

37 killed as heavy rains lash parts of Rajasthan and MP

JAIPUR/BHOPAL: Heavy rainfall lashed many parts of northern India over the last 72 hours, killing 28 people in Madhya Pradesh and nine in Rajasthan.

A house collapsed at Rahatgarh in Madhya Pradesh's Sagar district on Friday night, burying alive seven members of a family and injuring three. While house owner Mehtab Silawat was injured in the incident, the rest of the family – comprising his wife, daughter, three sons, son-in-law and granddaughter – perished. Local residents helped police retrieve the bodies from the rubble.

Three others were killed the same day, when a car was washed away at Buxwaha town in Chattarpur. According to police, the incident occurred while the car was trying to cross a flooded culvert. Three of the six passengers reportedly swam to safety, but the others drowned. Two bodies have been recovered, said Buxwaha town inspector SP Sisodia.

In another incident, a three-storeyed building collapsed at Maihar town in Madhya Pradesh's rain-ravaged Satna district on Saturday morning – killing two. Though six people have been rescued, many others were still feared trapped in the rubble.

The deceased were identified as 40-year-old Babloo Martin, a district-level cricketer, and 50-year-old Rani Gupta. As police personnel were not immediately available, local residents had to rush to the rescue of the trapped people.

Sixteen additional casualties were reported from other districts during this period, information for which is still being collated. However, the state government has confirmed only 15 deaths – marking the rest as 'missing'. The situation was similar in Rajasthan, with nine casualties being reported from Baran district alone. Choppers and boats were used to rescue around 40 people stranded in flooded localities.

Baran district collector Dr SP Singh said the areas under his jurisdiction received around 200 mm of rainfall, causing rivers to overflow and flood adjoining areas.

Rescue teams comprising army personnel, the Rajasthan Armed Constabulary and local residents were deployed to rescue stranded people.

Ganga in spate, Patna braces for the worst

PATNA/SASARAM: Bihar's capital Patna is facing the gravest of flood threats since 1975, with the rising Ganga river entering parts of the city.

The district administration has sounded an alert for people living on the edge of the city's northern embankment of Ganga and the protective embankment against Punpun in Pahari areas to Patna's south.

Water has entered central Patna at LCT Ghat and Gandhi Ghat, even as CM Nitish Kumar ordered the water resources department to take protective measures.

WRD officials said reinforcing of an anti-flood protective wall would need more time and money. They said trucks of sand and boulders had been placed at critical points but time was a crucial factor in the fight to stop the Ganga.

Officials said a sudden discharge from the Bansagar reservoir in Madhya Pradesh has flooded the Sone river entering Bihar in Rohtas district, some 200 kms south of the capital.

Officials said the Ganga is

poised to break the highest watermark level of 50.7 metres registered in 1994 as it was flowing just 7 cms below that mark.

Two columns of the state disaster relief force and one from the National Disaster Response Force have been deployed for evacuation.

14 dead in UP as houses collapse under heavy rain

LUCKNOW: As many as 14 people died in Uttar Pradesh in the past 24 hours as houses collapsed under heavy rainfall and various areas witnessed flooding.

The normally arid Bundelkhand region and other districts located on the banks of the Ganga were staring at a flood threat. Different regions in Allahabad, Varanasi, Ghazipur and Ballia districts were flooded as the Ganga flowed above the danger mark.

IAF drops food packets, medicines in flooded areas

JAIPUR/NEW DELHI: As many as 23 people were killed on Saturday in rain-related incidents in Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan, even as rivers continued to be in spate in Bihar.

Fifteen deaths were reported in Madhya Pradesh since Friday evening as the Met department predicted more showers and sounded heavy downpour alert for some districts on Sunday.

Three Indian Air Force aircraft dropped food packets and medicines in flooded areas of Rewa district, District Collector Rahul Jain said.

Seven people, including a woman and four minors, were killed and three others injured when a house collapsed early on Saturday in Rahatgarh area of Sagar district.

Two people, including an old woman, were also killed and seven injured when a newly constructed building collapsed amid incessant rain at Maihar in Satna district. A jeep carrying two persons was swept away in the swollen Betwa river as it tried to cross a bridge in Raisen district.

The Army was called in to the flood-affected areas of Baran district as senior officials also rushed to the spot.

At least 24 people were airlifted in Baran district and nearby areas. Several villages remained inundated after water entered buildings, houses and a private power plant in Baran.

Meanwhile, two youths were reportedly swept away by strong currents in the Balapura Dam near Chipabarode town of Baran district. However, one of them was rescued later. — PTI

Ganga breaches danger mark in UP, Bihar

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 21

The Ganga today crossed the danger mark in West Bengal, Bihar and neighbouring districts of UP where the Yamuna is also in spate, while heavy rainfall has created a flood-like situation in some parts of Rajasthan, where six persons have died so far.

However, the weather was hot and dry in Delhi, Punjab and Haryana.

In Bihar, the National and State Disaster Response Force has been deployed and the Army put on alert as the rising water level of the Ganga has created a flood-like situation in all districts situated along its banks.

The Ganga and six other rivers were flowing above danger mark in Patna, Bhagalpur, Khagaria, Katihar, Siwan, Bhojpur, Buxar and Hajipur districts, a disaster management department statement said.

Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar today expressed apprehension of further rise in the water level in view of release of water from the Bansagar dam. Nitish, who held a high-level meeting to assess the situation, later undertook an aerial survey of Saran, Bhojpur, Patna, Vaishali, Begusarai and Khagaria. He said there was, at the moment, no possibility of flood waters entering Patna.

In UP, the Ganga is flowing above the danger mark at Fafamau (Allahabad), Mirzapur, Varanasi, Ghazipur and Ballia, while the Yamuna is flowing above the red mark at Chillaghat (Banda), Naini (Allahabad) and Mohna (Jalaun). Vast areas in several villages of Malda district in West Bengal have submerged. — PTI





Rain fury: 8 killed in R'sthan, alert in Patna

Many districts in Bihar stare at floods

Ganga, 4 other rivers flow above danger mark; NDRF teams on standby

NEW DELHI: An alert was sounded as the threat of floods returned in Bihar with the Ganga and four other rivers flowing above the danger mark.

The districts of Bihar, situated on the banks of the Ganga, were put on alert as the Central Water Commission on Friday warned Ganga basin districts that the river may witness a rise in water level in the next one to five days.

Due to the increase in the water level of the Ganga, water has reportedly entered into the riverine areas of the districts like Patna, Buxar, Bhojpur, Munger, Saran, Vaishali, Bhagalpur and Samastipur, a Disaster Management Department statement said.

National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) teams, have already taken positions in Patna, Vaishali and Gopalganj while State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) teams have been put on alert in Patna and Bhagalpur, it said.

Maximum temperatures hovered between one degree Celsius above normal to three notches above normal in most parts of Punjab and Haryana, the MeT office said.

Ambala and Hisar settled at an identical high of 36.7 degrees Celsius, three notches

Besides NDRF, SDRF teams have also been alerted as water levels were expected to rise in one to five days.

each above normal. While Patiala had a high of 36.5 degrees Celsius, three notches above normal, the maximum at Amritsar was 36.4 degrees Celsius, two notches above normal.

Chandigarh and Ludhiana settled at an identical high of 35.5 degrees Celsius each, three and two notches respectively above normal.

The MeT department forecast light to moderate rainfall at few places in the region during the next 48 hours.

It was a sultry day in Delhi with high humidity levels troubling Delhiites even as mercury settled at normal levels.

The maximum and minimum temperatures settled at 34.4 and 26.4 degrees Celsius, both normal for this time of the year," a MeT official said.

The three other metropolitan cities - Kolkata, Chennai and Mumbai recorded maximum temperatures of 33.1, 38.4, and 30.7 degrees Celsius respectively.

Irked has filed the plea for cleaning at the non-compliance of its directions, the NGT granted "final opportunity" of two weeks to all authorities, ministries and Uttar Pradesh government to submit the requisite information and warned that in case of default, it would impose a cost of Rs 25,000 on each of the Secretary concerned.

Nothing substantial has also been done in regard to the source of finance for the river cleansing project, the possibility of applying Zero Liquid Discharge (waste water purification) to various types of industries and installation of online monitoring system for all industries along the river banks, it said. Advocate MC Mehta, who

of Ganga, said the river will never be clean unless the state governmentd and its agencies come out with clear data on the industries.

He referred to various Supreme Court judgement on Ganga since 1987 and said the authorities have allowed the mushrooming of several industrial which were openly discharging effluents in the river.

BID TO CURB MUSHROOMING OF ILLEGAL COLONIES

Tangri riverbed to be notified

A 7-km stretch from Boh village to Ghasitpur will be notified to keep a check on the mushrooming of illegal colonies on the Tangri riverbed. The Irrigation Department has moved a file to the government for the notification of the riverbed.

As per the information provided by the department, nearly 7-km stretch (from Boh village to Ghasitpur) and the entire width of the riverbed between the 'bandh' has been included for the notification.

Tangri is a seasonal river and residents of colonies located on the riverbed in Ambala Cantonment.

The colonies on the riverbed are illegal, yet construction goes on without any regard to safety. Because of the illegal colonies, the river has shrunk and it poses a danger to the people residing there. More than 1,700 families reside on the riverbed.

This year, the administration had put up notices in the colonies built on the riverbed, asking residents to vacate their houses and shift to safer

places. While the administration calls the colonies illegal, residents are miffed at the situation and claim they had been issued water and electricity connections. 
Lake breaches in Arkalgud taluk

Reduction in forest area has led to deficit rainfall, says IISc study

BENGALURU: The state has received deficit rainfall this season. This is not just because of global warming and el Nino effect, but also because of change in land use, especially reduction of forest cover.

A recent study by researchers from the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) titled "Time-Series Modis Normalised Difference Vegetation Index (NDVI) based vegetation change analysis with land surface temperature and rainfall in Western Ghats, India" shows that because of change in landscape of north, central and southern Western Ghats, there is a decline in rainfall trend, which is also having an adverse impact on the food and water security.

The study, conducted by Prof T V Ramachandra, Centre for Ecological Sciences, IISc along with Uttam Kumar and Anandita Dasgupta, showed that the dense forest areas in the northern, central and southern Western Ghats have decreased by 2.84%, 4.38% and 5.77% respectively and agricultural or grasslands have increased by 2.23%, 4.32% and 5.85%.

The rainfall time-series data also showed a decreasing trend in the rainfall pattern from 2013 towards 2020 in the northern, central and southern Western Ghats, revealing a grave situation threatening water and food security in peninsular India with an increasing trend of deforestation. Also,



the number of rainy days had curity.

The study, conducted by Prof decreased in the southern

W.Ramachandra Centre for Western Ghats region.

The trends in rainfall timeseries data were analysed using statistical methods and modelled using auto-regressive integrated moving average (ARI-MA) which indicated a decreasing trend in the rainfall pattern, Ramachandra said.

There is also a marginal increase in human settlement or soil area and small decrease in the spatial extent of water bodies in all the three regions. The study also revealed that the temperature in dense forests has always been less than in agricultural or grassland areas in all the three seasons.

"We focused on vegetation data to investigate the distribu-

tion of land surface temperature and rainfall because the existing vegetation distribution is largely controlled by temperature and precipitation pattern. Monthly climatic changes and trends of the last 10 years provided a clear illustration of the NDVI trends," he said.

Differences in NDVI-temperature and NDVI-precipitation correlations relative to vegetation types such as forest and agriculture or grassland were also investigated. This result supports and is of similar magnitude as temporal studies showing increase of NDVI corresponding to increase in growing season temperature over the length of the satellite record, Ramachandra added.

Seven dead in U'khand flash flood

Dehradun/Patna, 21 August

Seven people lost their lives in an incident of cloud burst in village Markhola of Pauri district of Uttarakhand. The deceased are all members of a single family whose house was washed away.

Deepak Singh (75) lived with the families of his sons Chandan Singh and late Mangal Singh in two separate portions of the house in village Markhola of Pauri.

On Saturday night the sudden flash flood washed away the house. Deepak Singh and his youngest grandson who had gone to take a look at the flooding of a nearby stream, and Chandan Singh, who was not at home, were the only survivors.

Villagers informed the district administration and a team led by SDM P L Sharma was sent for the rescue. Seven dead bodies were recovered in the rescue operation.

Meanwhile, the continued rise in level of the Ganga, the flood situation continued to prevailed in Bihar, with all the districts situated along the banks of the river in the state badly affected.

The Ganga and six other rivers were flowing above danger mark in Patna, Bhagalpur, Khagaria, Katihar, Siwan, Bhojpur, Buxar and Hajipur districts, a disaster management department statement said.

The worst affected districts are Patna, Vaishali, Buxar, Bhojpur, Saran,

Begusarai, Samastipur, Lakhisarai, Khagaria, Munger, Bhagalpur and Katihar, the department statement said.

Around 15,000 people are sheltered in 82 relief camps after being evacuated from flood affected areas, it said.

Monsoon fury rages in north, MP toll rises to 30

Lucknow/Jaipur/Bhopal: Incessant rains heaped misery and threw life out of gear in various parts of Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan on Sunday. A woman died in a wall collapse taking the toll to 30 in the last 48 hours in MP, while army teams had to be deployed in Rajasthan. In UP, rising levels of the Ganga overflowed into villages.

The swollen Tamsa river wreaked havoc in MP's Satna and Rewa districts. A day after a three-storeyed building crumbled at Maihar town in Satna district killing two, another house collapsed due to heavy rains in Narsinghpur district, 220 km from Bhopal, injuring a woman. Another died after being trapped under debris of a wall, which collapsed in Rajgarh district.

"We are on high alert though rains are a drizzle now. Hinauti village had to be evacuated on Saturday night after a dam was brimming over. A holiday has been declared in schools," Rajgarh collector Tarun Pithode said.

About 22 people were rescued by Army and National Disaster Relief Force teams in Rajasthan's Pratapgarh district, while three districts

TN to file plea in SC to get a Cauvery water as per award

Interim petition to be filed in a day or two: Jayalalithaa

chennal: The Tamil Nadu government on Thursday said that it would file an interim petition in the Supreme Court to get its share of the Cauvery water from Karnataka as per the final order of the Cauvery Water Disputes Tribunal.

"The petition will be filed in a day or two. Required orders will be obtained from the Apex Court and we are hopeful of getting our share of water from them (Karnataka)" Chief Minister J Jayalalithaa said in the Assembly. "The water from the Mettur dam could not be released to farmers on June 12 due to its insufficient level in the reservoir," she said.

Pointing out that Karnataka did not release water during June and July this year as per the tribunal award, Jayalalithaa said that Karnataka and the Union government failed to reply to her letters on the release of Cauvery water.

Promising to protect the interests of Tamil Nadu in two is-

sues related to the Cauvery, Jayalalithaa said that getting due share of water from Karnataka and preventing it from constructing a dam at Mekedatu across the river will be her main agenda.

According to her, if the state does not get sufficient water for cultivation by the end of this month, the government has formulated subsidy schemes worth Rs 64.30 crore for the benefit of farmers.

Following pressure from the Opposition parties after Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah's announcement during his Independence Day address that a new reservoir would be

K'taka staring at water crisis, CM tells PM

BENGALURU: Chief Minister couraging for the months of Siddaramaiah on Thursday informed Prime Minister Narendra Modi about the looming water crisis in the state due to the deficit monsoon rains.

In a letter to Modi, Siddaramaiah explained with statistics how the state would face problems in the coming days. Water level in major reservoirs is low due to deficit rains in the catchment areas of the Cauvery and the Krishna rivers. The monsoon forecast for the Cauvery and the Krishna catchment areas is not very enAugust and September, he added.

Water shortage is likely to affect the drinking water availability in Bengaluru city. The state is facing an overall deficit of 10% in the monsoon rains (between June 1 and August 5 this year), compared to last year. The water level in major hydel reservoirs is only 46% of their gross storage capacity. The low water level has also impacted the agriculture operation under the command area, Siddaramaiah said.

"My government is closely monitoring the situation and our Cabinet has taken decision not to allow any further releases for irrigation purpose, except in exceptional cases and subject to availability and, utilise the existing water only for drinking purpose...Since there is a general perception that the south-west monsoon has been almost normal in Karnataka, I thought it necessary to bring the above facts to your attention (sic)," the Chief Minister mentioned.

BENGALURU: After rajakaluves (stormwater drains/feeder canals), Bengaluru's lakes may also get free of encroachments.

The Karnataka Lake Conservation and Development Authority (KLCDA) has started a survey to identify properties that have come up between 30 and 75 metres of lakebeds. This comes even as the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike's (BBMP) drive to clear encroachments on rajakaluves is underway.

The survey will cover all buildings — completed, occupied and under-construction—located 30-75 metres from lakes.

It aims to ensure compliance with a May 2016 ruling of the National Green Tribunal (NGT) to maintain a 75-metre buffer zone around lakes. Once the survey is completed, a detailed report will be submitted to the Legislature Committee on Lake Encroachment headed by Assembly Speaker K B Koliwad.

The committee will decide whether to keep 75 metres as buffer zone or reduce it to 50 or 30 metres, amend the Kar-

nataka Town and Country Planning Act or recommend moving the Supreme Court for altering the buffer zone, a KL-CDA official told *DH*.

According to the official, the government may order demolition of properties around lakebeds once stormwater drains are cleared of encroachments. And the committee's final report will form the basis for that action, if any.

"If the 75-metre buffer zone

is implemented in totality, one third of properties in Bengaluru will be demolished, a large chunk of them around White-field, Electronics City and Hebbal. The BBMP and the Bangalore Development Authority (BDA) are ready with 60% of the report and have submitted it to the committee," the official said.

The survey has been based on field assessment, original town planning maps and maps

High Court bars projects around Bellandur lake

BENGALURU: The High Court on Wednesday directed the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) and the Bangalore Development Authority (BDA) not to allow any projects in and around Bellandur lake without meeting the requirements stipulated by the Karnataka State Pollution Control Board (KSPCB).

A division bench of Chief Justice Subhro Kamal Mukherjee and Justice Ravi Malimath passed the interim order in a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) petition

filed by Rajya Sabha member D K Kupendra Reddy who urged the court to direct the authorities to clean Bellandur lake.

The petitioner's counsel told the court that the authorities concerned had failed to follow the KSPCB's May 11, 2007, circular which contained guidelines for construction projects, including mandatory Consent for Establishment (CFE) certificate before applying for approval of plans from civic agencies, BBMP, BDA and BMRDA.

DH News Service

obtained from the Karnataka Remote Sensing Agency. As per the KLCDA website, Bengaluru has 210 lakes.

The KLCDA manages four lakes — Agara, Hebbal, Nagawara and Vengaiahnakere, while the BBMP is the custodian of 60 lakes, the BDA 123, the Minor Irrigation Department 18 lakes and the Forest Department five.

At the committee's previous meeting, Koliwad had told officials of forest department, the KLCDA, the BBMP, the BDA, the Revenue Department and the Bangalore Water Supply and Sewerage Board (BWSSB) that no encroacher should be spared and that all waterbodies conserved to avoid flooding.

Water, power situation in state grim, says Energy minister


Due to deficit rainfall in Karnataka, reservoirs are only 40% full

BENGALURU: Energy Minister D K Shivakumar on Wednesday said the water situation in the state is grim and this would have a negative impact on the power scenario. The Energy department is thus planning medium and long-term measures to tackle the situation.

Shivakumar told reporters in Bengaluru that due to below par rainfall, the dams are only 40% full. To meet demand for power in summer, the government is expecting 209 MW from the Kudankulam Nuclear Power Plant. "We are also keeping tender process open to purchase power at Rs 4.36 per unit from various sources," he said.

The minister said the hydel losses were about 60% and thus dependency on Kudankulam and Yeramarus Thermai Power Station has increased. Three units of Bellary Thermal Power Supply (BTPS) would be affected because of the water crisis.

The Cauvery basin will get the least water in the last 40 years. This year permission has not been given to cultivate sugarcane, paddy and other water intensive crops.

"We have to save at least 15 tmc of water till summer to meet Bengaluru's drinking water needs. Farmers require 40 tmc ft water for 80 days to grow crops. But, the present availability in the KRS reservoir is only 12.68 tmc ft. We will release 4 tmc ft by the end of August, five tmc by September, two tmc by October, 1.3 tmc by November and a total of 26 tmc by December. Our priority is providing drinking water," Shivakumar said.

Release of the Cauvery water

started from July 30 and will continue till August 30. It will be stopped from August 31 to September 10. Later, based on the assessment report, the future course of action will be decided.

There is a severe shortage of rainfall in the Cauvery catchment areas and the Weather department has forecast that situation will be grim in the coming days, he said.

Plans to tackle drinking water crisis

The deficient rainfall and low water levels in reservoirs in various parts of the state prompted the State Cabinet on Wednesday to direct authorities to prepare contingency plans to tackle the drinking water crisis in the coming months. Briefing reporters after the meeting, Law Minister T B Jayachandra said the state was staring at a drinking water crisis due to the low water levels in reservoirs, particularly in the Cauvery basin. The water levels (except for the Almatti and the Narayanapura) were much below compared to the levels recorded during the corresponding period last year. Further, the India Meteorological Department had predicted below normal rainfall in August. The dryspell has compelled the state government to work out contingency plans and long term plans to face the impending situation. Chief Minister Siddaramaiah directed ministers to tours districts to assess the situation. Besides, cabinet sub-committees would be constituted to take up relief work, he said. He reiterated that water from reservoirs would only be utilised for drinking water purposes. To a query on whether there would be shortfall in foodgrain

To a query on whether there would be shortfall in foodgrain target set by the government, Jayachandra said it was too early to make a prediction.


NGT issues warrants against States, UTs for non-appearance


THE STRUCTURE WAS 3 YRS OLD; RAIN DEATH TOLL CROSSES 75 Rain-triggered building 9-21 Collapse kills 2, injures six

BHOPAL 20 AUG: A double-story residential cum commercial building constructed just three years ago by the state-owned Madhya Pradesh Housing Board (MPHB) in Maihar town of Satna district collapsed today due to rain, killing two persons and injuring at least half-a-dozen more.

Meanwhile, about 15 persons have been killed in past 24 hours across the state due to the fresh spell of incessant heavy rain. The death toll for the state throughout this monsoon season has crossed 75. Army jawans and Air Force aircraft have been pressed into service in the state's Rewa district that has been severely hit by the rains.

Meanwhile, Satna district Collector Naresh Kumar Pal told The Statesman over phone that



the MPHB building in Maihar town collapsed in the early hours today. He said an unidentified woman was killed on the spot after getting crushed under the debris, while a man named Martin who was injured died while being taken to a hospital. More than six other people were injured and rescue operation was underway throughout the day.

Sources said that the building probably caved in due to the sub standard material used in its con-

struction, as it couldn't withstand the water that had inundated it since two-three days.

In another incident in Sagar district's Rahatgarh area, seven persons, including four females and three minors, were killed and three others injured when a house collapsed today following incessant rains.

Police said the incident occurred in the early hours when the house of one Mehtab Shilpkar (59) at Ward No.7 of Rahatgarh area collapsed while

the victims were fast asleep.

Two men were killed after being swept away while crossing a bridge on the overflowing Betwa in Raisen district today.

Yesterday, six youths belonging to Sagar district were swept away while they were returning after visiting a religious shrine in Chhattarpur district. Villagers and local resident managed to save three of the youth but three more were missing. Their bodies were found today.

In the severely affected Rewa district, Collector Rahul Jain informed that two air force helicopters and one aeroplane provided relief material and food packets to several people who have been marooned in areas cut off from other places due to waterlogging and flooding as a result of the heavy rains that continued unabated for the past two-three days.

PATNA, 20 AUG: A flood threat looms over the state capital with the Ganga flowing much above the danger level. In view of the alarming situation, the authorities have blocked the drain outlets to prevent the river water from flowing into the city and kept the Army on alert.

The flood threat has been triggered by a huge discharge of around 12 lac cusecs of water into the Sone river from the Indrapuri barrage last night.

en with reports of another five lac cusecs of water being discharged into the Sone from the Bansagar dam in Madhya Pradesh. This water is likely to reach Bihar by late this evening, officials said. This is said to be the maximum discharge of water since 1975 when 14 lakh cusecs of water had been discharged into the Sone river which ultimately flooded Patna. According to a report from the Central

Water Commission, the water level of the Ganga will keep rising in the next five days.

The authorities said the water level in the Ganga, which flows by Patna, is rising by 4 cm per hour, causing panic among residents. The Ganga water has already flooded the Gandhi Ghat areas located near the National Institute of Technology and also entered the low-lying areas on

the city's outskirts.

The situation is even more alarming in the riverine areas close to the state capital. The disaster management department has asked choppers to be ready for rescue operations and also placed the Army on alert.

"We have asked the Army to be on the alert and also kept choppers ready to meet any eventuality," the state disaster management department's principal secretary Vyasji told reporters today. He added five more NDRF teams are also reaching Patna soon.

Another senior official and Patna district magistrate Sanjay Agarwal said there was no immediate flood threat to the state capital, but if the water level continued to rise in the Ganga, the situation might turn really alarm-

ing. "Right now the water level of the Ganga is rising by four cm an hour but the administration is on the alert," the DM said urging the people settled in the "dia-yara" region (or river bed) to immediately move to safer areas and put up in relief centres. He said more than 100 boats had been pressed into service to ferry trapped villagers to safer places.

The authorities said flood waters have inundated many areas in Patna, Bhojpur, Buxur, Munger, Aurangabad, Jehanabd, Saran, Vaisahali, Bhagalpur and Samastipur districts following a heavy discharge of water from the Ganga and its tributaries.

As the overall flood situation remains grave in the state, Bihar chief secretary Anjani Kumar Singh today held an emergency meeting with the senior officials and reviewed the overall flood situation. He also ordered launching a massive relief and rescue operation while appealing to the masses not to panic.

21 killed within 24 hrs as heavy rain lashes MP



Bhopal: Twenty-one people were killed following 24 hours of rainfall in Madhya Pradesh, while several rain-related deaths were reported from other states, including Rajasthan and Uttarakhand.

A three-storeyed building came crashing down amid incessant rainfall in Satna district's Maihar, killing an aspiring cricketer, Bablu Martin, and another girl. Several other occupants of the building were feared trapped under the debris.

In neighbouring Rahatgarh in Sagar district, eight people of a family were killed after their house collapsed due to the downpour, taking death toll in rain-related incidents to 21 in 24 hours. At least 90 rain-related deaths have been reported in the state this season.

All major rivers in the state are in spate with rail and road routes affected in



Several rain-related deaths were also reported from other states, including Rajasthan and Uttarakhand

several areas of Vindhyachalregion.

Five helicopters have been pressed into service for relief and rescue operations. The havoc wreaked by rains coupled with strong winds snapped power supply and mobile network in several areas of the state.

Meanwhile, in Uttarakhand, seven members of a family were killed when their house was razed to the ground by huge boulders that rolled down the hill following a cloudburst in Pauri district.

A house collapse incident was reported from Rajasthan too in which five people were killed in Baran district. Incessant rains, which started early this morning, created flood-like situation in several areas in the state.

HEAVY RAINS IN RAJASTHAN CLAIM SIX LIVES, 70 AIRLIFTED

Jaipur, 21 August: Torrential rains triggered by the South West monsoon have created flood-like situation in four districts of Rajasthan where six persons have been killed and over 70 airlifted, officials said today.

The Met department has issued a warning of heavy to very heavy rainfall for isolated places in eastern parts and heavy rainfall for isolated areas in western parts of the state in the next 24 hours. Baran, Pratapgarh, Chittogarh and Jhalawar are the worst affected districts.

Army, National Disaster Response Force and Rajasthan Armed Constabulary have been deployed in the affected areas and several people have been shifted to safer places.

Meanwhile, water level in Chambal river in Dholpur today crossed the danger mark. The water level is posing threat of flood-like situation in more than two dozen villages near the river.






