


Central Water Commission Daily Flood Situation Report cum Advisories 21-08-2021

1.0 Rainfall Situation


1.1 Basin wise departure from normal of cumulative and daily rainfall

1.2 Rainfall forecast for next 5 days issued on 21th August, 2021 (Midday) by IMD



Very heavy rainfall over Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 21st; Uttarakhand on 23rd & 24th; East Uttar Pradesh on 25th; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya on 24th & 25th August, 2021.

2.0 Flood Situation and Advisories


2.1 Summary of Flood Situation as per CWC Flood Forecasting Network

On 21st August, 2021, 29 Stations (20 in Bihar, 4 in Uttar Pradesh, 3 in Assam and 1 each in Jharkhand & West Bengal) are flowing in Severe Flood Situation and 26 stations (11 in Bihar, 8 in Assam, 5 in Uttar Pradesh, 1 each in West Bengal and Arunachal Pradesh) are flowing in Above Normal Flood Situation. Inflow Forecast has been issued for 18 Barrages & Dams (4 in Karnataka, 3 in Uttar Pradesh, 2 each in Jharkhand, Tamil Nadu & Telangana and 1 each in Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha & West Bengal).

2.2.1 Ganga Basin- Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand & West Bengal

Due to forecasted heavy to very heavy rainfall over Uttarakhand from 21th– 22nd August 2021, there is likelihood of rise in water levels in rivers such as Bhagirathi, Alaknanda, Mandakini, Ganga, Ramganga, Sharda, Sarju, etc. mainly in districts **Dehradun**, **Uttarkashi**, **Nainital**, **Chamoli**, **Bageshwar & Uddham Singh Nagar**. There is likelihood of flash floods in some of the hill districts in association with cloud burst. Necessary precautions have to be taken for possible landslides and blockages of river flows due to landslides in high ranges of the state. Hence alert may be kept in all hill districts of Uttarakahand.

Main Ganga river is flowing in above normal to severe flood situations in districts Budaun, Ballia (U.P), Patna, Munger, Bhagalpur (Bihar), Sahibganj (Jharkhand) & Murshirabad (West Bengal) with falling trends.

River Ghaghra in Ayodhya, Ballia (Uttar Pradesh) and Siwan (Bihar) districts is flowing in above normal to severe flood situations. River Rapti is flowing in severe flood situations in Balrampur, Siddharth Nagar & Gorakhpur districts (U.P).

Currently, River Kosi in Supaul, Khagaria & Katihar (Bihar), River Sone and Punpun in Patna, River Bagmati in Muzzafarpur & Darbhanga (Bihar), River Gandak in Kushinagar (U.P), Gopalganj & Muzaffarpur (Bihar), River Parman in Araria (Bihar), River Adhwara in Darbhanga, Rivers Kamla & Kamlabalan in Madhubani, River Burhi Gandak in Purba Champaran, Muzaffarpur, Samastipur & Khagaria, River Mahananda in Kishanganj, Purnia & Katihar in Bihar are flowing in severe to above normal flood situations. Flood situations may exist in the lower reaches of these rivers in the coming days.

2.2.2 Brahmaputra and its tributaries, Barak and Others - Assam, West Bengal, Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh & Meghalaya

Due to past 4 to 5 days rainfall, Brahmaputra main river is flowing in above normal flood situations to severe flood situations in Sonitpur, Goalpara, Dhubri, Dibrugarh & Jorhat districts (Assam). Also tributaries of Brahmaputra namely Gaurang river in Kokrajhar, Beki river in Barpeta district, Buridehing river in Dibrugarh, Jia-Bharali river in Sonitpur and Sankosh river in Dhubri (Assam); Torsa river in Coochbihar (WB), Desang river in Sibsagar (Assam); Siang river in East Siang (Arunachal Pradesh) are flowing in above normal flood situations to severe flood situations.

2.2.3 Krishna basin - Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka

Most of the dams in Upper Krishna Basin are having very high storages. Hidkal Dam, Almatti Dam and Tungabhadra Dam are filled to their full capacity. Narayanpur and Bhadra Dams are 98% filled up. Malaprabha Dam on River Malaprabha is filled to 93% of its full capacity. Dams Koyana, Warna& Veer are also having high storage. Round the clock watch has to be maintained for proper reservoir operation. Releases from any of these reservoirs may be done as per rule curve and standard operating procedure.

2.2.4 Mahi, Tributaries of Yamuna – Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan

IMD has forecasted heavy rainfall in the catchments of Punasa & Kalisingh rivers (Ujjain, Dewas dist.) of Madhya Pradesh. So Alert may be kept.

Since heavy rainfall alert exist for Ratlam, Dhar, increased inflows are expected in Mahi Bajaj Sagar Dam and water level is expected to rise in Anas river of Mahi basin.

2.2.5 Sutlej and River Catchments in Himachal Pradesh and Punjab

Alert may be kept in districts of Himachal Pradesh such as **Solan**, **Sirmaur (Tons river)**, **Kangra (Beas river)**, **Mandi**, **Bilaaspur (Beas & Satiuj rivers)**. Necessary precautions have to be taken for possible landslides and blockages of river flows due to landslides in high ranges of the state.

In Punjab alert may be kept in rivers Beas and Sutlej. Keep watch in districts **Pathankot**, **Nawashahr**, **Rupnagar**, **Fategarh Sahib**, **Sangrur**, **Patiala & Ambala**.

2.2.6 Yamuna and its tributaries - Haryana, West Uttar Pradesh

IMD has forecasted rainfall in districts of Haryana such as Panipat, Yamunanagar, Sonipat, Rohtak, Jhajjar, Gurgaon, Faridhabad, Palwat, Mewat and Delhi, hence alert may be kept. In West U.P districts such as Shamali & Muzafarnagar are under alert.

2.3 Flash Flood Guidance


IMD has issued flash flood risk over few watersheds and neighbourhoods of Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh met subdivisions

24hours Flash Flood Risk (FFR) Outlook Till 1130 IST of 22.08.2021:

Moderate to High Risk over several watersheds and neighborhoods in the Uttarkashi, Rudraprayag, Chamoli, Bageshwar, Pittoragarh districts of Uttarakhand met subdivisions in next 24 hours.

Moderate to High Risk over few watersheds and neighborhoods in the Kinnaur, Shimla districts of Himachal Pradesh met subdivision in next 24 hours.

Surface runoff/ Inundation may occur at some fully saturated soils & low-lying areas over AoC as depicted in map due to expected forecasted rainfall in **next 24** hours.



3.0 Storage Position in Dams where Inflow forecast is being issued by CWC as on 21th August, 2021
Reservoirs shown in red are having gross storage capacity more than 80% and those in orange are having gross storage greater than 60%. Close watch is to be maintained at these reservoirs whenever Very Heavy Rainfall (Orange) and Extremely Heavy Rainfall (Red) warning in next 120 hours are given below:
