File Ganga pollution report by Nov 7'

NGT panel to report on waste drains between Haridwar, Unnao

NEW DELHI: A committee set up by the National Green Tribunal (NGT) to collect information on drains joining the Ganga between Haridwar and Unnao was on Tuesday directed by the green panel to submit its report by November 7.

A Bench headed by NGT chairperson Justice Swatanter Kumar asked the committee, comprising Member Secretary of the Central Pollution Control Board, Chief Engineer of the U.P.

Jal Nigam, senior Chief Environmental Officer of the U.P. Pollution Control Board and representative from the Ministry of Water Resources, to submit its report giving details about the drains joining the Ganga from Haridwar to Unnao, and the quantum and quality of waste being released into the river.

The next hearing on the matter is listed for November 15. The NGT has divided the work of cleaning the river in different segments — from Gomukh to Haridwar, from Haridwar to Un-

nao, from Unnao to the border of UP, from the border of UP to the border of Jharkhand and from the border of Jharkhand to the Bay of Bengal. The Tribunal had earlier blamed ill-planning and unscientific approach of the authorities for the chaotic condition of the Ganga. The NGT had also rapped the UP government for wasting public money on Ganga rejuvenation and restrained it from spending on any major project, except maintenance work on the stretch from Haridwar to Kanpur.

Kejriwal to unveil Yamuna riverfront development plan

NEW DELHI: The first phase of the Yamuna riverfront project will be ready by June next year, water minister Kapil Mishra said on Tuesday.

While a detailed plan of the project will be unveiled by Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal next week, Mishra said five-kilometre stretch along the northern bank of Yamuna, upstream from Wazirabad.

After the project is completed the stretch will have wetlands,

facilities of rowing, canoeing, a modern akhara (traditional wrestling pit) after the project is over, Mishra said.

"The project will be completely ecological and involve the construction of temporary structures only Concrete will not be used and the structures will be made of bamboo and wood," Mishra said, adding that the Delhi Development Authority, land owing agency, has authorized the Delhi government to go ahead with the project.

The Yamuna redevelopment project will incur expenditure

of ₹200 crore. The blueprint of the project will be unveiled by Kejriwal after the 'Yamuna Aarti', on the lines of 'Ganga Arti', at Banaras at the Sonia Vihar ghat on November 1. The function will be attended by the entire Delhi Cabinet and locals.

Yamuna aarti was perfomed last year at Geeta Ghat near ITO last year. Mishra said the venue has been shifted to the northern bank as Geeta Ghat is being developed into a 'Nakshatra Vatika' a thematic garden based on Vedic astrology — besides a medicinal garden, Mishra said.







'Over 1,000 flood-prone areas in Kancheepuram district'

KANCHEEPURAM: The district administration has identified 1,128 areas in Kancheepuram as flood-prone and classified them into four categories.

this Disclosing reporters here on Monday, Collector R. Gajalakshmi said the classification of flood-prone areas was carried out as per the guidelines issued by the office of the Commissioner of Revenue Administration.

The places where inundation level stood above five feet during the last northwhere monsoon; east Central Forces were pressed into the service of rescue and relief operations; where the area remained cut off from access by road or where any loss of life was reported have been classified as highly vulnerable areas, the Collector said.

While 177 places have been identified as highly vulnerable, 176 areas where the inundation level was less

than five feet during last monsoon were classified as vulnerable. Another 501 places where the intensity of the problem was slightly low were classified as moderately vulnerable and 274 as less vulnerable areas.

Out of this 1,128 vulnerable areas, 217 have been identified in urban/semiurban areas and the rest in rural pockets, the Collector added.

Residents roped in

The resident welfare associations in urban and semiurban areas have also been roped in this time and made part of the precautionary teams formed to take up rescue and relief operations, if needed, in the 353 areas, that have been identified as Highly Vulnerable and Vulnerable areas.

While the team head would be identified as first respondent, nine other persons from the same area would be assisting him in carrying out initial rescue/ relief operations.

Apart from the local teams, 51 officials-level rescue and relief teams have been formed to take care of the 1128 vulnerable areas, she added.

Slum dwellers seek flood-resistant homes

CHENNAI: In situ houses, disaster relief and livelihood were among the concerns raised by slum dwellers, who were attending the 'Voice of Slums in post-flood Chennai: Future Concerns' seminar at Loyola College on Monday. Over a 100 slum dwellers, who were affected by floods from across the city, took part in the event led by experts from the field.

"Why is it that it is always us slum dwellers who are relocating during the time of crisis," questioned Shyamala from Chetpet. "We lost everything during the floods, and we are yet to recover from it. Moving to colonies like Perumbakkam only makes it worse. We need a fair solution," she said.

Making no sense

Sasi Kumar, a resident of Koyambedu, pointed out that during the December flood they were relocated to another far-off location which was just as flooded. "It had made no sense to relocate to Kannagi Nagar and Perumbakkam which had water till the first floor. Money and relocation is not the ultimate solution. The State needs to build disaster resistant houses, for all," said Sasi.

A senior official from Tamil Nadu Slum Clearance Board, who attended the seminar, heard the problems of the community and assured

During a seminar, they voiced their concerns and sought a solution to relocation

"We have assistance. provided a monthly subsistence allowance of Rs. 2,500 to the resettled families, for one year. We have held medical camps and skill training for all. While we have begun providing in situ housing, we shall be extending it for others as well," he said.

Urging slum dwellers to know their rights, Vanessa Peter, policy researcher said: "Slum Act is your weapon. It is important that you know your rights and stand up for it." She also pointed out that there was a need for reservation in land allotment for slum dwellers.

"Just like education, there needs to be reservation in land as well. When you move to a place, it is your duty to find out if the land you're living in is certified among other details. In case you are asked to uproot, file a case," she said.

Adding to this Deva Prakash, program manager, CARE INDIA, said: "Instead of offering relief to the affected in kind the authorities must deposit cash in their respective accounts. During such times, the women and children are the worst affected and the authorities need to provide suitable housing for them."

Monsoon extends stay, may exit by first week of Nov

Pune: The southwest monsoon is not done with India yet, overstaying well past its normal withdrawal date of October 15. The monsoon is now expected to withdraw in the first week of November —its most extended stay since 2007.

In the last 10 years, the most delayed monsoon withdrawal was in 2010, when the wind system pulled out of the country on October 29. The delay this year is due to a deep depression that has formed over the Bay of Bengal. It is expected to intensify into a cyclonic storm during the next 48 hours, according to India Meteorological Department.

While the monsoon has withdrawn from most parts of the country, it still remains active over parts of the southern

peninsula, the region where the northeast monsoon sets in. B Mukhopadhyay, IMD's additional director general of meteorology, told **TOI** that the delay was not very unusual and such a phenomenon could happen once in 10 years. The conditions for withdrawal will become favourable after the dissipation of the cyclonic disturbance over the Bay of Bengal.


Mahesh Palawat, chief meteorologist at Skymet Weather Services, said rainfall is expected to begin over Gangetic West Bengal and coastal Odisha by October 26. "Moderate to heavy rains will continue over these areas till October 29. Bihar, Jharkhand and interior Orissa may also experience light rains on October 30 and 31. This means the southwest monsoon may only withdraw from India in early November," said Palawat.

Poondi reservoir sees good inflow

The storage is enough to cater to the city's need for three days

CHENNAI: Poondi reservoir, the prime water storage point for city, has been receiving a steady inflow of Krishna water from Andhra Pradesh for about five days now.

On Monday, the Tamil Nadu entry point of the Kandaleru Poondi canal, which carries Krishna water from Kandaleru reservoir in Andhra Pradesh, received about 330 cusecs of water. Of this, nearly 325 cusecs reached the Poondi reservoir through the 25-km KP canal.

This supply is crucial as most reservoirs supplying water to Chennai are nearly dry and the north-east monsoon is yet to set in. The water gushing from KP canal into Poondi reservoir has been attracting a large number of visitors. Some even fish in these waters.

At present, the reservoir has a storage of about 140 million

capacity of 3,231 mcft. The water body in Poondi has so far received nearly 75 mcft of Krishna water. This is equal to three days of water supply to Chennai at the current rate of about 750-800 million litres a day.

More inflow expected

Officials of the Water Resources Department said the volume of discharge from Kandaleru reservoir is being steadily increased and is likely to go up to 1,000 cusecs. "Only a minimal volume is being diverted for the drinking water needs of Tirupati and Kalahasti. We are expecting the inflow into Poondi reservoir to increase to 500 cusecs by Tuesday or Wednesday," said an official.

However, only 70 cusecs is being released for city water supply as the water level is lower than the level of link canal, which carries water to other reservoirs. "Only when the water level raises in the reservoir, we can send the entire volume to the other water bodies," said an official.

Meanwhile, the department is also carrying out improvement work on the bund of cubic feet of water against its Poondi reservoir and link canal.
