Overnight rain spells trouble for commuters on Tuesday

NEW DELHI: Overnight rain in parts of the national capital was enough to flood the roads, and bring the traffic to a standstill in the morning.

The situation was particularly bad in areas around south and south-west Delhi. Stretches around Delhi Cantonment, Najafgarh, Aya Nagar, Palam, Dabri, Mahavir Enclave, Mahipalpur, Dhaula Kuan (Ring Road), South Extension, and Lajpat Nagar, were waterlogged in the morning.

By 11am, however, the traffic situation eased. Delhi Traffic Police's Twitter handle and Facebook page were flooded with complaints from commuters who were stuck on the way.

The traffic helpline number, 25844444 and 1095, received over 50 complaints of waterlogging.

"The worst hit were the stretches around south Delhi,

where knee-deep water, stopped traffic for a few hours in the morning. The situation was, however, brought under control in some time. Additional officials were deployed on stretches where the traffic situation was bad," a senior traffic official said.

The official said that on many under-construction roads, the condition of traffic was particularly bad. Some of these areas

include, Munirka, RK Puram sector-7 (Outer Ring Road), Dwarka Road, and Airport Road.

Between Monday and Tuesday evenings, 14.3 mm of rain was recorded at Safdarjung. At Aya Nagar in south Delhi, 45 mm rain was recorded and at Najafgarh in southwest Delhi the rain was the heaviest with the gauges recording 59 mm. Most of this rain was seen till 9am.

received 51 mm rain in just over an hour. The visibility was reduced and long queues of vehicles were seen on the major roads.



Drought-weary farmers play it safe, delay sowing of crops



NEW DELHI: From Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh to Rajasthan and Gujarat, farmers ruined by a devastating drought are still edgy about sowing, despite resounding forecasts of a surplus monsoon.

Planting of major crops is 24% lower than what was sown by this time last year. Even state governments are treading cautiously. Maharashtra, for instance, had asked farmers to hold back sowing till June 18.

Till now, the monsoon has been 16% deficient, which means it has to cover a lot of ground in July. Reservoir levels are still barely 15% of their storage capacity.

Cotton-grower Ashok Barambe from Maharashtra's Vidarbha is

still weighing his options. Shaken by the crisis that pushed him back into grinding poverty, the farmer has decided to ditch cotton after many years, unwilling to take chances with a rain-guzzling crop.
"I don't trust weather forecasts anymore. What is the guarantee?" he told HT over the phone.

Drought-weary farmers play it safe, delay sowing of crops

Sowing data until June 24 indicate how India's worst water shortage in years has altered farmer choices in bigger states such as Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat, which have a bigger share in pulses, oilseeds, coarse cereals and cotton output.

Cotton sowing has fallen 46%, while oilseeds are tracking 34% lower than last year's levels at this time. "It's not late yet, but we are waiting for sufficient rains," said Surya Dev Bareth from Rajasthan's Alwar.

But the silver lining is that

two back-to-back bad seasons have forced farmers to be innovative. "There is obviously crop diversification this year. Farmers seem to prefer other crops to cotton. They are hedging risks," said CK Jani, a farm expert. Jani clarified he was speaking in his personal capacity and not as an office-bearer of the Cotton Association of India.

Experts say July rainfall is predicted to make good June's shortfall. "We are not worried, as July rains matter more for crop output and they are forecast to improve. We expect

kharif production growth to rise to 3.2% in 2016 compared to minus 3.2% in 2015," said Sonal Varma, an economist with the Nomura group.

Yet Vinod Yadav, a farmer from Bundelkhand region, wants to see good rainfall to believe the national forecast. "We will wait till July 5. If it rains, sowing will not be too late for us," he said.

Last year's whitefly pest attack due to rainless humid conditions has also dented confidence in cotton. Even in pulses, sowing has been down 20% from last year's levels for

June-end.

Regionwise, central India got rains 30% below the normal level, while the deficit in the Northeast was 24%. South India received normal rainfall.

All eyes are now on July. "Continuous drought has taught farmers a very hard lesson. Everybody has become conscious about water conservation. We are sure about a very good harvest because July is going to be very good," a senior farm ministry official said.



New Delhi/Gurgaon: The capital and its adjoining areas woke up on Tuesday to what they thought were the first monsoon showers of the season, but the Met department quickly quelled the enthusiasm. It said monsoon would officially not be declared till the first week of July, as while the rain was widespread, it was still not persistent.

The heavy drizzle in the early hours picked up and continued till almost 10am. The Safdarjung observatory recorded 13.4mm rain till 8.30am another 0.5mm till 5.30pm. "These are pre-monsoon showers. The Met department does not want to declare monsoon since this rain is not persistent. We are expecting rainfall to intensify from June 30 so monsoon is likely to be declared in Delhi in the first week of July," said a senior Met official.

In Gurgaon, overnight rain brought relief from the searing heat, but brought much of the city to a standstill in the morning. By 10am, office-goers were seen with trousers rolled up to their knees, trying to avoid potholes. Vehicles were reduced to a crawl as they waded through the waterlogged streets.

Delhi's maximum temperature on Tuesday came down to 35.3 degrees Celsius, two degrees below normal. The minimum temperature was 25 degrees Celsius, three degrees below normal. Najafgarh saw the highest rainfall till 8.30am, recording 56mm rain, followed by Ayanagar, which registered 39.6mm and Palam 10.8mm.

The department stated that the northern limit of the monsoon was passing thro-

ugh Dwarka, Vallabh Vidyanagar, Sawai Madhopur, Gwalior, Lucknow, Pantnagar, Dehradun, Una and Jammu. "Conditions are becoming favourable for further advance of the southwest monsoon in some parts of north Arabian Sea, Gujarat, east Rajasthan, remaining parts of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, west Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, most parts of Punjab and Haryana, Chandigarh and Delhi during the

next three-to-four days," said an official.

BP Yadav, director IMD, told TOI: "The low pressure system, which is currently over the coastal areas like Orissa, will move over Madhya Pradesh by June 30. At the same time, we are expecting a western disturbance, which will facilitate a northward movement of the low pressure system over south UP and eastern Rajasthan."

He added: "This will lead



to an intermixing of two air masses with moisture coming in from both Bay of Bengal and the Arabian Sea and will result in widespread, more intense rainfall over large parts of northwest India from Thursday."

The Met department has predicted likelihood of fairly widespread to widespread rain over the western Himalayan region, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and east Rajasthan and

Rajasthan during the next few days. The partly cloudy sky will become generally cloudy from July 1 onwards. Light rain and thundershowers are likely to occur in some areas during the next 24 hours. Thundery development and lightning are expected to occur on June 29, very light rain and thundershowers towards the evening or night on June 30 and thunderstorm with rain thereafter.
