### KHAMMAM GETS HIGHEST RAINFALL IN TELANGANA

DC CORRESPONDENT HYDERABAD, AUG. 9

The monsoon currents have picked up intensity and heavy rains lashed many districts in the state since early Wednesday.

Khammam received close to 10 cm rainfall in five hours in the morning followed by a strong spell in Medak district. The upper air circulation which turned into depression over the Bay of Bengal strengthened the current, resulting in heavy rains accompanied by a strong gale.

The single strong spell will not reduce the deficit. The state needs more rains to cross the minus figure.

Currently, out of 10 original districts which also cover the newly formed 31 mandal-turned districts of Telangana, eight major districts fall in the deficit table. They are: Adilabad, Karimnagar, Mahbubnagar, Medak, Nalgonda, Nizamabad, Ranga Reddy and Warangal. While two districts — Hyderabad and Khammam — are surplus by a low margin.

The state is supposed to have around 43.67 cm of rainfall. However, it is a staggering figure with 37.47 cm, a deficit of 14 per cent. During the last 24 hours the south-west monsoon currents, which have been weak since July-end, picked

up pace.

HIKKAMAGALURU, DHNS: hief Minister Siddaramaiah n Tuesday said that he has onvened a meeting of ILAs and the MP from landya on Wednesday to iscuss releasing water om the KRS dam to Tamil adu.

Speaking to reporters here, the chief minister said that the

volume of water to be released will be decided based on the availability of water in the reservoir. A final decision will be taken during a meeting of the elected representatives of all other districts coming under the Cauvery delta on August 19.

Siddaramaiah said that while the available storage recorded is 53 tmcft, there is a requirement of 35 tmcft for irrigation and 30 tmcft for drinking water purpose. As per the crisis agreement, the state has released 12 tmcft as against the committed 21 tmcft of Cauvery water to Tamil Nadu.

Stating that the state is expected to receive rain this month, the chief minister said

that cloud seeding has been planned as an alternative, with measures being taken to start it from the month-end, after studying the exact places to take up the initiative. On the prevailing drought situation in the state, he said that he has written to the Centre. Besides, an all-party delegation will be taken to New Delhi. Although a similar exercise

was conducted in the past to tide over the Cauvery and Mahadayi crises, there was no positive response from the Central government.

Siddaramaiah also made a mockery of BJP state president B S Yeddyurappa for not raising the issue of farm loan waiver. While the state government has waived the crop loans advanced by cooperative banks, the BJP failed to exert pressure on the Central government to waive the loans given by nationalised banks.

# Yamuna floodplain was in sordid state before event: AoL to NGT

Yamuna floodplain was in a "sordid" condition prior to the holding of the three-day World Culture Festival, the Art of Living (AoL) foundation of Sri Sri Ravi Shankar today told the National Green Tribunal.

Referring to a report of the Principal Committee, dated April 19, 2014, AoL told the green panel that cultural and religious activities were permitted at the site and there was no bar on holding of the extravaganza.

The NGT set up the Principal Committee to see execution of Yamuna cleaning.

"It is submitted that the event site was in a sordid state, to say the least. Even with regard to the state of the floodplains in so far as debris dumping was concerned, the situation was admittedly no better," advocate Nikhil Sakhardande, appearing for AoL, said.

The AoL told a bench headed by NGT Chairperson Justice Swatanter Kumar that it was a "pre-requisite" for the sevenmember expert panel to know about the status of the floodplains prior to the event before coming to the conclusion whether any damage was caused by holding it there last year.

It said the seven-member expert committee, which has

held the organisation responsible for the damage, has undertaken an exercise on a "completely erroneous factual matrix".

On the issue of damage to wetlands on the site, the AoL said that the committee has completely erred in assuming that the event site had such water bodies.

"First and foremost, no wetlands existed on the event site as contemplated by the legal regime or otherwise. It is submitted that in order to consider any land as wetland, it is imperative that the statutory procedure and process by which such land is identified and declared to be a wetland is followed in its entirety," it said. ## Plan to find a permanent solution to N-E floods: Govt

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 10

THE CENTRE proposes to find a permanent solution to floods in the Northeast, including Assam, MoS (Home) Kiren Rijiju said while responding to a calling-attention motion in Lok Sabha Thursday.

The motion was moved by Gaurav Gogoi of the Congress, who said the government was in deep slumber like Kumbhkaran and failed to take quick action when such calamities struck.

Rijiju said Rs 100 crore has been earmarked for finding a permanent solution, and experts will help draw the plan. He rejected the charge that the government had failed to respond to the yearly floods in time and had given little financial assistance to affected states.

He said the Centre did not discriminate between states, and told Gogoi that two instalments of state disaster response funds had been already given to Assam. He told Saugata Roy (TMC) that Rs 130 crore had been given to. West Bengal for desilting of the Damodar. To Roy's charge of discrimination against Bengal, Rijiju and the state was yet to submit a memorandum to the Centre to get funds for floods.

#### BJD demands tribunal for Mahanadi water dispute

The BJD demanded an inter-state tribunal for resolving Odisha's Mahanadi water dispute with Chhattisgarh. BJD floor leader Bhartruhari Mahtab said during zero hour the Supreme Court had favoured the appointment of a tribunal but the Centre was yet to do so. The BJD MPs came into the well to to get the government to respond, but in vain.

Mahtab said "certain barrages" had been built by the Chhattisgarh government upstream "without the permission of the Union government". Odisha had witnessed a "loss of 80 per cent flow in Mahanadi during the nonmonsoon period" during 2016-2017. There is a bill providing for a permanent water dispute tribunal at the national level, he said.

गंगा संरक्षण मंत्रालय के एक अधिकारी ने बताया कि इन परियोजनाओं को राष्ट्रीय स्वच्छ गंगा

मिशन की कार्यकारी समिति की 5वीं बैठक में मंजुरी दी गई। इसमें से एक परियोजना घाट विकास और एक परियोजना गंगा ज्ञान केंद्र से संबंधित है। मंत्रालय से प्राप्त जानकारी के अनुसार, बिहार में बाढ़ और पटना में कंकड़बाग और दीघा में कुल 1461 करोड़ रुपये की अनुमानित लागत वाली तीन प्रमुख जलमल बुनियादी ढाँचा परियोजनाओं को मंजूरी दी गई है। इन परियोजनाओं से 161 एमएलडी की अतिरिक्त जलमल शोधन क्षमता का सृजन होगा। इसमें दीघा में 100 एमएलडी, कंकड्बाग में 50 एमएलडी और बाढ में 11 एमएलडी की परियोजना शामिल है।

वर्तमान में पटना के कंकडबाग और दीघा जलमल क्षेत्रों में कोई एसटीपी नहीं है। उल्लेखनीय है कि नमामि गंगे कार्यक्रम के तहत पटना के बेऊर, सैदपुर, करमालीचक और पहाड़ी जलमल क्षेत्रों में 200 एमएलडी जलमल शोधन क्षमताओं को जुटाने की पहले ही मंज्री दी जा चुकी है।
