Overnight rain spells trouble for commuters on Tuesday

NEW DELHI: Overnight rain in parts of the national capital was enough to flood the roads, and bring the traffic to a standstill in the morning.

The situation was particularly bad in areas around south and south-west Delhi. Stretches around Delhi Cantonment, Najafgarh, Aya Nagar, Palam, Dabri, Mahavir Enclave, Mahipalpur, Dhaula Kuan (Ring Road), South Extension, and Lajpat Nagar, were waterlogged in the morning.

By 11am, however, the traffic situation eased. Delhi Traffic Police's Twitter handle and Facebook page were flooded with complaints from commuters who were stuck on the way.

The traffic helpline number, 25844444 and 1095, received over 50 complaints of waterlogging.

"The worst hit were the stretches around south Delhi,

where knee-deep water, stopped traffic for a few hours in the morning. The situation was, however, brought under control in some time. Additional officials were deployed on stretches where the traffic situation was bad," a senior traffic official said.

The official said that on many under-construction roads, the condition of traffic was particularly bad. Some of these areas

include, Munirka, RK Puram sector-7 (Outer Ring Road), Dwarka Road, and Airport Road.

Between Monday and Tuesday evenings, 14.3 mm of rain was recorded at Safdarjung. At Aya Nagar in south Delhi, 45 mm rain was recorded and at Najafgarh in southwest Delhi the rain was the heaviest with the gauges recording 59 mm. Most of this rain was seen till 9am.

Heavy rain lashes Shimla, Met predicts more showers

SHIMLA, JUNE 28

Several areas in lower and mid hills were lashed by intermittent heavy rain as the monsoon intensified in the state, causing a marginal drop in the temperatures.

The local Met Office has warned of heavy rain at isolated places in lower and mid hills for four days and rain and thunder-

showers at many places in the state for six days.

"The weather will remain wet with more rain in the region for six days", Director of local Met station Manmohan Singh said, adding that monsoon was 12 per cent above normal from June 1 to June 26 so far.

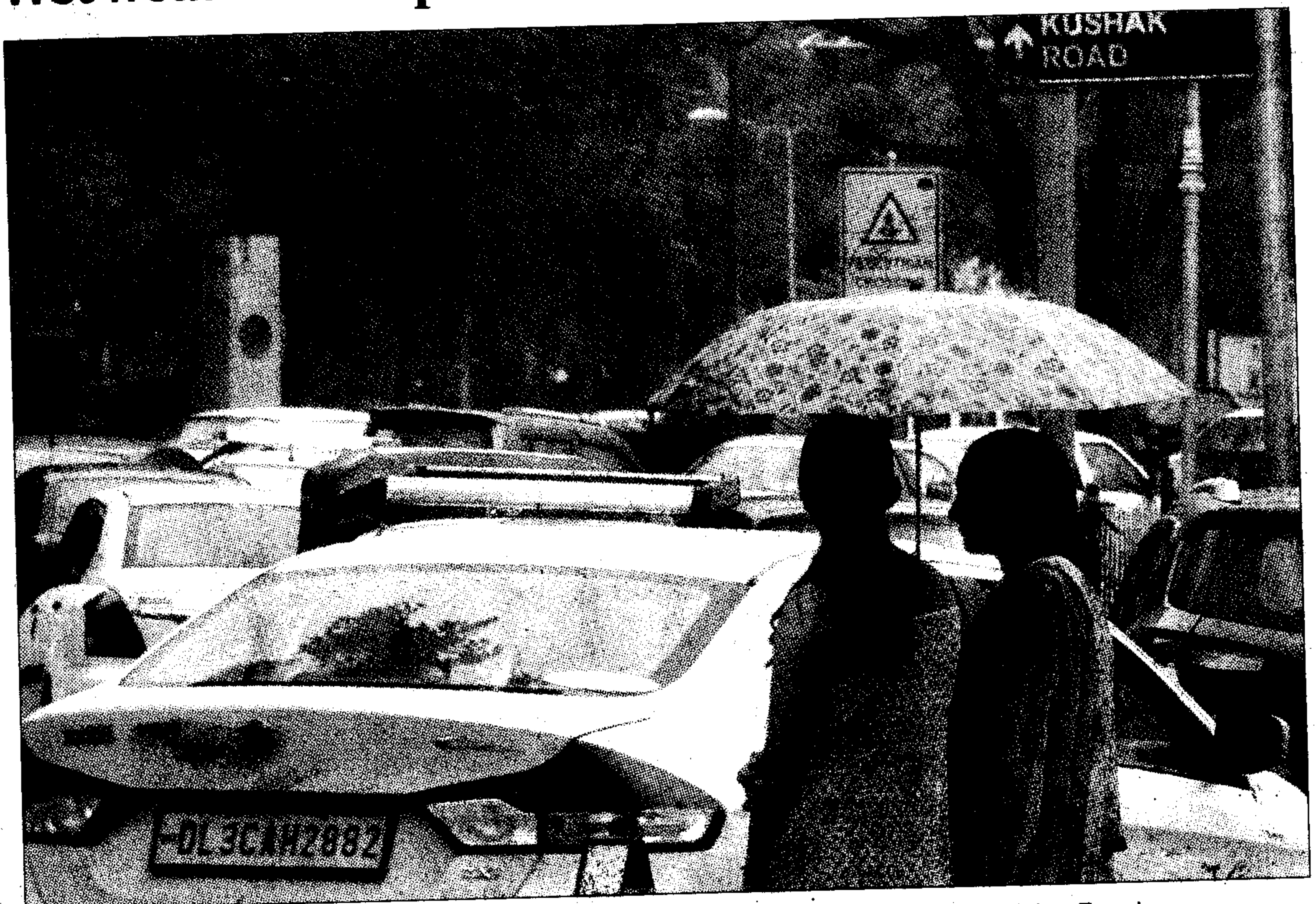
Shimla and its surrounding areas were lashed by heavy rain last night and the town

received 51 mm rain in just over an hour. The visibility was reduced and long queues of vehicles were seen on the major roads.

"We were taking a stroll on The Mall in the evening and enjoying the foggy weather," said a tourist couple Amit and Meghna from Delhi, adding that "The sudden heavy rain forced us to move indoors."

According to data from the BMC's automatic weather station, rainfall recorded between 8am-2pm in the island city was 7.4mm, eastern suburbs 97.5mm. Last year, rainfall received in Modak Sagar was 493.40mm while this year it is 169.40mm, in Tansa rainfall was 431.40mm last year while it is 165.40mm this year, Vihar last year received 1,033.60mm of rain while this year it received 655.40mm.

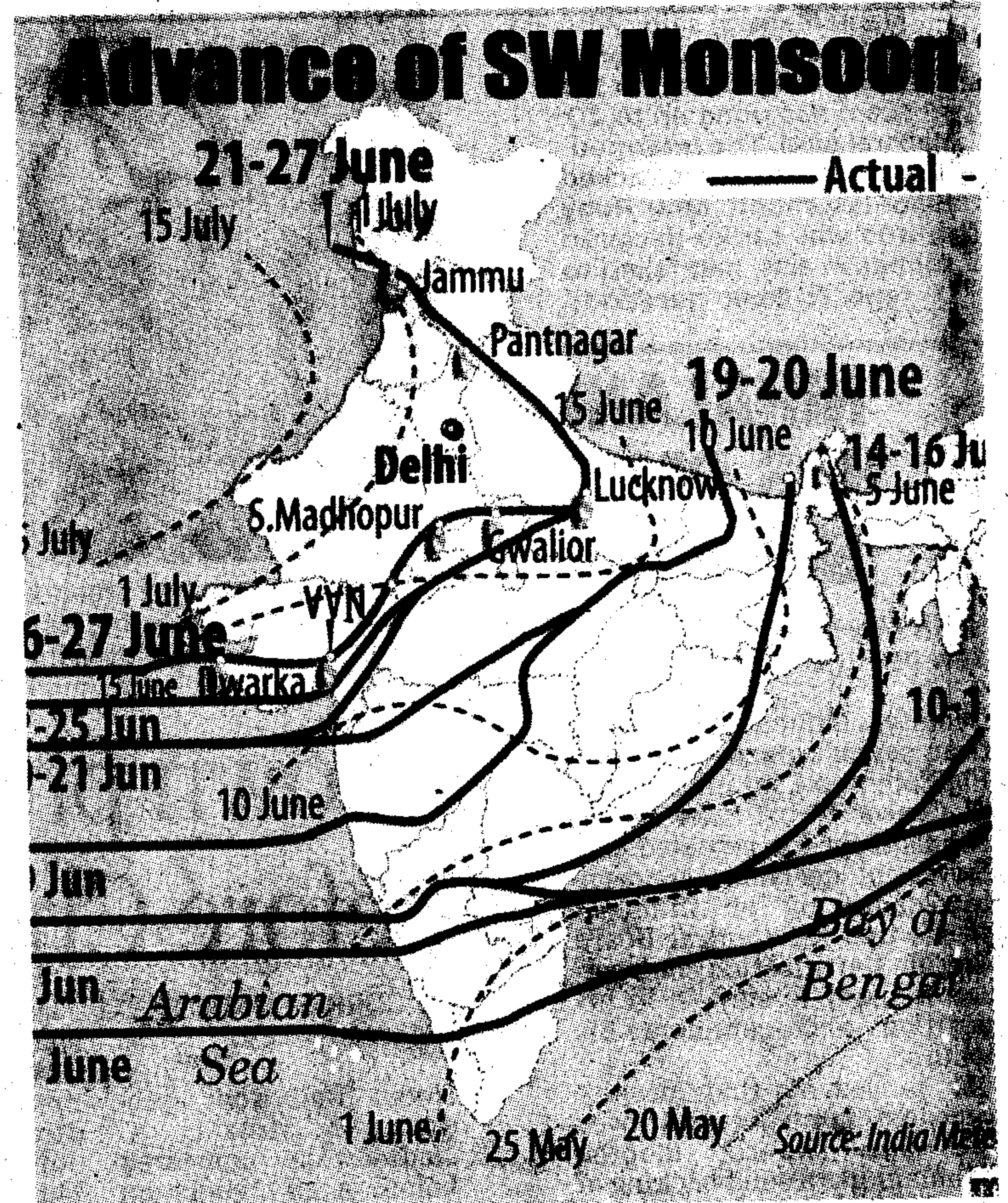

The city received heavy rainfall on Monday evening. The IMD measured the rain at 5.6 mm up to 8.30 pm. The rain is the result of a low pressure area over the Bay of Bengal. Heavy rain is expected on Tuesday too.

The areas between Panjagutta and Secunderabad, Sanathnagar, Mehdiapatnam and Toli Chowki received heavy rainfall continuously after 8.30 pm.

Following the low pressure area over the Bay of Bengal, the IMD has warned of heavy to very heavy rainfall till June 29 for all districts of Telangana.

While Hyderabad experienced good rainfall on Saturday night which continued till dawn, the city did not get any rain on Sunday.

Over 100 families hit by floods in Morigaon dist

MORIGAON, June 26: On a cursory glance, atleast 30 per cent area of Pobitora Wildlife Sanctuary was inundated by flood waters of the Brahmaputra today.

According to the Sanctuary's authority, the surging waters of the Brahmaputra entered the grassland through Tamuliduba camp. The eastern areas under Tamuliduba and Pagladuba for-

est camps of the sanctuary are under water, thus forcing the wild animals, including one-horned rhinos to go to nearby highlands of the sanctuary.

Pobitora Wildlife Sanctuary is situated in the western part of Morigaon district along the bank of the Brahmaputra and happens to be the densest habitat of one-horned rhinos in the world.

River bank erosion by the Brahmaputra over the years

has taken a grim turn at Mikirgaon point under Lahorighat Circle and in Baralimari point in Bhuragaon circle at present, reportedly threatening the entire Bhuragaon circle.

Swirling waters of the Brahmaputra devastated more than 1,000 hectares of standing crops like jute, sugarcane etc. More than 100 families have been affected within the district during the current wave of floods.

Brahmaputra erosion poses serious threat at Barkshetri

CORRESPONDENT

NALBARI, June 26: Massive erosion caused by the river Brahmaputra is posing a serious threat to Kaplabari and Peradhara villages under Barkshetri revenue circle in Nalbari district. The Government's inaction in carrying out anti-erosion project work at the erosion-hit sites has worsened the situation.

In Kaplabari village, more than 20 per cent of the embankment on the right bank of the river has already been eroded. The continuous erosion is posing a serious threat

to the dyke which is considered a lifeline of the greater parts of Nalbari and Bārpeta districts. If the embankment gets breached at Kaplabari, the river will submerge large areas in both the districts. It is even feared that the heavy current of the river will wash away the dwelling houses of the nearby areas if a breach is caused at Kaplabari. The subdivisional office of the Water Resources department of Mukalmua has been erecting some bamboo spurs to prevent the erosion, but that has been totally ineffective.

On the other hand, the riv-

er is also posing a severe threat at Peradhara village near Rampur. The continuous erosion has also threatened the existence of the Peradhara model hospital. If the department fails to arrest the erosion, the model hospital will fall into the river soon.

Presently the river is only a few metres ahead of the hospital. Unfortunately, the department has taken up no steps to protect the hospital from the erosion of the river. At the same time, the erosion of the Pagladiya river is also posing threat at various plac-

es in its course. There is massive erosion at Karia, Sadhnapar, Kamarkuchi, Hanapara, Hablakha and Bullitpar in the district.

It is very unfortunate that the Government has not taken the issue of massive erosion seriously. It may be mentioned here that at this precarious time, the sub divisional officer and the junior engineers of Mukalmua have been engaged in NRC update works. As a result they have failed to look after the anti-erosion works in the subdivision since a long time back.

Drought-weary farmers play it safe, delay sowing of crops

NEW DELHI: From Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh to Rajasthan and Gujarat, farmers ruined by a devastating drought are still edgy about sowing, despite resounding forecasts of a surplus monsoon.

Planting of major crops is 24% lower than what was sown by this time last year. Even state governments are treading cautiously. Maharashtra, for instance, had asked farmers to hold back sowing till June 18.

Till now, the monsoon has been 16% deficient, which means it has to cover a lot of ground in July. Reservoir levels are still barely 15% of their storage capacity.

Cotton-grower Ashok Barambe from Maharashtra's Vidarbha is

still weighing his options. Shaken by the crisis that pushed him back into grinding poverty, the farmer has decided to ditch cotton after many years, unwilling to take

chances with a rain-guzzling crop. "I don't trust weather forecasts anymore. What is the guarantee?" he told HT over the phone.

Drought-weary farmers play it safe, delay sowing of crops

Sowing data until June 24 indicate how India's worst water shortage in years has altered farmer choices in bigger states such as Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat, which have a bigger share in pulses, oilseeds, coarse cereals and cotton output.

Cotton sowing has fallen 46%, while oilseeds are tracking 34% lower than last year's levels at this time. "It's not late yet, but we are waiting for sufficient rains," said Surya Dev Bareth from Rajasthan's Alwar.

But the silver lining is that

two back-to-back bad seasons have forced farmers to be innovative. "There is obviously crop diversification this year. Farmers seem to prefer other crops to cotton. They are hedging risks," said CK Jani, a farm expert. Jani clarified he was speaking in his personal capacity and not as an office-bearer of the Cotton Association of India.

Experts say July rainfall is predicted to make good June's shortfall. "We are not worried, as July rains matter more for crop output and they are forecast to improve. We expect

kharif production growth to rise to 3.2% in 2016 compared to minus 3.2% in 2015," said Sonal Varma, an economist with the Nomura group.

Yet Vinod Yadav, a farmer from Bundelkhand region, wants to see good rainfall to believe the national forecast. "We will wait till July 5. If it rains, sowing will not be too late for us," he said.

Last year's whitefly pest attack due to rainless humid conditions has also dented confidence in cotton. Even in pulses, sowing has been down 20% from last year's levels for

June-end.

Regionwise, central India got rains 30% below the normal level, while the deficit in the Northeast was 24%. South India received normal rainfall.

All eyes are now on July. "Continuous drought has taught farmers a very hard lesson. Everybody has become conscious about water conservation. We are sure about a very good harvest because July is going to be very good," a senior farm ministry official said.

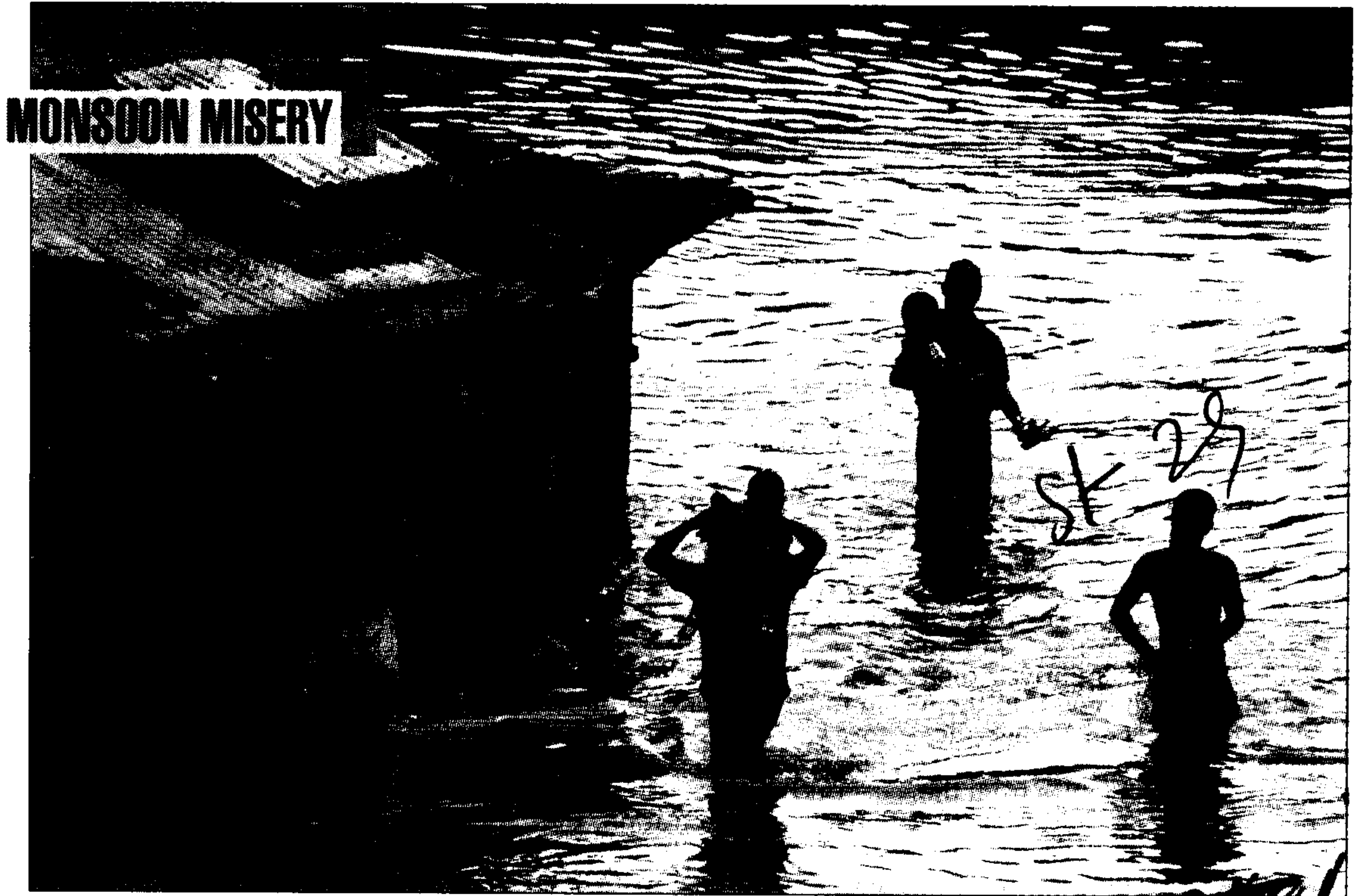

City sees good, bad & ugly of showers, but it's not monsoon

New Delhi/Gurgaon: The capital and its adjoining areas woke up on Tuesday to what they thought were the first monsoon showers of the season, but the Met department quickly quelled the enthusiasm. It said monsoon would officially not be declared till the first week of July, as while the rain was widespread, it was still not persistent.

The heavy drizzle in the early hours picked up and continued till almost 10am. The Safdarjung observatory recorded 13.4mm rain till 8.30am and another 0.5mm till 5.30pm. "These are pre-monsoon showers. The Met department does not want to declare monsoon since this rain is not persistent. We are expecting rainfall to intensify from June 30 so monsoon is likely to be declared in Delhi in the first week of July," said a senior Met official.

In Gurgaon, overnight rain brought relief from the searing heat, but brought much of the city to a standstill in the morning. By 10am, office-goers were seen with trousers rolled up to their knees, trying to avoid potholes. Vehicles were reduced to a crawl as they waded through the waterlogged streets.

Delhi's maximum temperature on Tuesday came down to 35.3 degrees Celsius, two degrees below normal. The minimum temperature was 25 degrees Celsius, three degrees below normal. Najafgarh saw the highest rainfall till 8.30am, recording 56mm rain, followed by Ayanagar, which registered 39.6mm and Palam 10.8mm.

The department stated that the northern limit of the monsoon was passing thro-

ugh Dwarka, Vallabh Vidyanagar, Sawai Madhopur, Gwalior, Lucknow, Pantnagar, Dehradun, Una and Jammu. "Conditions are becoming favourable for further advance of the southwest monsoon in some parts of north Arabian Sea, Gujarat, east Rajasthan, remaining parts of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, west Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, most parts of Punjab and Haryana, Chandigarh and Delhi during the

next three-to-four days," said an official.

BP Yadav, director IMD, told TOI: "The low pressure system, which is currently over the coastal areas like Orissa, will move over Madhya Pradesh by June 30. At the same time, we are expecting a western disturbance, which will facilitate a northward movement of the low pressure system over south UP and eastern Rajasthan."

He added: "This will lead

to an intermixing of two air masses with moisture coming in from both Bay of Bengal and the Arabian Sea and will result in widespread, more intense rainfall over large parts of northwest India from Thursday."

The Met department has predicted likelihood of fairly widespread to widespread rain over the western Himalayan region, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and east Rajasthan and

isolated to scattered over west Rajasthan during the next few days. The partly cloudy sky will become generally cloudy from July 1 onwards. Light rain and thundershowers are likely to occur in some areas during the next 24 hours. Thundery development and lightning are expected to occur on June 29, very light rain and thundershowers towards the evening or night on June 30 and thunderstorm with rain thereafter.

तीन-चार दिन में दिल्ली को सराबोर करेगा मानसून

4 जुलाई - 29-6-16

नई दिल्ली, (वार्ता): राष्ट्रीय राजधानी दिल्ली में अगले तीन-चार दिन में मानसून के आने का अनुमान है। इस बीच आज सुबह शहर के लगभग सभी हिस्सों में अच्छी बारिश हुई जिससे अधिकतम तथा न्यूनतम तापमान औसत से कम रहा। मौसम विभाग ने बताया कि अगले तीन-चार दिन में दिल्ली में मानसून के आने के लिए परिस्थितियां अनुकूल हैं। इसी दौरान मानसून के पश्चिमी राजस्थान के कुछ इलाकों में भी पहुंचने का अनुमान है। साथ ही इसके पश्चिमी मध्य प्रदेश तथा उत्तर प्रदेश में कुछ और आगे बढ़ने के भी आसार हैं। वहीं स्काईमैट का कहना है कि 30 जून या एक जुलाई को दिल्ली में मानसून आ जाने का अनुमान है। मौसम विभाग के अनुसार दिल्ली

के सफदरजंग केंद्र पर मंगलवार को 13.4 मिलीमीटर, आयानगर में 39.6 मिलीमीटर तथा पालम केंद्र पर 10.8 मिलीमीटर वर्षा रिकार्ड की गई। इसके अलावा कोंकण एवं गोवा तथा तटीय कर्नाटक के कुछ स्थानों पर भी पिछले 24 घंटे में भारी से बहुत भारी बारिश हुई है। पंजाब, पश्चिम बंगाल एवं सिक्किम के तराई वाले इलाकों और केरल में छिटपुट स्थानों पर भारी बारिश हुई।

अगले 24 घंटे में विदर्भ, छत्तीसगढ़, कोंकण एवं गोवा, तटीय कर्नाटक एवं केरल में भारी बहुत भारी बारिश का अनुमान है। मध्य प्रदेश, ओडिशा, तेलंगाना, अंदरूनी कर्नाटक तथा अंडमान एवं निकोबार द्वीप समूह के छिटपुट स्थानों पर भी भारी बारिश के आसार हैं।

मानसून के पहले महीने में ही आधे देश में सामान्य बारिश हो चुकी है। मंगलवार को मौसम विभाग की ओर से यह जानकारी दी गई।

विभाग के मुताबिक जुलाई की शुरुआत में मानसून देश के कई हिस्सों में रफ्तार पकड़ेगा। इसके साथ ही दस जुलाई तक मध्य भारत में सामान्य या सामान्य से अधिक बारिश होने की उम्मीद है। इससे लोगों को गर्मी से राहत मिलेगी। उत्तर प्रदेश और बिहार में पिछले दिनों जोरदार बारिश हुई है।

पूर्व और दक्षिण भारत में बादल मेहरबान: उत्तर पश्चिमी भारत में सामान्य से दो फीसदी ज्यादा बारिश दर्ज की गई है। वहीं दूसरी तरफ पूर्व और उत्तरपूर्वी इलाकों में सामान्य से 25 फीसदी कम



बारिश अब तक हुई है। दक्षिण भारत में 13% ज्यादा बारिश दर्ज की गई है।

धान की फसल सुधरेगी : पिछले कुछ दिनों से महाराष्ट्र और पूर्वी भारत में अच्छी बारिश देखने को मिल रही है।

महाराष्ट्र के कुछ इलाकों में बारिश न होने के कारण किसानों के लिए परिस्थितियां खराब होती जा रही थी।

मौसम विभाग की तरफ से किसानों को बुवाई न करने की सलाह भी दी गई

थी। लेकिन अब मौसम विभाग का कहना है कि 29 जून तक इन इलाकों में अच्छी बारिश हो सकती है। इससे धान और दाल की फसलों को काफी फायदा हो सकता है।
