his government should be accorded to 'Namami Gange', cleaning the Ganga and the irrigation projects.

"The chief minister was asked that a presentation should be made so that funds are released by the central government for completing the pending water projects", Bhartis said. The chief minister fixed a time frame of one

week to the irrigation officials present in the meeting for submitting the presentation on a priority basis to the centre, minister added. The rejuvenation of Ganga's tributaries like Ram Ganga, Kali and Yamuna was also discussed in the meeting.

for the construction of ghats along the Ganga river for speeding up the 'swachhta abhiyan'.

"Out of this, Rs. 1600 crore will be spent on cleaning the river when it passes through the villages, construction of ghats on the river in the cities and purification of river water".

About the delay in setting up sewage treatment plants

(STP), Bharti said installation takes time. She was, however, hopeful that work on cleaning the Ganga would be completed by 2018. Bharti said Uttar Pradesh should follow the example of Madhya Pradesh where irrigation facilities were better and the neighbouring state has attained top spot in agriculture production.

She was of the view that Rajasthan government's move to refurbish and charge wells and water bodies can be replicated in Uttar Pradesh.

Incidentally, Bharti also came down heavily on the implementation of the Gomti river front project in Lucknow, which was one of the pet schemes of the Akhilesh yadav government. The minister said earlier too she had raised the issue of irregularities.

There are many complaints of financial bungling in the project, Bharti stated, adding that no attention was paid to cleaning the river water.

Stating that the Bharatiya Janata Party government will implement the Gomti river front project, the union minister said but, complaints of financial irregularities should be probed. Regarding Ram Mandir the minister said a solution should be found after hearing all the parties concerned.

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Flood situation eases in Kashmir

Jhelum level drops in two places; PM assures Mehbooba of Centre's support

While the Jhelum river, which runs across the Valley, remained in spate for the second consecutive day on Friday, its levels started decreasing in south Kashmir and Srinagar, bringing relief to the local population.

The Centre also offered help to the government in tackling the flood situation. Life in the Valley has been affected by rain over the past

three days. In south Kashmir, the gauge at Sangam showed 18.70 feet at 6 p.m. compared to 22.10 feet on Thursday night. Similarly, the water level at the Ram Munshibagh gauge in Srinagar came down from 20 feet to 19.60 for the same period. However, the water levels at both gauges continue to flow above the "People mark. danger should not panic as the water level in the river and other tributaries is receding," said Chief Engineer, Irrigation and Flood Control Muhammad department, Hanief Lone.

The Srinagar-Jammu Highway continued to be closed

Advisory panel disagrees with forest land allocation, wants canal re-aligned

India's apex forest advisory body has imposed tough conditions on the Ken-Betwa river interlinking project. Given the ecological and environmental impact posed by the project, it had to pass multiple authorities for clearance. A forest advisory clearance was seen to be the last step before the project was to begin.

The Forest Advisory Committee (FAC), the apex environment ministry authority that clears requests for diverting forest land for projects, usually rejects or recommends a

sometimes with conditions, for the diversion of forest land. As minutes of the March 30 meeting - made public on Friday - show, in the case of the Ken-Betwa project, the FAC has refrained from explicitly giving its opinion either way and only seconded an earlier sub-committee's report that had cleared the project subject to strict caveats.

'Not unprecedented'

"This is unusual for the FAC but not unprecedented," a person privy to the forest clearance process told The Hindu. the FAC's recommendations are passed on to

the environment minister, who can abide by them or reject them.

The ₹18,000 crore river interlinking project requires 4,141 hectares of forest in the heart of the Panna Tiger reserve, and some more besides, to build a dam and a 230-km canal to transfer water to several drought-afflicted villages in Bundelkhand.

As compensation for the pristine tiger habitat that would be inundated by the project, the Water Ministry had agreed to acquire about 8,000 hectares of forest land from the Madhya Pradesh government and revive / asked for the project's main them as forest.

But the FAC said this land was not good enough as it was fragmented, and, to meaningfully revive a forest that is part of tiger habitat, the land acquired ought to be contiguous. This would require, according to the FAC, "revenue lands/nonforest lands by way of purchase or otherwise by the project proponents and the government".

While a State can relatively allocate forest land for Central projects, transferring private or revenue land is harder, time-consuming and costly. The FAC has also canal to be re-aligned.

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Nagarjunasagar dam to be automated soon

Move will ensure optimum use of water, regulate discharge levels and reduce human intervention



The imposing giant edifice is almost dry with water flowing in a trickle at the corners. The Nagarjunasagar reservoir is at dead storage level. But this summer has also provided an opportunity for the dam authorities to repair the 50-year-old structure.

It is not exactly repair

It is not exactly repair though. It is more about bringing the dam located in Nalgonda district into the digital age by automating the systems. This also entails serving the drinking water and irrigation needs of both Telangana and Andhra Pradesh.

Nagarjunasagar will perhaps be the first dam in the country where automation is being introduced for operations and maintenance in order to make optimum usage of water along with electricity generation. "The ageing dam needs improvement to

meet the present-day demands to ensure safe and reliable operations with new age technology for opening and closing crest gates during the times of flood and water management during the dry season," says Commissioner of Command Area and Development Authority G. Malsur.

The automation of 26

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crest gates and 18 other gates control — costing ₹8 crore from World Bank funds under the modernisation project — will result in generating real-time data which can be monitored from any part of the world through the Internet.

When water is found to be excess in the reservoir, the control panel will trigger the

gate control unit to open the gates and allow the water to evacuate to the lower levels. Engineers say it will help in reliability of the gate structure and operation machinery so that problems with the gate-operating equipment are reduced considerably, thus improving the overall dam safety.

Automation is built into the computerised remote control system for flood and discharge regulation from the dam through data received from local sensors at the main dam, gates – crest gates, chute gates and right canal gates, directly wired from the Master Control Faclility (MCF).

Data can be received at predefined times of five minutes to 24 hour intervals using GSM/GPRS/VSAT wireless telemetry and also GSM based information management system for transmitting online information of re-

quired data on the cell phones of project authorities.

Real-time forecast

Using the real-time flood forecast, application software will have the facility to operate the gates in 'anticipatory mode' i.e. moderate releases from crest gates in anticipation of receiving water. "All these works were being done manually all these days. This was a tedious process. Once automated, we can reduce human intervention and measurement errors," says Dr. Malsur, also the Project Director of Water Sector Improvement Project.

A steel bridge is coming up across the length of the dam at a cost of ₹1.5 crore. A 150-ft crane at the dam site is helping engineers install the pre-fabricated bridge which will help workers reach the far corners of the gates for maintenance and repairs.

Chaired by water resources secretary Amarjit Singh, the meeting on Friday deliberated on modalities to set up the GMB.

UP government officials

informed the participants that the matter had already been put up before chief minister Aditya Nath Yogi for ap-

proval.
"Both states agreed in principle to take final con-currence of their respective governments by May 9 when the next meeting is sched-uled here at the behest of the water resources ministry,'

said an official. Singh is learnt to have told the state representatives that the ministry would notify the GMB irrespective of any response from them as the Uttarakhand HC had recently ordered the government to act fast on the issue.

Though the board was supposed to be constituted long ago under the UP Reorganisation Act, 2000, it couldn't be set up due to differences over

many issues between the two states which included administrative control over assets.

Uttarakhand was carved out of UP over 16 years ago, but both states continue to be in possession of each other's assets. For example, the VIP ghat in Haridwar and many canals in Uttarakhand are still under UP's control.
As many as 43 canals part-

ly lie in both states and their management control is not clear — a scenario which affects their maintenance and water distribution for irrigation.

"Both states have agreed to finalise their control and operation within one month. The objective of this exercise is to rationalise operation and control of these 43 can als for their efficient management," the official said.

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Teesta waters can't be shared: Mamata

'Other rivers in the area can be tapped'

Expressing her displeasure at the talks between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Bangladesh counterpart, Sheikh Hasina, on the Teesta, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Sunday said the river is the lifeline of north Bengal which can't be taken away.

"There is very little water in Teesta river, it is our lifeline, the lifeline of north Bengal," Ms. Banerjee said.

She said other trans-national rivers could be diverted to attend to Bangladesh's water needs. "Your problem is water, not Teesta. I am willing to look at any alternative proposal. There are many other rivers in the area, we can use water from them," she said.

No pact signed

On Saturday, Ms. Hasina said India's support would help resolve all issues, including Teesta water sharing, expeditiously. Meanwhile, no pact on Teesta was signed between the two

nations. Mr. Modi said: "I am very happy that the Chief Minister of West Bengal is my guest today. Her feeling for Bangladesh is as warm as my own. I assure you and the people of Bangladesh of our continuing efforts on Teesta. It's only my government and your government that can and will find an early solution to Teesta water sharing issue."

The Teesta runs through West Bengal and Bangladesh and if a treaty is signed it would allow for equal share of water. Bangladesh welcomed Mr. Modi's commitment to an early solution on the Teesta.

Mamata-Hasina bonhomie over dinner raises hopes for water accord

Bengal CM Offers Water From Torsha, Electricity To B'desh

New Delhi: West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee met Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina over a private dinner at Rashtrapati Bhavan on Saturday. The bonhomie between the two is expected to find a way for the accord to share Teesta waters without hurting the interests of people on either side of the border.

In fact, during her meeting with Sheikh Hasina, Mamata is learnt to have suggested that since Bangladesh needs more water, both sides should explore water-sha-ring from other river systems in the region too and not just from Teesta. With fe-ars that too much water from Teesta flowing into Bangla desh could leave North Bengal dry, Mamata's suggestion is to provide water to Bangladesh from Torsha river instead, which would be easier for Bengal as there are three river systems in the region, said sources.

Making sure that she had more on the plate to offer Dhaka as good relations with Bangladesh is to the advantage of Bengal which shares the longest border with the neighbouring country, Mamata offered to provide electricity during her meeting with Hasina in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi earlier in the day Claiming that Bengal has excess electricity which could be sold to Dhaka, Mamata made the offer which Modi immediately accepted, it was learnt. Soon after, Mamata sent an official letter to Modi on the issue, sources said. It is also easier for Dhaka to ta-ke power from Bengal rather than from Bhutan as is the case at present.

During her meeting with Sheikh Hasina and PM Modi at the Hyderabad House, held before an official lunch hosted by the PM with a traditional Bengali spread, sources said Mamata expres-

- But Baneriee opposed it; signing shelved to later that year
- > Teesta water-sharing agreement waiting to be signed since 2011

Teesta originates in Sikkim from the Khangse

irrigation and fishing

- Teesta floodplain covers 2,750sq.km in Bangladesh
- > Of Teesta's catchment, 83% in India; 17% in Bangladesh
- ➤ Its catchment supports about 10m people — and 14% of crop
- > Nearly 1 lakh hectares across 5 districts impacted by upstream drawals from the Teesta in India

The Mamata factor

- ➤ In 2011, Mamata Banerjee was to accompany then PM Manmohan Singh to Dhaka for signing deal, but cancelled trip
- > Trinamool was a key UPA partner then & water is a state issue. So, deal couldn't be inked without CM's approval
- > Then Bangladesh foreign minister Dipu Moni had warned bilateral ties would get complicated if India falled to deliver on Teesta

Modi bid

- PM Modi went to Dhaka in June 2015, but visit did not vield a deal
- Following Mamata's reelection in 2016, some reports say she's a little more conciliatory now
- > On a visit to Dhaka, Mamata reportedly urged Bangladesh to have confidence in her on Teesta
