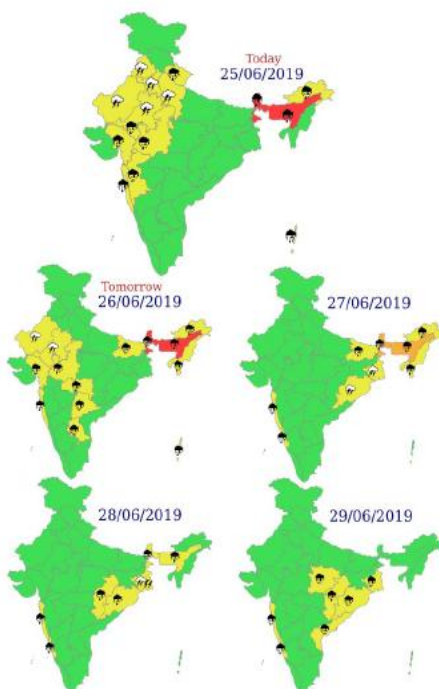

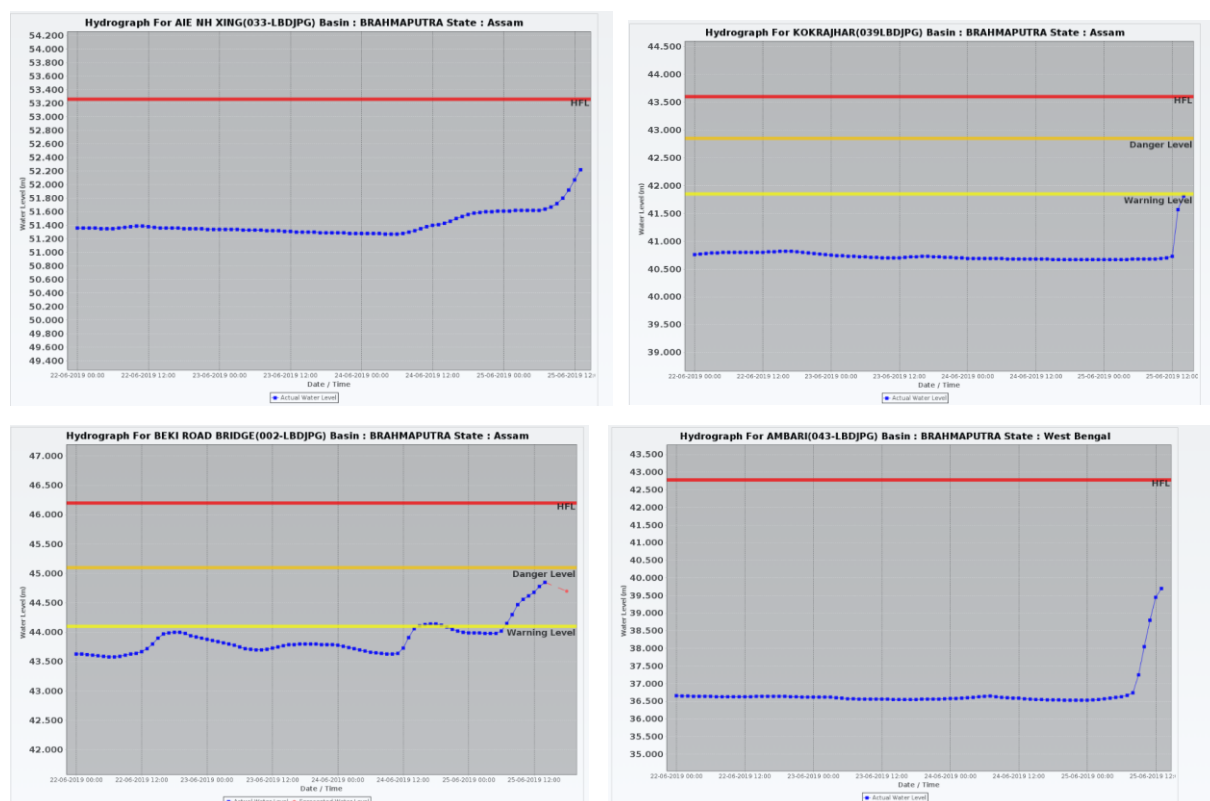

## 2.2 Flood Situation as per actual/forecasted rainfall situation

Due to very heavy rainfall occurring in Western Assam, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, rivers have started rising. Rivers Aie, Gaurang, Beki and Kaljani have risen significantly and the corresponding Hydrographs are appended.



Heavy to Very Heavy rainfall with isolated Extremely Heavy rainfall has been forecasted for **Assam, Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim** on 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> June and Heavy to very heavy rain has been forecasted for 28<sup>th</sup> June.

Situation in **Lower Brahmaputra (including Teesta Basin) and Barak Valley** has to be carefully monitored in view of the forecast of rainfall in the sub-basins of Manas, Beki, Champamati, Aie, Gaurang, Sankosh, Lower Brahmaputra downstream of Goalpara, Teesta, Torsa, Raidak, Jaldhaka in the States of Assam, Meghalaya, West Bengal & Sikkim. Further, flash floods may also be witnessed in the hill ranges of Sikkim in association with rainfall warnings.

**Districts to be kept on alert** during next 5 days in various States are mentioned below:

**Assam(26<sup>th</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup> June):** Barpeta, Chirang, Baksa, Bongaigaon, Kokrajhar, Dhubri, South Salmara

**Meghalaya (26<sup>th</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup> June):** West & North Garo Hills

**West Bengal (26<sup>th</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup> June):** Jalpaiguri & Coochbehar

**Sikkim (26<sup>th</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup> June):** East and South Sikkim
