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Island formation in Ganga hits navigation

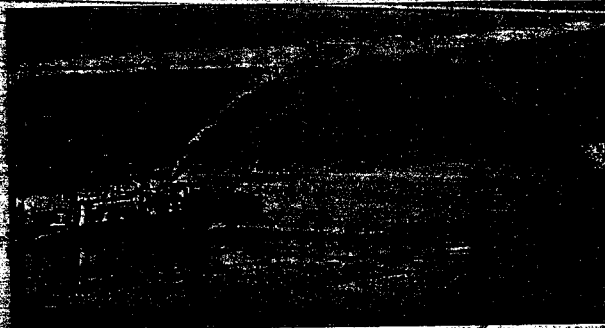

BHAGALPUR: With the Ganga drifting northwards and the emergence of a huge sand bar right in the middle of the stream, river navigation has been affected as also the water supply to the Silk City from its Barai Water Works.

Officials here say that immediate dredging operations are needed over 1,700m to provide water depth for bigger ships to sail under the Vikramshila Bridge, but operations have been slow.

The Bhagalpur stretch of the Ganga is a vital cog in the stretch declared National Waterway no 1. Massive work worth 6,000 crore and with the assistance of the World Bank is already under way to facilitate navigation along the 1,800 km stretch.

The work includes development of three multi-modal hubs at Varanasi in Uttar Pradesh, Haldia in West Bengal, and Sahebganj in Jharkhand, the last

project being just 60km east of Bhagalpur, under a plan unveiled by Nitin Gadkari, Union minister for transport.

The Inland Waterways Authority of India (IWAI), under the shipping ministry, is also conducting these operations on the stretch from Kolkata to Varanasi in collaboration with private cruise operators.

IWAI officials here said the river has abandoned its original course and in certain areas huge

sand bars have formed and are proving to be impediments in navigation. A large island has formed in the river, following sharp reduction in water and the shallow areas present difficulties in the way of dredging.

The Ganga's mainstream, earlier flowing due to the south bank along Bhagalpur, located 240km east of Patna, has now shifted course in a northward loop to flow along Naugachhia near Khagaria district. This has

reduced water in ship pathways on the southern side.

In order to ensure sufficient flow of water in the channel, the IWAI now aims to dig a pilot channel by undertaking dredging work.

Prashant Kumar, deputy director, IWAI sub-office at Sahebganj in Jharkhand, said though it is now nearly a month since work was initiated, only about 700m could be cleared.

Kumar said that due to insufficient horizontal and vertical clearance below the northern arches of the bridge, linking north to south Bihar, and the increasing water level, it is often risky for bigger tourist and cargo vessels to navigate through the northern arches.

The shift of the river has also cut water supply to the localities of the city from the Barai Water Works, making it necessary that the dredging bring back the water channel closer to town through a pilot channel for water harvesting purposes.

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Ruckus in Odisha Assembly over Mahanadi, farmers' issues

The Odisha Assembly on Monday witnessed repeated adjournments after question hour as members of the ruling BJD and the Opposition Congress and the BJP created pandemonium over the Mahanadi and farmers' issues.

Speaker Pradip Kumar Amat, however, managed to pass the supplementary budget of 39 departments through guillotine amid the din prevailing in the House.

After question hour, the BJP members raised the

farmers' issue and stormed into the well of the House demanding loan waiver. They shouted slogans against the BJD government and termed it "anti-farmer".

Pest attack

The farmers of the State are badly affected as the kharif crop has been hit by drought, pest attack and unseasonal rain.

The BJD members, on the other hand, raised the Mahanadi issue and accused the Centre of being partisan.

They alleged that the

Centre was supporting the BJP-ruled Chhattisgarh which was constructing projects upstream of the Mahanadi river "illegally".

Odisha has been opposing construction of a number of barrages and dams by Chhattisgarh on the upper reaches of the Mahanadi river, saying it would affect the State's farmers.

The Centre had told the Supreme Court on December 6 that the ongoing dispute between Odisha and Chhattisgarh over the Mahanadi should be sorted out

through negotiations between the parties concerned.

Sanjay Dasburma of the BJD claimed that the Chhattisgarh government has planned river interlinking to draw more water from the Mahanadi and, in that case, Odisha would soon go dry.

Amid the heated exchange of words between members of the two parties, the Speaker adjourned the House till 3 p.m.

When the House reassembled, Leader of the Opposition Narasingha Mishra of the Congress sought a ruling

from the Speaker on the alleged exploitation of paddy farmers at government mandis.

Explanation sought

Mr. Mishra said the Agriculture Minister should clarify in the House as to why the government mandis deduct about 5 kg on each 100 kg of paddy being sold by farmers.

As the Speaker proceeded with other business, the Congress MLAs rushed to the well and raised anti-government slogans alleging distress sale of paddy by

farmers.

While the BJP members also joined the Congress MLAs, the treasury bench members again raised the Mahanadi issue creating a ruckus and the Speaker adjourned the House till 4.28 p.m.

When the House reassembled, a similar scene was recreated by the Opposition members.

However, the Speaker managed to pass the additional expenditure statement of 39 departments through guillotine and adjourned the House till tomorrow.

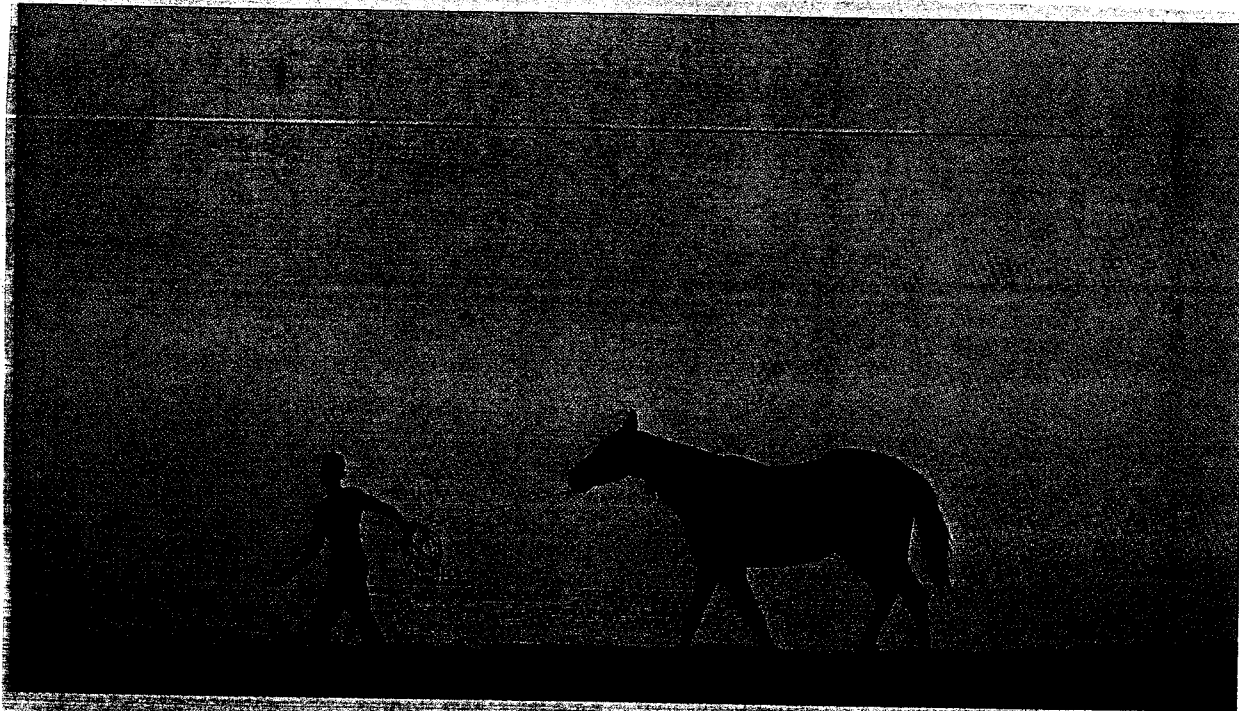

Rain cheers wheat growers

Experts say dip in mercury after a spell of shower will boost yield

With rain lashing different parts of the region, farmers who have sown wheat in time are a happy lot. The rain coupled with a dip in mercury is beneficial for the crop. But a heavy spell may be damaging for those who have recently sown their crop.

Talking to *The Tribune*, Gurditta Singh Sidhu, Chief Agriculture Officer, Bathinda, said the rainfall would facilitate light irrigation of the crop, which would benefit

it immensely. It would lead to better growth of the crop and result in a good yield. He said a further decline in the temperature over the next one month would be great for the wheat crop.

The officer said the crop sown around a fortnight back would witness proper tillering in the aftermath of the rain. He, however, cautioned that heavy rains might take a toll on the germination process, particularly if someone had sown the crop three to four days ago.

Darshan Singh, a farmer from Gehri Bhagi village, said

he was apprehensive of the losses, as he got late in sowing the crop. "It has been hardly a week since I had sown wheat crop in my field. Now, I am just keeping my fingers crossed that the rainfall doesn't affect its growth," he added.

Mithu Singh, another farmer, lamented that he was yet to sow the crop and now with the rainfall, sowing would be further delayed. He said a section of farmers in their village who could not harvest their cotton crop due to labour issues and other such factors might also suf-

fer losses due to the rain.

Meanwhile, the daily arrival of cotton in the region's markets might see a dip. Former North India Cotton Association president Ashok Kapur said the markets were almost shut today due to the rain, adding that the prices might go up slightly.

He said it would be temporary and things would be normal once the weather cleared. He ruled out any losses to cotton crop, as the harvesting was almost over in the region and the farmers were now busy with their wheat

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Snow, rain in Kashmir end dry spell

Major highways blocked in region, downpour to continue, says Met

A four-month-long dry spell came to an end today as snow fall and rain lashed the Kashmir valley. Though all major highways were blocked, the precipitation revived hopes of the tourism industry of interest to begin.

The region's tourism industry, which had a tough year so far, had been waiting eagerly for the snow to attract holidaymakers and adventure tourists seeking thrill on the king slopes of Gulmarg. The rain and snow fall began overnight across the valley and continued with a few pauses for almost 20 hours. The forecast issued by the Meteorological Department said the downpour would further continue for the next two days.

ONE KILLED IN KASHI LANDSLIDE

Normal life was on Monday, after a day of meteorological weather across the Kashi region. After a rain and snow fall, the long dry spell and plummeting temperatures led to several tragedies. Control Room said all three roads leading in and out of the valley had been blocked and vehicular traffic had stopped. The official said the Srinagar-Jammu highway, Srinagar-Leh highway and Mughal Road had been closed for all vehicular traffic due to snow and rain along the route, which had made these mountainous stretches risky for driving.

The officials said the Srinagar-Leh highway and Mughal Road, which provide connectivity between Kashmir and Jammu, would now remain closed till April next year. The suspension of road connectivity has come at a time when many hilly areas of the region have witnessed the season's first rain, marking the beginning of winter.

ly winter. The snowfall was received at Gulmarg in north Kashmir. Srinagar, in central Kashmir and peripheral areas of south Kashmir along Mughal Road.

Srinagar, the state's summer capital, received moderate rainfall throughout the day and throughout the night.

The state government has put its men and machinery on alert in the wake of the weather advisory and asked key departments to ensure speedy snow clearance and de-watering.

The Meteorological Department said moderate rain and snow would occur at most places over the state tomorrow followed by a decline in intensity and spread of precipitation. The department, however, warned of heavy snow and rain in the region.

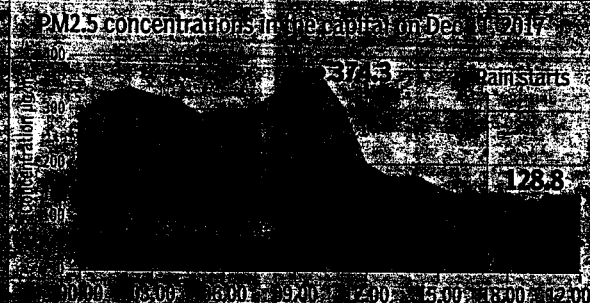

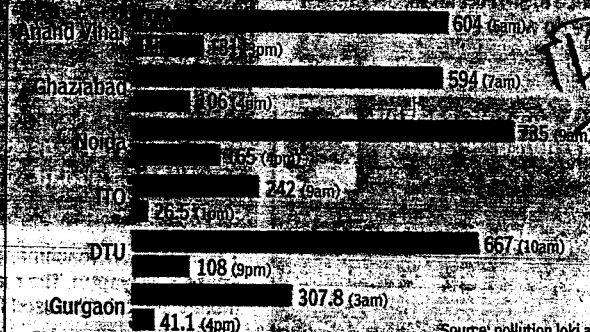

AFTER FOUR consecutive days of 'very poor' air quality, light rain and strong wind on Monday evening brought down temperature and pollution levels in the city.

Rain and vehicle breakdowns also led to traffic jams across the city, with the Delhi Traffic Police's Twitter handle receiving complaints from ISBT, Janpath,

Vasant Kunj and Akshardham.

At India Gate, PM2.5 concentration was 415 µg/m3 at 2.30 pm. It dipped to 168 µg/m3 at 8.30 pm. At Anand Vihar, particulate matter was recorded at 505 µg/m3 at 11 am. This dipped to 176 µg/m3 by 8.30 pm. The prescribed standard for the pollutant is 60 µg/m3.

Officials at the India Meteorological Department said light rain is expected on Tuesday as well. While the maximum temperature was recorded at

24.2 degrees Celsius, a degree above normal, the minimum was recorded at 8.2 degrees Celsius, a degree below normal.

IMD officials said an overcast sky on Tuesday is expected to push the minimum temperature to 10 degrees Celsius, while the maximum is expected to be 23 degrees Celsius.

According to the CPCB national air quality index, Delhi's air quality was 361 (very poor) at 4 pm. Rain started across the capital around 6 pm.

काशी में गंगा इस बार सर्दियों में घाट छोड़ने लगी

गंगा के जलस्तर में कमी आमतौर पर गर्मी के मौसम में होती है लेकिन इस वर्ष सर्दी में ही गंगा घाटों से दूर होने लगी है। भीमगोड़ा बांध और हरिद्वार से दिल्ली को पेयजल देने के लिए भारी मात्रा में गंगा के जल का दोहन भी काशी में गंगा के जलस्तर में कमी का प्रमुख

कारण है। साथ ही बारिश-बाढ़ में कमी और दिन दूनी रात चौगुनी बढ़ती रेत के कारण काशी में गंगा घाटों से दूर होने लगी है। न्यू अस्सी घाट पर इस दूरी का एहसास सहज रूप से किया जा सकता है। यहाँ गंगा का जल किनारे से काफी दूर हो गया है। करीब तीन वर्ष पूर्व प्रधानमंत्री मोदी ने जिस स्थान से स्वच्छता अभियान की शुरुआत की थी, उस समय वहाँ से गंगा का जल मात्र तीन मीटर की दूरी पर था अब वहाँ से गंगा करीब 12 मीटर दूर जा चुकी है। यही नहीं केदार घाट से मणिकर्णिका घाट के बीच गंगा के जल की जो स्थिति

गर्मी के मौसम में होती थी वह हालत इस साल सर्दी में दिखने लगी है।

नदी विज्ञानी डा. यूके. चौधरी ने के मुताबिक भीमगोड़ा से 10,600 क्यूबिक फुट गंगा जल प्रतिसेकेंड निकाल लिया जा रहा है। यहाँ से बचा हुआ गंगा जल आगे हरिद्वार से दिल्ली की ओर मोड़ दिया जा रहा है। दिल्ली को पीने का पानी उपलब्ध कराने के लिए प्रति सेकेंड 4000 क्यूबिक फुट गंगा जल निकाल लिया जा रहा है। बचा गंगा जल कैनालों के माध्यम से कृषि भूमि की सिंचाई के लिए निकाल लिया जा रहा है।

ये कारण भी हैं

काशी में गंगा के जलस्तर में कमी का एक प्रमुख कारण कछुआ सेंचुरी के कारण रेत का उठव न होना भी है। सामनेघाट से आदिकेशवघाट तक घोषित है कछुआ सेंचुरी। इसके चलते सात किमी की दूरी में बालू के खनन पर रोक लगी है। पहले ही गंगा में जल की कमी के कारण प्रवाह मंद पड़ गया है ऊपर से दैत्याकार होती जा रही रेत काफी जल अवशोषित कर रही है। एक साल पहले नमामि गंगे एवं गंगा मंत्रालय की मंत्री रही उमा भारती ने कछुआ सेंचुरी हटाने का भरोसा दिया था पर अब तक नहीं हटा। विशेषज्ञों के मुताबिक टिहरी बांध से बिजली निर्माण के नाम पर गंगा का 60% जल रोक दिया गया है।

गंगा पार की रेत और हरियाली के बीच एक नई धारा बनने लगी है। बाढ़ में यह साफ-साफ दिखाई देती है। रामनगर से गंगा की एक धारा कट कर रेत के पार हरियाली की ओर मुड़ जाती है जो गायघाट के सामने पुनः गंगा की मूल धारा में मिलती है। रामनगर से गायघाट के बीच रेत का हिस्सा टापू में तब्दील हो जाता है।

और बेहतर प्रदर्शन करने के अलावा कोई दूसरा विकल्प नहीं है। वह जल संसाधन मंत्रालय से जुड़े उक्त संस्थानों के वास्तविक कामकाज को देखेंगे। इस संदर्भ में केवल पुस्तकें या शोधपत्र प्रकाशित करना पर्याप्त नहीं होगा। जनोन्मेष के माध्यम से जल संरक्षण के सस्ते उपाय खोजने होंगे। अर्थव्यवस्था के लिए यह जरूरी है। हमें ऐसी सोच से ऊपर उठना होगा जो मतभेद, बहस व केवल चर्चा तक सीमित रह जाती है।
