



Heatstroke kills boy in Gujarat; rain lashes several states

NEW DELHI, PTI & DHNS: Heat conditions prevailed in several parts of the country with Gujarat reporting another death due to heatstroke even as rain lashed several parts of Punjab, Haryana, Delhi and West Bengal on Tuesday.

A 14-year-old boy in Bhavnagar district succumbed to heatstroke. Temperature in several parts of Gujarat came down a wee bit with maximum mercury levels falling below 42 de-grees Celsius. There was respite from heatwave conditions in Delhi and most parts of Punjab and Haryana as overnight rain, lightning and thundering, brought the mercury down in the region. The weather in West Bengal also remained pleasant with some parts having received good amount of rainfall since last evening.

Rain in Maddur

Heavy rain accompanied by gusty winds lashed parts of taluk on Tuesday evening, reports DHNS from Maddur (Mandya district).

A few houses were damaged while roofs of several houses were blown away. A banyan tree was uprooted, killing a cow tied to it.

Cultivators Allege Delay In Approval Of Many Projects

Mumbai: The state government has announced several schemes for water conservation, but their implementation has been questioned by many. Many of the schemes don't even cover a fraction of the cost of the project, leaving the farmer to be ar the rest; there have also been complaints of delays in approving projects.

The government officials of the district agriculture department helped Sanjay Tidke with expertise on how and which type of dam to construct. But other government officials began harassing him over the sand he was using for the project and filed police complaints against him for allegedly buying sand illegally. The construction of the dam started in March and after completion in the next 2 weeks will be ready to hold water this monsoon.

"On one hand the government is spending crores of rupe-

es to undertake water conservation projects, and on the other hand when a farmer is spending money from his own pocket to something for the village, the government officials still create problems," said Tidke.

After word spread about the dam being constructed, many farmer groups started visiting the site and helped him deal with the issues that government

officials would raise. The site has become very popular with farmers and government officials visiting it.

"It's a one-of-its-kind project. Not only Tidke, but the entire village will benefit from the project. Farmers will be able to grow a second crop using the water in the dam,"said Santosh Gawai, member of a farmers' group from the neighbouring taluka.

Children, women from tribal villages help water conservation

MUMBAI: In a unique initiative, village children, youngsters and women in tribal villages living around six tiger reserves in central India came out to provide water for wildlife.

Under the banner of Satpuda Foundation, they seek to clean and de-silt around 76 existing waterholes, build 38 new check dams and construct seven new waterholes.

"We have been regularly doing this since 2005. But with our spread in the Satpuda Landscape with the financial assistance of Born Free Foundation, the activity has taken a shape of community movement now after 11 years," Kishor Rithe, President of Sat-

puda Foundation, said.

"A total of 38 check dams were built during 2015-16 using locally available materials. These dams, mostly built on streams, help retain water and recharge the water table. Some of them provide drinking water to domestic animals and those close to forest provide water to wild animals," he stated further.

Volunteers comprising adult villagers, members of SHGs that we had mentored and children from village schools started building check dams after November 2015, Rithe said.

Anoop Awasthi, Assistant Director (Conservation) told that the foundation's water conservation programme has also addressed the issue of human health and cleanliness. "We dug a total of 45 soak pits across the landscape. The soak pits, dug next to wells/hand pumps in villages, collect spillover and run-off water and help recharge the water table, thereby addressing the human health and human-wildlife conflict issues,"he said.

The foundation teams have been working in more than 120 buffer villages of Tiger Reserves like Pench Maharashtra, Pench Madhya Pradesh, Navegaon-Nagzira, Satpuda, Tadoba-Andhari and Kanha Tiger Reserve spread across the Satpuda landscape.

Monsoon cheer as Australia signals of El Nino

This could cause monsoon to spill over to October: Officials

NEW DELHI: Australia's weather bureau said the withering El Nino — among the strongest in history and responsible for two years of consecutive droughts and record summer temperatures in India — had ended.

While that bodes well for the monsoon, weather officials in India said this could also be a precursor to floods during August and September and monsoon possibly spilling over to October.

The Australian Bureau of Meteorology said on Tuesday

that there was "...little chance of [sea surface temperatures] returning to El Niño levels, in which case mid-May will mark the end of the 2015-16 El Niño." Typically, an El Nino — marked by above-average temperatures in the Pacific — that begins to cool is followed by a neutral phase before transitioning into La Nina.

Australia signals end of El Nino

La Nina is a converse phenomenon of below-normal temperatures in the same region. The latter brings heavy rain over India. "Changes in the tropical Pacific Ocean and atmosphere, combined with current climate model outlooks, suggest the likelihood of La Niña forming later in 2016 is around 50%, said the agency's press statement. "It's good news-...there is a good chance that La Nina conditions will begin to show up in the second half of the monsoon. August could mean heavy rain and we might see some monsoon rain in October also," said Madhavan Rajeevan, Secretary, Ministry of Earth Sciences.

Gains for agriculture

Private weather agency Skymet said on Wednesday that it expected all of the monsoon months, except June, to record rains well above what's usual and would translate into gains for agriculture.

"In 2016, the total area

under kharif food grains is expected to increase by 15 to 20% over last year. Accordingly, the kharif food grains production is expected to be around 129 to 130 million tonnes. Area under oilseeds including soybean, groundnut, pulses and rice may increase. Area under cotton may reduce marginally while total agricultural land under sugarcane may remain the same as the previous year."

According to the IMD's latest update, the monsoon is likely to set in on June 7 over Kerala. This was partly due to a depression in the Bay of Bengal that morphed into cyclone Roanu and brought heavy rains to Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and killed at least 20 in Bangladesh.

The monsoon-rain-bearing systems were yet to gain enough force to coast over India and though the El Nino was gone, it would take some time for its effect to spill over into the atmosphere and aid the monsoon, said Mr. Rajeevan.



NEW DELHE The National Green Hibunal (NGT) has directed the principal com-mittee — constituted to look into the rejuvenation of Yamuna's ecologically sensitive floodplains, after a three day featival was orga-nised there by the Art I wing foundation, earlier this year — to inspect the site and submit a final report within two weeks.

A bench headed by NGT Chairperson Justice Swatanter Kumar on Wednesday also asked the foundation to file its reply within three days on an application, which had alleged that the spiritual suru had termed its earlier order as "politically motivated".

No compensation yet

The bench asked Art of Living if it had deposited the environment compensation as directed by it on March 9 for damaging Yamuna's biodiversity. The counsel for the foundation said that it was ready to furnish the amount as bank guarantee.

"Keep your bank guarantee with you," the bench said," while posting the matter for next hearing on August 2.

Fragile ecosystem

On March 9, the green panel had given a go-ahead for the cultural extravaganza, but had imposed a fine of Rs. 5 crore on it as environmental compensation.

It had slapped a fine of Rs. 5 lakh on the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) and Rs. 1 lakh on the Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC) for not discharging statutory functions.

The Tribunal's order had come on the pleas by NGOs and environmentalists, who had sought cancellation of the festival on the ground that it would seriously endanger the fragile acosystem on the riverbed.

Meanwhile, the principal committee was constituted by the Tribunal for implementation of 'Maili se Nirmal Yamuna Revitalisation Project 2017' and is headed by Secretary of Ministry of Water Resources.

NGT to panel: Assess damage to floodpla

NEW DELHI: The National Green Tribunal on Wednesday directed the principal committee, constituted for the rejuvenation of the Yamuna, to inspect the site on river floodplains where a threeday festival was organised by Art of Living.

The World Culture Festival in March had triggered a huge controversy. The foundation was accused of causing extensive damage to the eco-sensitive floodplain and the river while building the stage for the three-day extravaganza.

A bench headed by NGT chairperson Justice Swatanter Kumar ordered the committee to assess the damage caused to Yamuna floodplains and submit a final report within two weeks.

The committee was constituted by the tribunal for implementation of Maili se Nirmal Yamuna Revitalisation Project 2017 and is headed by secretary of ministry of water resources. It also has three experts members — Professor CR Babu, professor AK Gosain and professor Brij Gopal.

The green court asked the foundation to file its reply within three days on an application which had alleged the spiritual guru had termed its earlier order as "politically motivated".

A foundation spokesperson said the Art of Living was ready with replies to applications on enzymes and alleged statements by Sri Sri to a section of media.

"The NGT gave three more days to file the replies. The allegation by Manoj Misra regarding Sri Sri's comment on the NGT order are baseless. The petition was based on unverified newspaper reports. The Art of Living has the video of the speech that clearly shows that no such comment was made by Sri Sri. It was yet another malafide attempt by Misra to malign and tarnish his image by false claims,' the statement said.

The tribunal asked whether ' the foundation has deposited the environment compensation as directed on March 9 for damaging Yamuna's biodiversity. The Art Of Living counsel replied that it was ready to furnish the amount as bank guarantee instead of "payment of balance amount".

"Keep your bank guarantee with you," the bench said, while posting the matter for August 2.

On March 9, the NGT ordered an initial "environmental compensation" of ₹5 crore on Art of Living. The rest of the fine amount, it said, would have to be decided after a committee assessed the damage to the floodplain.

Met predicts rain over weekend

New Delhi: After a good spell of rain and thunderstorms that brought down Delhi's temperature by about 9 degrees over the last few days, the Met department has predicted another spell of rain over the weekend. Meanwhile, parts of the city saw light rain on Wednesday evening while IGI Airport reported a squall between 4.45 pm and 5.30 pm with wind speed of about 90 kmph.

"We have predicted that

thunderstorms, accompanied with squall, are likely to occur at isolated places over Punjab, Haryana, Delhi and Uttar Pradesh over the weekend," said a Met official.

For Delhi, a partly cloudy sky with possibility of rain and thunderstorm are in the pipeline even in the beginning of next week. "From May 26, the partly cloudy sky will start becoming mainly clear. The mainly clear sky will start becoming partly cloudy from May 28 onwards. Dust

storm and thunderstorm are likely to occur between Saturday and Tuesday," said the Met department.

The maximum and minimum temperatures are expected to rise by 1-2 degrees over northwest and central India over the next two days. Wednesday's maximum temperature was 38.6 degrees Celsius, two degrees below normal while the minimum was 27.4 degrees Celsius, one degree above normal. Humidity ranged between 39% and 76%.

Rains lash Capital, max temp 38.6



According to the MeT department, the Safdarjung weather station, the figure of which is considered the official figure for the city, recorded 0.4 mm rainfall while areas under Palam, Avanagar and Ridge observatories recieved 0.8 mm, 8.9 mm and 0.4 mm rainfall respectively till 5.30 PM.


