Rain, snow bring chill back in Valley ^{T-15}

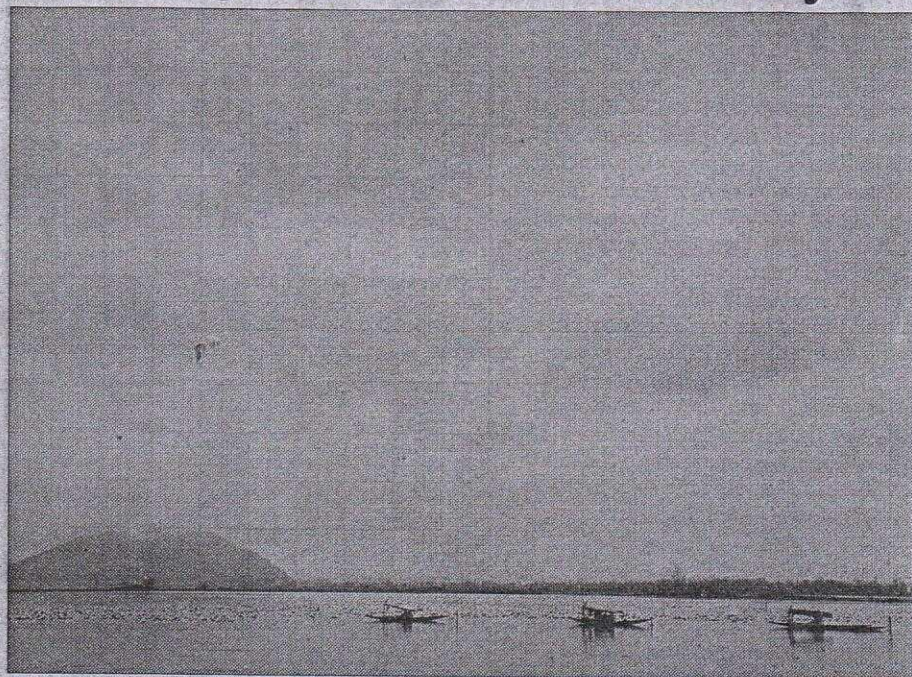
Moderate rain in most parts of the Kashmir valley and snow in the higher reaches today brought the day temperature significantly down in the region.

An official of the Srinagar Meteorological Centre said snow was received in the higher reaches of Gulmarg in north Kashmir and at Sonmarg and Zojila in central Kashmir.

Most parts of the Valley, including Srinagar, the state's summer capital, received rain, the official of the meteorological centre said.

The moderate-intensity rain and snow was caused by a fresh western disturbance system since Tuesday evening.

According to the forecast bulletin issued by Indian Meteorological Department, the western disturbance was feeble and had

lost the intensity to cause further downpour.

The Srinagar Meteorological Centre, in its forecast

bulletin, said there was a possibility of light rain and snow in the city tomorrow.

The temperature in the

region over the past week had been significantly higher and had increased five or six degrees above average.

ational Green Tribunal
Wednesday directed the
secretary of Uttarakhand
ent himself before it and
the steps taken by the

authorities to clean the Ganga
in the stretch between Go-
mukh and Haridwar.

The officer has been asked to
appear before the green panel
on April 3.

Dissatisfied with the supple-

mentary compliance report
submitted by the State, the
Bench headed by judicial mem-
ber Jawad Rahim held the re-
port to be "factually incorrect"
and asked the senior officer to
be present before the tribunal

and provide the exact details.

The NGT has further direct-
ed Uttarakhand to re-examine
the matter with along with the
senior officers and provide a
statement with respect to the
compliance of the previous

orders.

The directions came after
advocate M.C. Mehta submit-
ted that there were deficiencies
in the compliance report sub-
mitted by the State and that it
did not clearly state whether

the earlier directions of the tri-
bunal had been complied with.

The NGT had earlier, in a de-
tailed judgement, declared a
"No Development Zone" with-
in 100 metres from the edge of
the river.

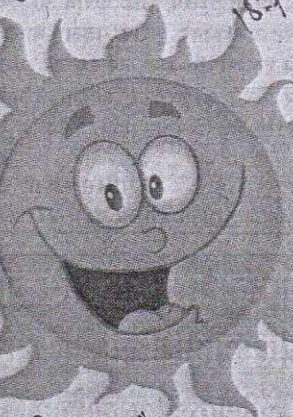

आठ साल में सबसे गर्म रहा 14 मार्च का दिन

नई दिल्ली, (पंजाब केसरी): 14 मार्च को अधिकतम तापमान आठ वर्षों में सबसे अधिक दर्ज किया गया। वर्ष 2011 से अभी तक के आंकड़ों के अनुसार अधिकतम तापमान सबसे ज्यादा रहा। हालांकि गुरुवार को संभावना जताई जा रही है कि धूलभरी आंधी आने और बादल छाए रहने से अधिकतम तापमान में गिरावट दर्ज की जाएगी।

अभी मंगलवार को ही इस माह का सबसे अधिकतम तापमान 36.2 डिग्री सेल्सियस दर्ज किया गया था। इसके बाद बुधवार को राहत तो मिली, लेकिन 14 मार्च के दिन का तापमान विगत वर्षों के मुकाबले

सबसे अधिक रहा। राजधानी में बुधवार को



अधिकतम और न्यूनतम तापमान 34.1 और 17 डिग्री

सेल्सियस दर्ज किया गया। अधिकतम तापमान सामान्य से पांच डिग्री, जबकि न्यूनतम तापमान दो डिग्री अधिक रहा। गुरुवार को भी तापमान 33 व 16 डिग्री रहने का अनुमान है।

वहीं मौसम विभाग की माने तो गुरुवार को धूलभरी आंधी आने या गर्जन की संभावना है। आसमान में आंशिक रूप से बादल छाए रहेंगे। पश्चिमी हिमालय के क्षेत्र में भी कहीं-कहीं वर्षा और हिमपात होने के आसार बन रहे हैं। हालांकि अगले कुछ दिनों तक अधिकतम और न्यूनतम तापमान 35 और 18 डिग्री तक बना रहेगा। दिल्ली के दूसरे केन्द्रों पर पालम 34.4 व 19.8, लोधी रोड
