सरदार सरोवर भरा तो बेघर होंगे 50 हजार लोग

बड़वानी. अगर सरदार सरोवर भरा तो 50 हजार से ज्यादा लोग बेघर होंगे। प्रशासन ने बांध के गेट बंद कर बांध को भरने का निर्णय कर लिया है। नर्मदा बचाव आंदोलन के तहत मेधा पाटकर के साथ भदला गांव में कई आदिवासी बांध के भरे जाने का विरोध कर रहे हैं। मेधा पाटकर का कहना है कि अगर बांध लेवल बढ़ता है 224 गांवों के 50 हजार से ज्यादा लोग बेघर हो जाएंगे, क्योंकि उनके गांव

डूब क्षेत्र में आ जाएंगे। इस धरने में रोज 4 से 5 गांव के आदिवासी लोग शामिल होकर अपना विरोध जता रहे हैं।

वे बदले में उचित मुआवजे की मांग कर रहे हैं। विरोध करने वाले लोगों का कहना है कि अगर मांग पूरी नहीं हुई तो वे जलसन्नाधि ले लेंगे। पिछले सप्ताह भी प्रभावितों ने कलेक्टर से मिलने की कोशिश की थी, लेकिन पुलिस ने उन्हें मिलने नहीं दिया।

पानी में फंसे 250 लोगों को सेना ने बचाया

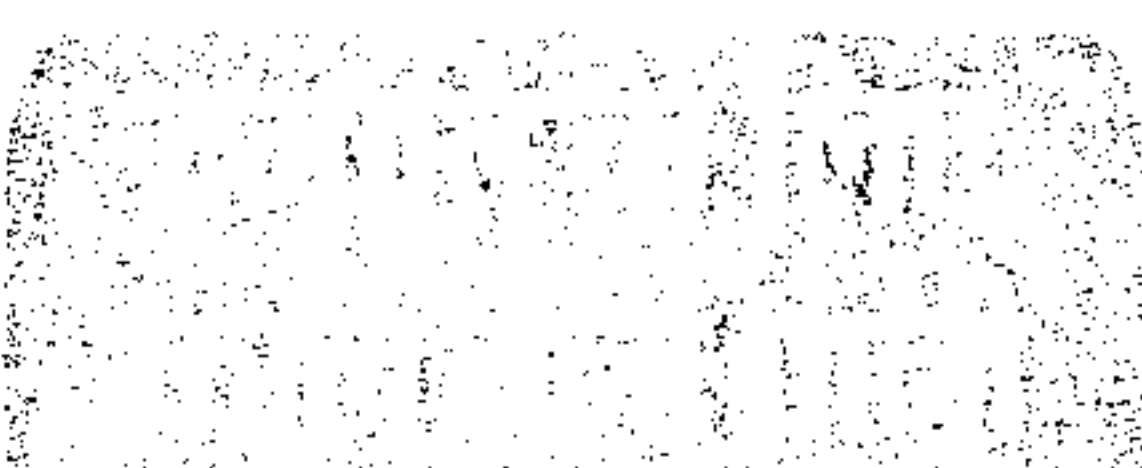
जयपुर/करौली, (कास): प्रदेश के विभिन्न इलाकों में लगातार हो रही बारिश ने जनजीवन अस्त-व्यस्त कर दिया है। आफत बनी इस बारिश के कहर का अंदाजा इस बात से लगाया जा सकता है कि इसकी वजह से प्रदेश के कई गांव और शहरों के निचले इलाके जलमग्न हैं। गुरुवार को चित्तौड़गढ़ में करीब 3 इंच बारिश हुई। वहीं करौली जिले के सपोटरा में बुधवार रात सैकड़ों लोगों की जान पर बन आई। सपोटरा में बीसलपुर बांध से पानी छोड़ने के कारण बनास नदी में उफान आने से ग्राम पंचायत हाड़ौती के गांव काठड़ा के 30 परिवारों के 250 लोग पानी के बीच फंस गए। इन लोगों ने पूरी रात पानी के बीच खतरे के साए में गुजारी। घरों में पानी घुस गया तो लोग छतों पर जा बैठे। पानी का बहाव तेज था तो पार करने की हिम्मत भी नहीं हो सकी। गुरुवार सुबह एनडीआरएफ की रेस्क्यू टीम पहुंची और बचाव कार्य शुरू किया। क्षेत्र में पानी का भराव देखते हुए



करौली के सपोटरा स्थित काठड़ा गांव में पानी में फंसे लोगों को सुरक्षित निकालते एनडीआरएफ के सदस्य।

स्थानीय विधायक रमेश मीणा ने केन्द्र को पत्र लिखकर सेना भेजने की मांग की है। लोगों के फंसे होने की सूचना पर करौली कलेक्टर मनोज कुमार शर्मा पुलिस बल के साथ मौके पर पहुंचे और आस-पास अन्य आबादी क्षेत्रों के लोगों को ऊंचाई पर जाने को कहा। एनडीआरएफ के जवानों ने पानी के बीच फंसे परिवारों को नावों की मदद से बाहर निकाला। देर शाम तक सभी लोगों को सुरक्षित बाहर

निकाला जा सका। वहीं हाड़ौती से भूरी पहाड़ी के पुल के करीब 10 फिट ऊपर से पानी गुजरने के कारण क्षेत्र के लोगों का सवाई माधोपुर से संपर्क कट गया है। पाली और जोधपुर में भी बाढ़ का पानी लगातार तीसरे दिन आबादी क्षेत्रों में भरा नजर आया। हालांकि बारिश का अभाव जरूर रहा, लेकिन पहले से भरे पानी ने लोगों की मुसीबतें यथावत रखी हैं। लोग रोजमर्रा के काम तक नहीं निपटा पा रहे हैं।



जोधपुर, (शिवप्रकाश पुरोहित): शहर के एमडीएमएच अस्पताल परिसर में बनी महावीर इंटरनेशनल धर्मशाला के अण्डरग्राउण्ड में बने एक कमरे में गुरुवार को दम्पती के शव मिले। दम्पती की मौत इस धर्मशाला के भूतल में बने कमरों में आठ से दस फीट पानी भर जाने के कारण हुई। दो दिन से लापता दम्पती से संपर्क नहीं होने पर सुबह उनके पुत्र और परिजन पहुंचे तो मामले का खुलासा हुआ। जानकारी के अनुसार बीकानेर जिले के देशनोक निवासी बुलाकीदास जाजड़ा अपनी कैंसर पीड़ित पत्नी किरण देवी के इलाज और थैरेपी कराने के लिए अस्पताल के कैंसर रोग विभाग में आठ अगस्त को आए थे।

राजगढ़, लगातार बारिश से अंचल बेहाल है। ऊपर से जिम्मेदारों की चूक मुसीबतें बढ़ा रही हैं। ऐसा ही मामला सामने आया राजगढ़ के अजनार नदी पर बने मूंडला डैम से। यहां जिम्मेदारों ने गुरुवार को न तो पुलिस को सूचना दी, न जल बहाव वाले रास्तों के गांवों में मुनादी कराई। डैम से छूटा पानी 7 किमी दूर स्थित कराड़िया, धनवास की पुलिया पर करीब दो फीट ऊपर बहने लगा। इस दौरान ग्रामीण भी हथेली पर लेकर गुजरते रहे।

Floodwaters recede in Bihar, rise in UP

DELHI: Floodwaters receded further in Bihar on Wednesday while several villages in Uttar Pradesh stare at a deluge-like situation, prompting the administration to alert the army.

Heavy rain lashed the national capital on Wednesday evening leading to traffic snarls and high relative humidity. The maximum and minimum temperatures were recorded at 35.3 and 27.5 degrees Celsius, both a notch above normal.

In Uttar Pradesh, the Ghagra, Sharda and Ganga are ei-

ther flowing above their respective danger marks or near as over 50 villages have been affected due to floods.

The army was alerted to remain on standby as the situation worsened in Baranaki, affected by the Ghagra floodwaters.

Meanwhile, the flood situation in Bihar improved further with water receding in most of the rivers, and only Purnea district is currently facing flood situation.

With no reports of fresh deaths, the toll remained at 95.

Except for the Kosi in Baltara in Khagaria district, all rivers are flowing below the danger level.

The number of blocks affected by the floods came down to three on Wednesday and the number of marooned villages reduced to 18.

Rain was also recorded in most parts of Punjab and Haryana with Mohali receiving the highest rainfall at 37 mm, while Chandigarh received 25.6 mm.

Several places in Chandigarh and Mohali witnessed

power outage for several hours, causing inconvenience to people.

Odisha, where most parts have been experiencing heavy rain for the last three days, is likely to receive heavy rain coupled with gusty surface wind on Thursday as a depression in the region has intensified over Bangladesh.

Under its impact, rain or thundershower is likely to occur at most places over north Odisha and many places over the southern parts of the state. **PTI**

Rajasthan rain: toll touches 7

Army, NDRF carry out rescue operations

JAIPUR, DHNS: Life remained standstill in Rajasthan's Pali, Chittorgarh and Bhilwara districts on Wednesday as there was no relief from torrential rain, with flood-like situation prevailing in many areas.

Teams of Army, NDRF and SDRF carried out rescue works as several thatched houses collapsed in different parts of Bhilwara district and nearby villages.

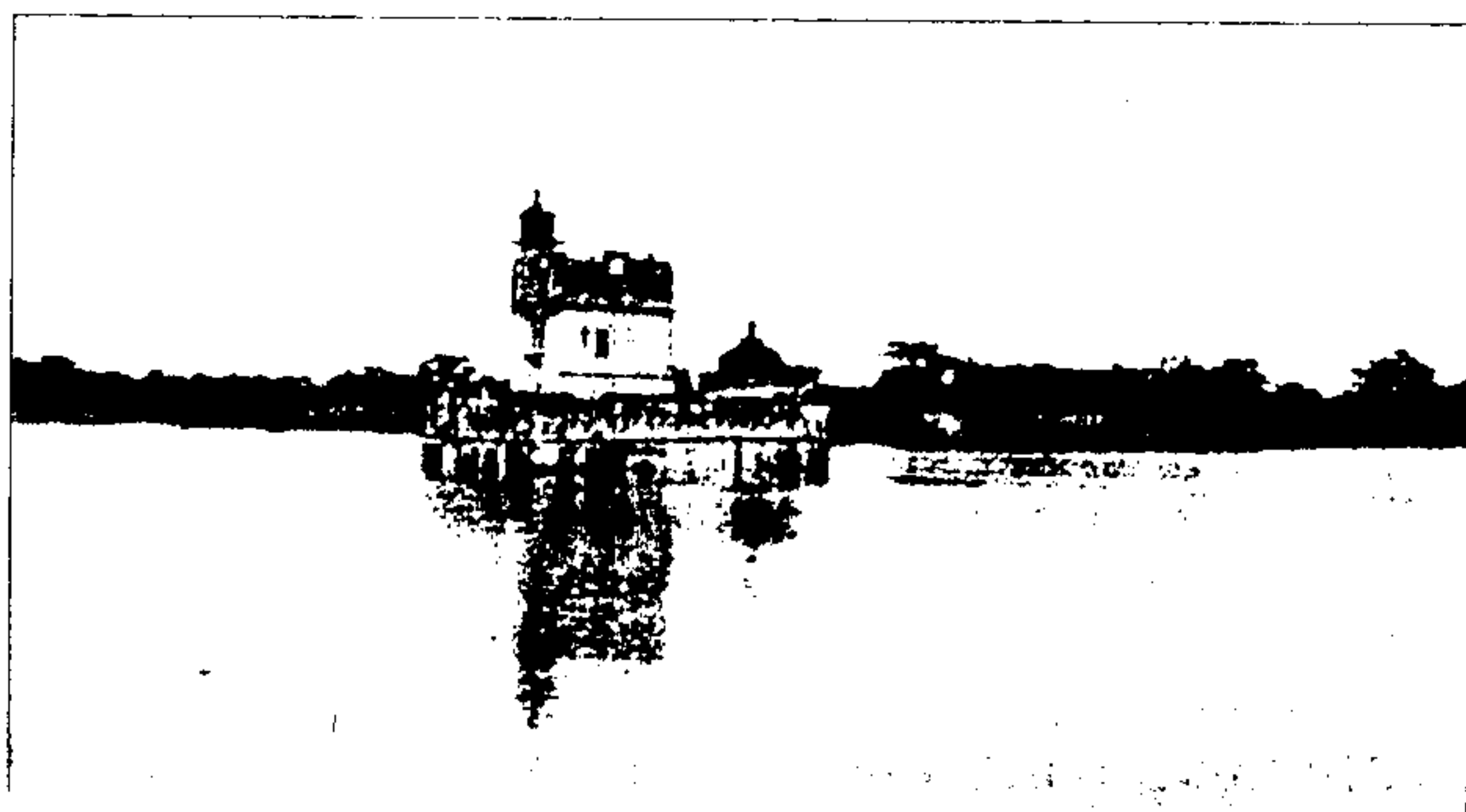
The death toll has reached seven, including six kids drowned in Barmer on Tuesday. A 25-year-old man was swept away by heavy flow of water on the bank of a river in Pali district. According to Defence PRO Lt. Col V K Ojha, Army's three columns, that have been deployed so far, remained on standby. Minor assistance was provided near Bhilwara for bridge repair at Saroha and Pandher.

Chief Minister Vasundhara

Raje, while returning to Jaipur from Dungarpur, also undertook an aerial survey of flood-hit area in Bhilwara and Chittorgarh on Wednesday afternoon. She directed the district authorities to be alert and provide all possible assistance and relief to the people.

Rajasthan Home Minister Gulab Chand Kataria visited Chittorgarh while Public Health Engineering Department Minister Kiran Maheshwari took stock of the situation in Bhilwara. Kataria told reporters, "The situation is under control in Chittorgarh. The assessment of losses is being done and the state government will, under norms, provide help and assistance to the affected families."

In Jaipur, normal life was crippled as the city witnessed heavy downpour resulting in waterlogging in most parts. Commuters were stranded for hours as roads turned into rivers.

River Krishna, tributaries continue to be in spate

BELAGAVI: River Krishna and its tributaries Doodgan-ga, Vedagan-ga continued to be in spate in Belagavi district on Wednesday.

However, the water flow in the rivers has marginally receded following decrease in the outflow from the reservoirs in Maharashtra.

As many as five bridges continued to remain under water in Chikkodi taluk. Traffic on these bridges has been affected for the past couple of weeks. Mean-

while, Belagavi city received light rains on Wednesday.

On the other hand, with the release of 2.30 lakh cusecs of water from the Almatti reservoir, vast tracts of land in several villages on the banks of River Krishna have been inundated. Farmers said that their crops were being destroyed whenever water is released from the dam every year.

They have sought the government to declare their land as submerged permanently or

pay suitable compensation for crop loss.

The present rate of compensation — Rs 1,000 to Rs 4,000 per acre — do not cover even the money spent on growing crops, they said.

The Almatti dam had reached the maximum level of 518.40 metres. The Sheelahalli bridge in Lingsugur taluk of Raichur district continued to remain under water for the second day.

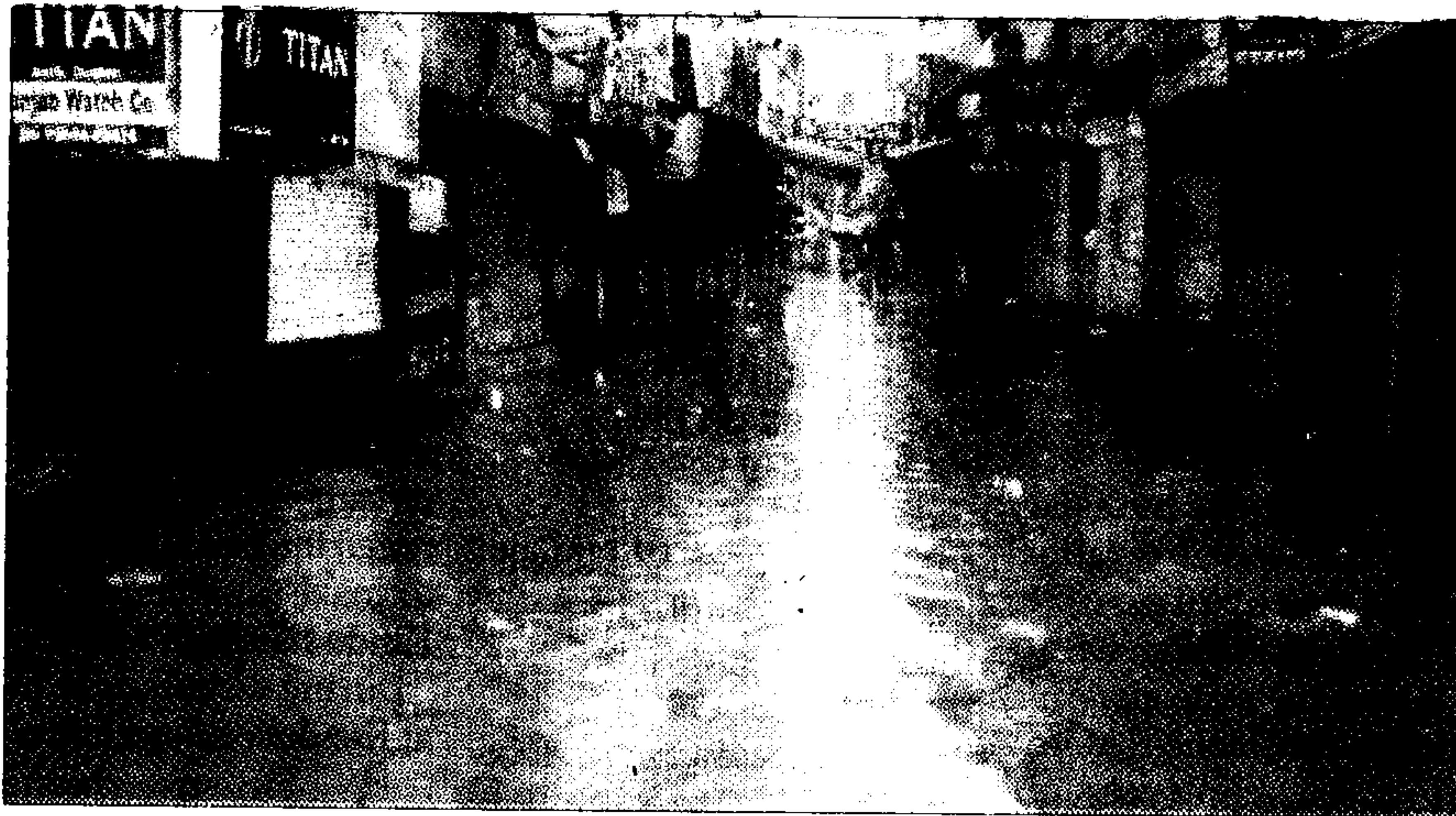

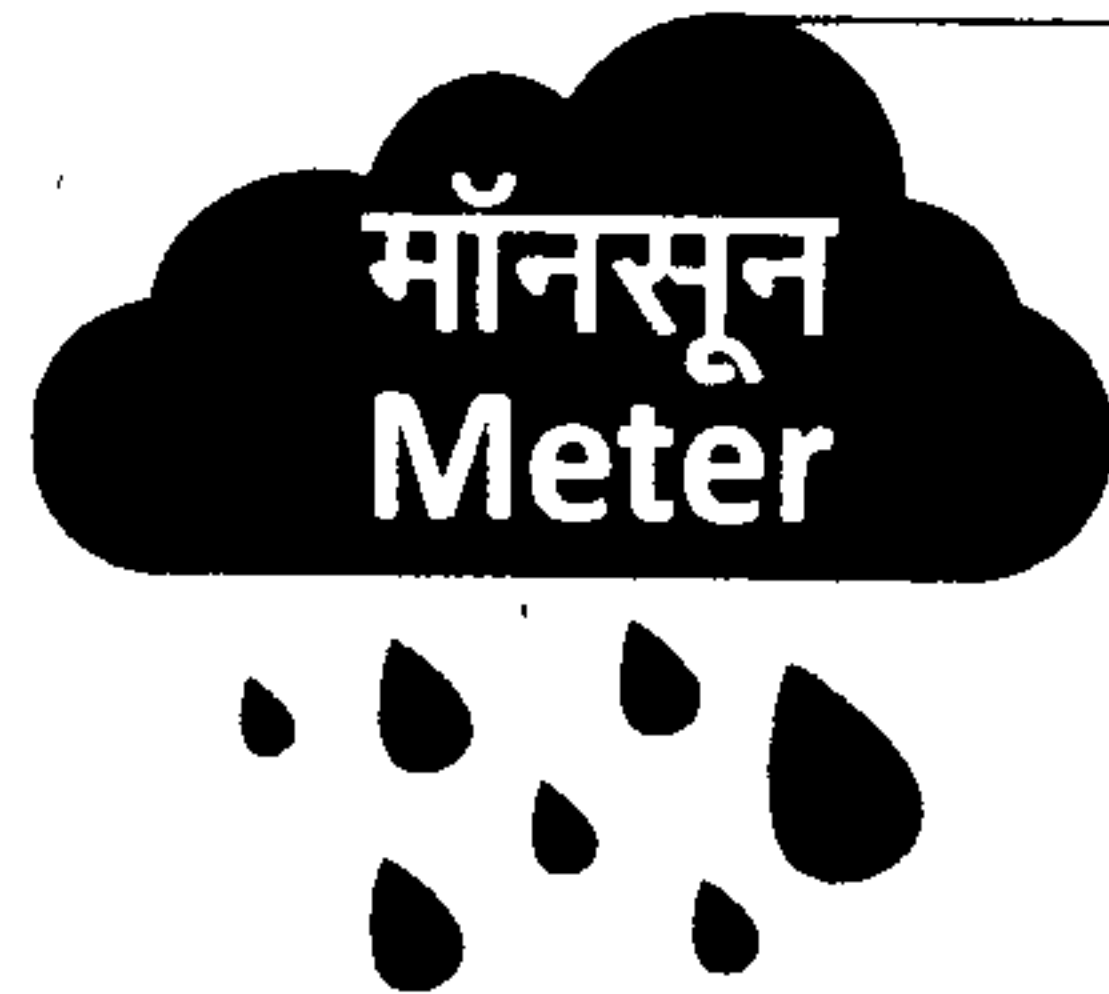

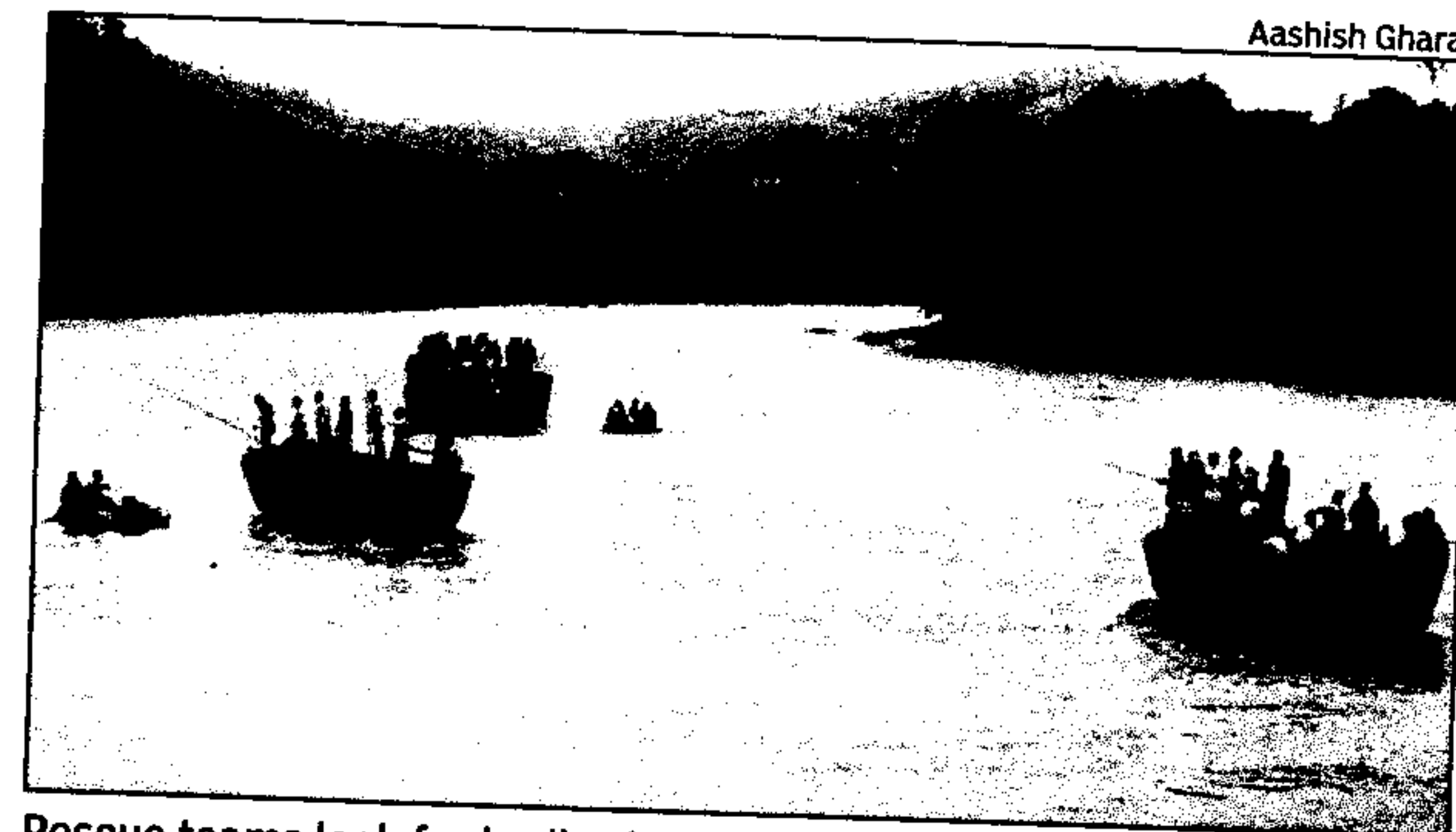
MIDC refuses to shut backwater dam gate of river for search ops

Mumbai: The MIDC authorities refused to close the backwater dam gate of Savitri river for two days claiming that it would put pressure on the gates and flood the nearby villages.

The Raigad district administration had asked the MIDC to shut the gates so that the rescue teams could access the inaccessible areas of the river near the collapsed Mahad bridge.

"The MIDC-built backwater dam is on upstream Savitri river, 15km from Mahad bridge. Closure of the gate will wash away the bund due to water pressure and flood a few villages. We do not want to take a risk...MIDC officials have told us that it is not possible to close

the dam," said Mahad sub-divisional officer Sushma Satpute.

NDRF 5th Battalion Pune Commandant Anupam Srivastava said, "The district administration was approached to shut the gates of the backwater

dam for two days. Reduction in water flow will allow us carry out search operation in the 150m inaccessible portion close to the bridge." No body was found in the river during the search operations on Wednesday.

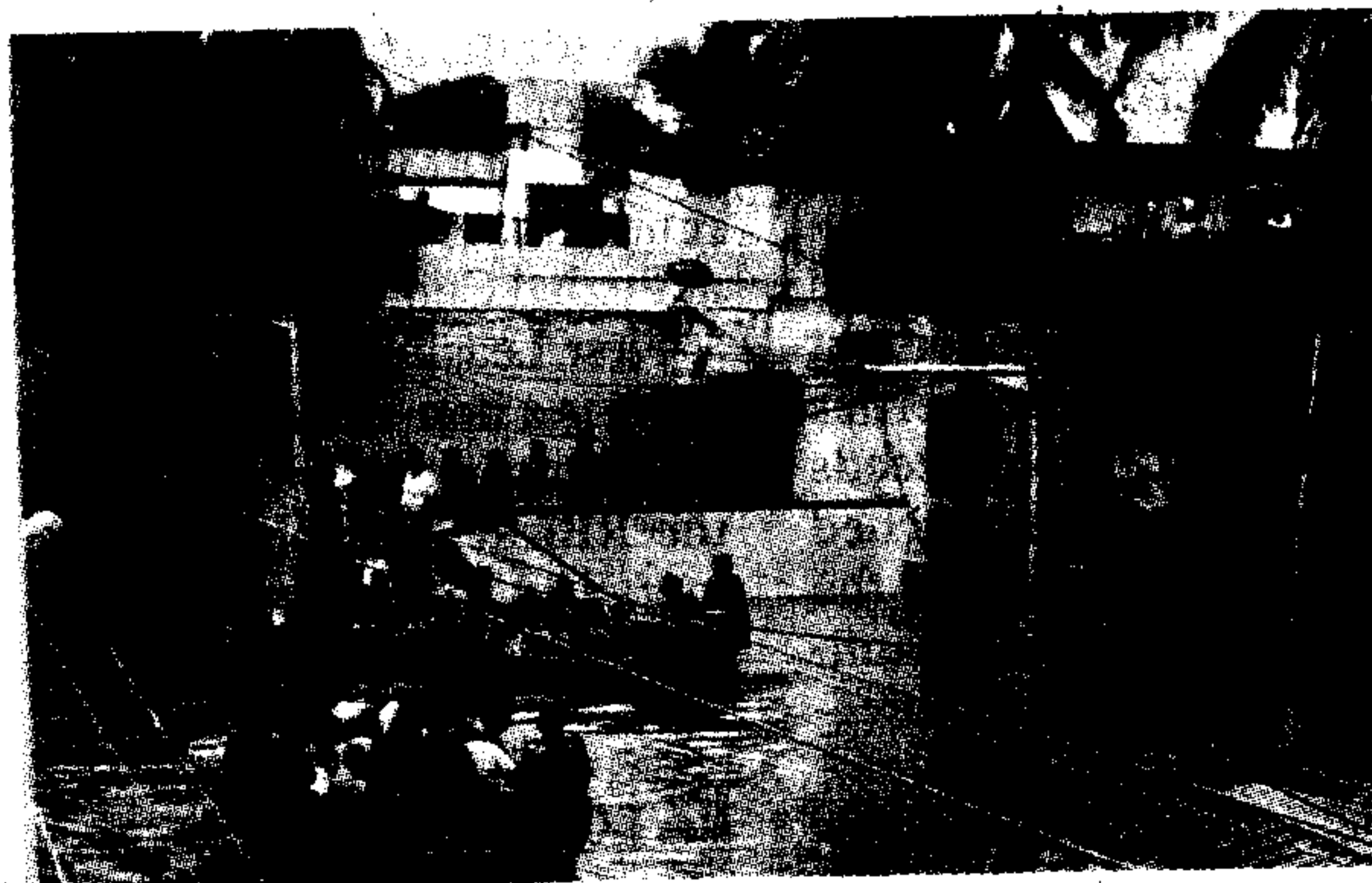

CHENNAI: Rejecting the allegation of the DMK that release of water from Chembarambakkam caused flooding in Chennai in December last, Revenue Minister R.B. Udayakumar told the Assembly that granting pattas to encroachers of waterbodies was the real cause of the problem.

"All norms were thrown to wind and rules violated when the DMK government implemented the one-time regularisation scheme under which pattas were granted. Even income limit was not followed in identifying the beneficiaries," Mr. Udayakumar alleged.

Intervening during a debate on demands for grants for social welfare, Mr. Udayakumar said that though only those who had lived 10 years on poramboke land were eligible for pattas, the period was subsequently reduced to five

years and then to three.

“It is done only to benefit those who are close to the DMK. Encroachers of waterbodies were also granted pattas and it caused flooding during monsoon,” he said. Finance Minister O. Panneerselvam and Highways Minister Edappadi K. Palanisamy also cited examples to reiterate that encroachments on waterbo-

dies were to be blamed for the flooding.

“Even in my constituency, pattas were issued to encroachers of a lake who had constructed houses in the middle of the waterbody,” he said, pointing out that the Supreme Court had to intervene and stopped granting pattas to encroachers of waterbodies. Mr. Palanisamy said that

over 1,800 pattas were issued to encroachers of a waterbody in Tiruvallur.

When former Revenue Minister I. Periyasamy was allowed to explain the DMK government's stand, he said that the 10-year period was reduced to five years and three years following a demand from members of the Assembly. "The flood was caused by the release of water from Chembarambakam," he said.

However, Mr. Udayakumar said the erstwhile DMK government was behind the demand for reducing the period and ordinary people were not benefitted from the scheme.

At this juncture, Fisheries Minister D. Jayakumar said that a piece of land used as graveyard was given to a relative of former Minister K.P.P. Samy, who vehemently rejected the allegation. "Let the Minister submit proof for his allegation," he said.
