, on August 5.

The Union ministry of Jal Shakthi notified both GRMB and KRMB via a gazette notification on July 16, fixing the task to administer, regulate, maintain and operate the irrigation projects located in Godavari and Krishna river basins located in both AP and TS from October 14.

Each state is to provide a one-time seed money of ₹200 crore within 60 days from issue of notification to enable the boards discharge their functions.

Groundwater in TS increases

Owing to torrential rainfall the state has been experiencing for the last one month, aquifers are plush with water. On an average, the state registered a rise of water 3.19 metres below ground level (mbgl). According to the Telangana State Groundwater Department, which compiled a report after checking the water levels, the average water level that was registered in July was 6.07mbgl.

The highest water level was found in Warangal (Rural) district at a depth of 2.57 mbgl. The lowest water level was found in Medak, near the capital city, where the aquifers only reaped water at a depth of 13.79 mbgl.

Out of all the 33 districts, the average water level was recorded at 5 mbgl in 11 districts, between 5 to 10 mbgl in 20 districts, and over 10 mbgl in the remaining two districts. The net rise in ground water level was

observed in all the districts with a minimum rise of 0.01 m in Mancherla and maximum of 8.61 in Rangareddy.

The net average rise in groundwater level of 3.12 mbgl was observed during July as compared to May with 0.73 mbgl in Nagarkurnool to 6.4 in Nirmal. As much as 45 per cent of the state area was occupied by shallow water levels (less than 5 mbgl) and 40 percent of the area where water levels were in the range of 5 to 10 mbgl. Only 11 per cent of the area had water levels of 10 to 15 mbgl. When analysed with the decadal average levels of July (2011-2020), rise in water levels in the range of 0.08 to 17.26 mbgl was observed in 579 out of the 592 mandals of the state while 13 mandals reported fall in water levels in the range of 0.21 mbgl to 2.84 mbgl.

It went on to say that the state had received 535 mm rainfall till the end of July against normal rainfall of 361 mm.

SIX DIE IN RAIN-RELATED INCIDENTS ACROSS NORTHERN STATES

Heavy rains lash Gwalior-Chambal region, 200 villages marooned

NEW DELHI: Torrential rains pummelled the Gwalior-Chambal region in Madhya Pradesh, affecting 1,171 villages. Six people, including three children, died in rain-related incidents across northern states of the country which were lashed by heavy rainfall.

In Madhya Pradesh, heavy rains were witnessed in Gwalior-Chambal region, especially Sheopur and Shivpuri districts, officials said, adding NDRF and SDRF teams have rescued 1,600 people from flooded areas so far but at least 200 villages are still marooned.

The Army has been called in for rescue operations in Shivpuri, Sheopur, Gwalior and Datia districts, state Additional Chief Secretary (Home) Rajesh Rajora said, adding that despite bad weather, IAF helicopters conducted four sorties to rescue people from the flood-affected areas.

Earlier in the day, three people stranded atop a tree for about 24 hours in Beechi village and five others in Piproudha in flood-hit Shivpuri district, which witnessed "unprecedented heavy rains", were rescued, officials said.

"A total of 1,171 villages were affected in the Gwalior-Chambal region due to excessive rainfall, especially Shivpuri and Sheopur, where an unprecedented 800 mm rainfall (in the last 24 hours ending 8 am on

Tuesday) resulted in flooding," Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan told reporters.

A 22-year-old UP resident died and two people sustained injuries in a landslide that hit Himachal Pradesh's Solan district, a state disaster management official said.

In Uttarakhand, a stretch of Gangotri national highway caved in following a landslide triggered by heavy rains disrupting vehicular traffic along the route.

The 30-metre stretch fell and slid into Bhagirathi river bringing traffic to a halt, District Disaster Management Officer Devendra Patwal said. It has been raining heavily in the district for nearly 15 days activating several landslide zones from Nagun to Harshil.

Three children died after two vehicles were swept away

in strong water currents following rains in Rajasthan's Sawaimadhopur and Tonk, police said.

In the first incident on Monday night, two children drowned in a drain after their car was swept away in strong water currents in Sawaimadhopur district.

According to police, Pappu Lal along with his three sons and a relative was travelling in a car and tried to cross the drain despite high water level.

"The car was swept away in water. Ramjilal, his elder son and the relative were rescued while bodies of his two minor sons were found stuck in bushes," police said.

In a similar incident in Tonk on Tuesday, an ambulance carrying a woman's body was washed away in strong currents following rains, which

killed her 12-year-old son. Her husband is still missing.

In another incident, two men died and another went missing as their car fell into an overflowing pond, police said.

Residential areas were inundated, houses collapsed and hundreds of people were evacuated from several villages in low-lying areas in Baran as heavy rains lashed the district for the second consecutive day.

A flood-like situation was seen in the district's worst-hit Shahabad and Kishanganj blocks.

Shahabad block received 246 mm of rainfall in the 24 hours ending at 7 am on Tuesday and a further 60 mm of rain was recorded till 11 am, inundating several colonies in the low-lying areas, Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) Rahul Malhotra said.

Around 700 people have so far been evacuated from villages in the low-lying areas and shifted to Atal Seva Kendras and school buildings.

A State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) team rescued five members of a family, including three children, who were trapped overnight in their house in Bohta village under Mangrol police station as it was flooded after the Banganga river burst its banks, officials said. Around 40-50 people are stranded in Sodana and Raibarpura villages of Kishanganj and a rescue operation is underway.

In Haryana and Punjab, the maximum temperatures hovered below normal limits at most places.

According to the MeT Department, Chandigarh (2.4 mm), Ambala (1 mm), Ludhiana (28 mm) and Patiala (30.8 mm) were among the places that received rainfall. Chandigarh was also lashed by rains.

Light to moderate rain and thundershower occurred at a few places over western Uttar Pradesh and at isolated places over eastern parts of the state, the MeT Department said.

The Maharashtra government on Tuesday announced a Rs 11,500-crore financial package for rain and flood-affected people besides for repair works and reconstruction of roads and other critical infrastructure damaged in the deluge last month.

Alert for more rainfall in South Bengal

Even as hundreds of people are still marooned in flood-water across districts in South Bengal, the Alipore meteorological department has warned against further rainfall in this part of Bengal, causing a worry among victims and state administration.

Lives across districts in South Bengal such as West Midnapore, Burdwan, Hooghly, Howrah was put in peril after large cuses of water were discharged from DVC and the Durgapur barrage following heavy rainfall. A total of 2.5 lakh people have already been displaced while 15 people lost their lives in the flood.

The water levels though have receded slightly in Ghatol, in West Midnapore, the levels are rising in Khanakul and Udaynarayanpur in Hooghly and Howrah, respectively. The Indian Air Force was engaged by the state administration to help in rescue operations yesterday.

However, the situation could soon turn grim as the weather office predicted more rainfall for South Bengal districts. Further rainfall could completely drown towns and villages in the mentioned districts, especially in the coastal areas and ones adjoining Odisha. Rainfall alerts have already been circulated for South and North 24 Parganas and East and West Midnapore. The met office predicted the rainfall may increase from tomorrow.

This warning has caused much tension among the flood victims and state administration since water levels in Khanakul and Howrah's Udaynarayanpur have barely receded and further rain can drown more villages.

In Howrah, about 41 villages have already drowned in Udaynarayanpur while in Hooghly about 60 villages are underwater. About 80 flood-relief centres have been opened here while approx. 35 in Howrah.

The Durgapur barrage has however released a lesser amount of water today compared to the discharge on Sunday and Monday. The state government has set up shelter homes for those displaced, as relief operations, which began sometime last



week, continue in the flood-affected areas, the official said.

Over one lakh tarpaulin, 1,000 MT of rice, thousands of drinking water pouches and clean clothes have been sent to the shelter homes, it was learnt.

"We are collecting the details of all 14 people who have lost their lives due to the flood. We are waiting for a final report from the district administrations," the official said.

The NDRF and SDRF teams continue to remain engaged in evacuation and rescue operations. Sources said over 200 villages in Hooghly's Khanakul, West Midnapore's Ghatol and Howrah's Udaynarayanpur have been hit by floods and around five lakh people have been affected across the state.

The Paschim Medinipur district administration has opened 212 relief camps as areas under 172 gram panchayats and seven municipalities were flooded. The link road between towns of Keshpur and Medinipur is under water.

Mamata to visit flood-hit areas

West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee will visit the flood-affected areas of Khanakul in Hooghly and Udaynarayanpur in Howrah, areas on Wednesday. Banerjee would take stock of the relief and rehabilitation measures that are underway. Following which, she would hold an administrative review meeting.

The state labour minister Becharam Manna, as per the directive of the CM, today visited the flood-affected areas at Khanakul - II block.

The rivers in the Arambagh subdivision are in spate while embankments were breached by rivers Dakeswar and Rupnarayan. A total of 34,347 hectares of crops have been lost and 1,159 houses damaged.

Panchayat and rural development minister Subrata Mukherjee, along with state irrigation minister Soumen



Mahapatra have already visited Ghatol and Khanakul.

"The present situation is due to the Centre's lackadaisical attitude. Although we stress on a controlled release of water by DVC, our appeals have always gone unheard," said state irrigation minister Soumen Mahapatra after visiting the flood-affected areas of Udaynarayanpur. Officials said that all rivers and canals were filled to the brim due to rain-

water and the areas became flooded as soon as different barrages, including the DVC in Durgapur, released water. "Seven Gram Panchayats are completely under water, and three are partially submerged. The Udaynarayanpur block is the worst affected," a Howrah district official said.

Dilip Yadav, TMC district president said, the CM's helicopter will land at the Thakurani Chawk around 1 pm.

Bardhaman, Paschim Bardhaman, Paschim Medinipur, Hooghly, Howrah and South 24 Parganas, officials said.

The ongoing flood situation triggered a political slugfest between the TMC and the BJP. Teams of NDRF

and SDRF, along with the state administration, are involved in the relief and rescue operation.

Flood situation worsens, MP govt seeks Army's help

Besides, many state and national highways and railway tracks in the region were submerged, disrupting the road and rail traffic in the belt.

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan talked to Prime Minister Narendra Modi on phone in the morning and briefed him about the flood situation in the state, sources in the chief minister's office here said. The PM has assured all help to tackle the flood situation in the state, sources added.

Chouhan said Shivpuri district experienced record rainfall of 800 mm in the last two days causing flash floods in small and big rivers in the district. Over 400 villages in the district have been inundated due to the deluge. Over 2,000 people have so far been rescued in the district.

BENGAL FLOOD: 15 DEAD, 3 LAKH PEOPLE AFFECTED

Kolkata, Aug. 3: At least 15 people have died, and lakhs of people were rendered homeless or marooned, as the flood situation in six districts of West Bengal aggravated on Tuesday, triggering a slugfest between the ruling TMC and BJP over the release of "excess water" by the DVC.

Around three lakh people got displaced after heavy rain in the last few days, followed by discharge of water from Damodar Valley Corporation dams, inundated major parts of the districts of Purba Bardhaman, Paschim Bardhaman, Paschim Medinipur, Hooghly, Howrah and South 24 Parganas, officials said.

Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, who keeps a tab on the relief and rescue operations, is likely to conduct an aerial survey of Howrah and Hooghly districts to take stock of the situation. — PTI

लखनऊ. उत्तर प्रदेश में मानसून ने दोबारा से रफ्तार पकड़ ली है। मौसम विभाग ने राजधानी लखनऊ समेत पूरे यूपी में कई दिनों तक तेज बारिश की संभावना जताई है। मौसम विज्ञानियों का कहना है कि बंगाल की खाड़ी से आने वाली दक्षिण पूर्वी हवाओं की वजह से ऐसा होने वाला है। पहाड़ों और कई स्थानों पर लगातार बारिश होने से नदियों के किनारे बसे शहरों में जलस्तर तेजी से बढ़ा रहा है। जिस वजह से निचले इलाकों में रहने वाले लोगों के लिए संकट पैदा हो गया है। वैसे लगातार बारिश से यूपी में कुछ ठंड जैसा माहौल हो जाएगा।
