

Green body to track gas emissions online

Data From 1,320 Units To Be Scanned 24/7

New Delhi: Taking a significant step forward in its efforts to deal with pollution by monitoring effluents and emissions from polluting industries, the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) has started getting round the-clock online data on the compliance status of 1,320 out of 2,800 industrial units across the country.

While 920 of these 1,320 units have set up real-time sensor-based sophisticated monitoring devices, another 400 have moved towards the 'zero liquid discharge' (ZLD) system, where they treat the entire water and reuse it.

Such units will not discharge a drop of waste water into drains or rivers.

Though there was a deadline of June 30 for all industries to install sensor-based monitoring devices at their ends, certain industries like petro-chemicals, oil refineries and power plants will get it done during their phasewise scheduled shut-down period in next three months.

"This is a big leap in the management of pollution in the country", said Union environment minister Prakash Javadekar while announcing the launch of the 24X7 real-time monitoring system here on Tuesday.

He said, "Polluting industries will be dealt with strict-

ly. We will not spare any unit which is found to be discharging emitting pollutants beyond prescribed limits".

The environment ministry has also made it mandatory for new distillery, textile, tannery, chemicals, fertilizer, pesticides, dyes and pharmaceutical units to go for ZLD system before getting final order for commissioning.

Under the system, government will send SMS alert to those industries whose pollutant parameters are found to be exceeding the prescribed limits for more than 15 minutes at a stretch.

Pvt forecaster counters Met, sees normal rains in July

New Delhi: Private weather forecaster Skymet is sticking to its prediction of a normal monsoon in the key month of July as well as the rest of the rainy season.

The forecaster said on Tuesday that rains in July were likely to be 104% of normal, a prediction it had made in April. It also stood by its earlier forecast of the overall monsoon being 102% of normal.

"A long break (in monsoon) is being feared in July. We disagree," Skymet CEO . Jatin Singh said in a statement, adding that although rains could take a "breather" between July 2 and 6, good spells were in store from 6th to 8th, 14th to 17th and 23rd to 26th. Skymet's prediction is at variance with India's official weather agency IMD's forecast of 92% rains in July, as also that of others such as US commercial forecaster AccuWeather, which sees a weakened monsoon in July due to the El Nino effect.

For June, Skymet predicted 107% of normal rainfall, while the month ended with 116% rains.

More trouble for Pankaja Munde — it's water projects this time,

DAYS AFTER being accused of irregularities in awarding contracts worth Rs 206 crore for purchase of various items in anganwadi schools, Maharashtra minister Pankaja Munde seems to have landed in fresh trouble as allegations emerged that she may have interfered with the government's tendering process for two contracts for water conservation projects in Parbhani district.

The contracts were eventually awarded to a bidder who was originally disqualified on technical grounds, allegedly after Munde's office stepped in.

The allegations pertain to two contracts in Parbhani for works under the state government's flagship initiative, the Jalyukt Shivar Yojana, meant for drought-proofing villages. The contracts, collectively worth nearly Rs 1.40 crore, were awarded to Sunil Hitech, a company presided over by Munde aide and BJP politician Ratnakar Gutte.

Documents including tender documents, a letter from the wa-

ter conservation department's deputy secretary and notings by Munde's private secretary on another official communication show that while Gutte's firm emerged as the lowest bidder, his company was disqualified during scrutiny of the bids. The reason cited was that a clause requiring bidders to digitally sign all pages of the bid documents had not been complied with. Official documents also show that the office of Maharashtra's Chief Engineer (Minor Irrigation Projects) then recommended that both the contracts be awarded to the second lowest eligible bidder, Vijay Construction.

However, Gutte reportedly

approached Munde's office. As per the documents, Munde, who heads the state's water conservation department, convened a meeting in this regard on April 23 this year. Following the meeting, Munde's private secretary, Dr Naresh Gite, remarked on an official note to the water conservation department officials that the "minister had directed that necessary action be taken to process the bid of the lowest bidder to avoid loss to the state exchequer." A day later, the department's deputy secretary, VSVakhare, issued an communication to the Aurangabad divisional commissioner referring to the minister's directives and stating that "appropriate action be taken." Acting on the directive, the Parbhani district committee for Jalyukt Shivar works relaxed the tender clause regarding digital signatures and overturned Sunil Hitech's disqualification. Senior government officials, on condition of anonymity, said the action of the minister's office amounted to "violation of the tender's sanctity."

Munde, who returned from London on Tuesday morning, avoided speaking on the controversy. Her office said she would respond at a press conference on Wednesday.

When contacted, Prabhakar Deshmukh, principal secretary, water conservation department, said: "The decision regarding relaxation of the tender condition was not taken at the government level. It was taken at the collector level. The government only cited the representation it had received and passed information for appropriate action to be taken in this regard."

Deshmukh, however, refused to comment on the remarks entered by Munde's private secretary on the official communication regarding the tenders.

Polluted units in Ganga basin upload data onlines

NEW DELM: For the first time, the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) has received online pollution data from half of the industrial units in the Gangariver basin.

Terming it as a "big leap" in pollution management, environment minister Prakash Javadekar said 920 critically polluted units have installed online real-time monitoring devices at their effluent and emission discharge points in compliance with the CPCB directives.

The CPCB in 2014 had asked the industrial units in distillery, tex-

tile, tannery and others sectors to install 24/7 pollution monitoring system and achieve Zero Liquid Discharge (ZLD).

"Last year we mandated installation of 24/7 monitoring system in the 17 industrial sectors across 2,800 industries. Out of that 920 units have installed 24/7 monitoring devices. We have started receiving real-time data on compliance on effluents and emissions. This is a major reform," Javadekar told reporters on Tuesday.

नई दिल्ली विशेष संवाददाता

केंद्रीय वन एवं पर्यावरण मंत्रालय ने गंग में सर्वाधिक प्रदूषण फैलाने वाल 2,800 इकाइयों पर अत्याधुनिक प्रौद्योगिकी का पहरा बैठा दिया है। इसके तहत निर्घारित मात्रा से अधिक प्रदूषक तत्व निकलते ही इनके खिलाफ सख्त कार्रवाई की जाएगी।

वन एवं पर्यावरण मंत्री प्रकाश जावडेकर ने कहा कि गंगा की धारा को निर्मल और अविरल बनाने के लिए जल प्रदूषण फैलाने वाली इकाइयों से प्रदूषित जल की निकासी पर पूरी तरह रोक लगाने की व्यवस्था की गई है। उन्होंने कहा कि सर्वाधिक प्रदूषण वाले 17 क्षेत्रों की 2,800 इकाइयों से वायु और जल प्रदूषण की निगरानी के लिए चिमनियों व तरल कचरे की निकासी की जगह सेंसर यक्त प्रणाली लगाने को कहा गया है।

गंगा को सबसे ज्यादा प्रदूषित करने वाली 630 इकाइयां हैं जिनमें से 440 टेनरियां हैं। ये सभी कानपुर एवं उन्नाव के बीच में गंगा के किनारे स्थित हैं। पर्यावरण मंत्रालय ने मानकों का पालन नहीं करने पर पिछले एक वर्ष में 64 इकाइयों को बंद करने का निर्देश दिया था।

इससे इन पर 24 घंटे नजर रखी जा सकेगी। यह प्रणाली ऑनलाइन काम करती है और यहां पर्यावरण मंत्रालय के मुख्यालय में लगे कंप्यूटरों पर लगातार इसके आंकड़े मिलते हैं।

जिस इकाई से भी निर्धारित मात्रा से अधिक प्रदूषित तत्व निकलते हैं, पर्यावरण मंत्रालय की ओर से उसे पहले चेतावनी के तौर पर एसएमएस भेजा जाता है और यदि प्रदूषण पर रोक नहीं लगायी जाती है तो इकाई के खिलाफ सख्त कार्रवाई की जाती है। जावडेकर ने कहा कि अभी तक 2,800 में से 1300 से अधिक इकाइयों ने यह प्रणाली लगा दी है जबिक शेष में यह लगाई जा रही है। ये इकाइयां अपने संसाधनों से यह प्रणाली लगा रही हैं। हालांकि यह प्रणाली अभी विदेशों से आयात की जा रही है लेकिन यह ज्यादा महंगी नहीं है। इस प्रणाली को देश में ही विकसित करने पर भी काम चल रहा है।
