


# Central Water Commission Daily Flood Situation Report cum Advisories 20-08-2021

#### 1.0 Rainfall Situation


## 1.1 Basin wise departure from normal of cumulative and daily rainfall

## 1.2 Rainfall forecast for next 5 days issued on 20th August, 2021 (Midday) by IMD



Very heavy rainfall over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 20<sup>th</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> August; over Uttarakhand during 20<sup>th</sup> – 24<sup>th</sup>; over Himachal Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh on 20<sup>th</sup>; over West Uttar Pradesh on 20<sup>th</sup> & 21<sup>st</sup> August, 2021.


#### 2.0 Flood Situation and Advisories

#### 2.1 Summary of Flood Situation as per CWC Flood Forecasting Network

On 20th August, 2021, 30 Stations (20 in Bihar, 5 in Uttar Pradesh, 3 in Assam and 1 each in Jharkhand & West Bengal) are flowing in Severe Flood Situation and 27 stations (12 in Bihar, 8 in Assam, 4 in Uttar Pradesh, 2 in West Bengal and 1 in Arunachal Pradesh) are flowing in Above Normal Flood Situation. Inflow Forecast has been issued for 16 Barrages & Dams (5 in Karnataka, 3 in Telangana, 2 each in Jharkhand, Tamil Nadu & Uttar Pradesh and 1 each in Andhra Pradesh & West Bengal).

#### 2.2 CWC Advisories

#### 2.2.1 Ganga Basin- Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand & West Bengal

Due to forecasted heavy to very heavy rainfall over Uttarakhand from 20<sup>th</sup> – 21<sup>st</sup> August 2021, there is likelihood of rise in water levels in rivers such as Bhagirathi, Alaknanda, Mandakini, Ganga, Ramganga, Sharda, Sarju etc. There is likelihood of flash floods in some of the hill districts in association with cloud burst. Necessary precautions have to be taken for possible landslides and blockages of river flows due to landslides in high ranges of the state. Hence alert may be kept in all hill districts of Uttarakahand.

Main Ganga river is flowing in above normal to severe flood situations in districts Budaun, Ballia (U.P), Patna, Munger, Bhagalpur (Bihar), Sahibganj (Jharkhand) & Murshirabad (West Bengal) with falling trends.

River Ghaghra in Barabanki, Ayodhya, Ballia (Uttar Pradesh) and Siwan (Bihar) districts it is flowing in above normal to severe flood situations. River Rapti is flowing in severe flood situations in Balrampur, Siddharth Nagar & Gorakhpur districts (U.P).

Currently, River Kosi in Supaul, Khagaria & Katihar (Bihar), River Sone and Punpun in Patna, River Bagmati in Sitamarhi, Muzzafarpur & Darbhanga (Bihar), River Gandak in Kushinagar (U.P), Gopalganj, Muzaffarpur & Vaishali (Bihar), River Parman in Araria (Bihar), River Adhwara in Darbhanga, Rivers Kamla & Kamlabalan in Madhubani, River Burhi Gandak in Purba Champaran, Samastipur & Khagaria, River Mahananda in Kishanganj, Purnia & Katihar in Bihar are flowing in severe to above normal flood situations. Flood situations may exist in the lower reaches of these rivers in the coming days.

### 2.2.2 Brahmaputra and its tributaries, Barak and Others - Assam, West Bengal, Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh & Meghalaya

IMD has predicted very heavy rainfall in the catchment of Brahmaputra and its tributaries from 20th – 21st August, hence, alert may be kept in Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, Assam, Sikkim & Arunachal Pradesh. Alert to be kept in the basins of Champabati, Aie, Gurang, Manas, Teesta, Raidak, Jaldhaka, Rangpochu, Rangit, Torsa, Beki, Pagladiya, Puthimari, Subansiri, Disang, Siang, Simsang, Digaru, Myntdu rivers and in all other tributaries of Brahmaputra. Alert may be kept in district **East Kameng** (Arunachal Pradesh). Precautions have to be taken for possible landslides and blockages of river flows due to landslides in hilly districts of West Bengal.

Due to past 3 to 4 days rainfall, Brahmaputra main river is flowing in above normal flood situations to severe flood situations in Sonitpur, Goalpara, Dhubri, Dibrugarh & Jorhat districts (Assam). Also tributaries of Brahmaputra namely Gaurang river in Kokrajhar, Beki river in Barpeta district, Jia-Bharali river in Sonitpur and Sankosh river in Dhubri (Assam); Torsa river in Coochbihar, Jaldhaka river in Jalpaiguri, Desang river in Sibsagar (West Bengal) are flowing in above normal flood situations to severe flood situations.

#### 2.2.3 Krishna basin - Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka

Most of the dams in Upper Krishna Basin are having very high storages. Hidkal Dam, Almatti Dam and Tungabhadra Dam are filled to their full capacity. Narayanpur and Bhadra Dams are 98% filled up. Malaprabha Dam on River Malaprabha is filled to 93% of its full capacity. Dams Koyana, Warna & Veer are also having high storage. Round the clock watch has to be maintained for proper reservoir operation. Releases from any of these reservoirs may be done as per rule curve and standard operating procedure.

#### 2.2.4 Narmada, Tapi, Tributaries of Yamuna - Madhya Pradesh

Due to the prevalence of Upper air cyclonic circulation over NE-M.P and neighborhood, IMD has forecasted heavy rainfall in the catchments of Narmada river (Barwani, Khargone, Khandwa dist.), Punasa & Kalisingh rivers (Ujjain, Dewa dist.), Betwa, Dhasan & Kuns rivers (Guna, Vidisha, Raisen dist.), Tapi river (Khandwa, Betul dist.) & Yamuna river (Bhind dist.) of Madhya Pradesh. So Alert may be kept.

#### 2.2.5 River Catchments in Himachal Pradesh

Alert may be kept in districts of Himachal Pradesh such as Solan, Sirmaur (Tons river), Kangra (Beas river) & Mandi (Beas & Satiuj rivers). Necessary precautions have to be taken for possible landslides and blockages of river flows due to landslides in high ranges of the state.

#### 2.3 Flash Flood Guidance


IMD has issued flash flood risk over few watersheds and neighbourhood of West Madhya Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand met subdivisions.


# 24hours Flash Flood Risk (FFR) Outlook Till 1130 IST of 21.08.2021:

Moderate Risk over few watersheds and neighborhoods of West Madhya Pradesh met subdivisions in next 24 hours.

Moderate to High Risk over several watersheds and neighborhoods of Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand met subdivisions in next 24 hours.

Surface runoff/ Inundation may occur at some fully saturated soils & low-lying areas over AoC as depicted in map due to expected forecasted rainfall in next 24 hours.





3.0 Storage Position in Dams where Inflow forecast is being issued by CWC as on 20<sup>th</sup>August, 2021
Reservoirs shown in red are having gross storage capacity more than 80% and those in orange are having gross storage greater than 60%. Close watch is to be maintained at these reservoirs whenever Very Heavy Rainfall (Orange) and Extremely Heavy Rainfall (Red) warning in next 120 hours are given below:
