


# Central Water Commission Daily Flood Situation Report cum Advisories 25-08-2021

#### 1.0 Rainfall Situation


### 1.1 Basin wise departure from normal of cumulative and daily rainfall


### 2.1 Summary of Flood Situation as per CWC Flood Forecasting Network

On 25th August, 2021, 29 Stations (18 in Bihar, 5 in Uttar Pradesh, 4 in Assam and 1 each in Jharkhand & West Bengal) are flowing in Severe Flood Situation and 23 stations (10 in Bihar, 6 in Assam, 4 in Uttar Pradesh and 1 each in Tamil Nadu West Bengal & Arunachal Pradesh) are flowing in Above Normal Flood Situation. Inflow Forecast has been issued for 12 Barrages & Dams (3 in Tamilnadu, 2 each in Andhra Pradesh & Uttar Pradesh and 1 each in Karnataka, Telangana, Jharkhand, Odisha & West Bengal)

#### 2.2 CWC Advisories

#### 2.2.1 Ganga basin- Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand & West Bengal

As the monsoon trough at mean sea level continues to run along the foothills of the Himalayas and expected to remain till tomorrow. Heavy rainfall has been forecasted by IMD in Uttarakhand and Bihar. Hence there is likelihood of rise in water levels in rivers such as Upper Yamuna, Bhagirathi, Alaknanda, Mandakini, Ganga, Ramganga, Sharda, Sarju etc. There is likelihood of flash floods in some of the hill districts in association with cloud burst. Necessary precautions have to be taken for possible landslides and blockages of river flows due to landslides in high ranges of the state.

Main Ganga river is flowing in above normal to severe flood situations in districts Farrukhabad (Rising), Ballia (U.P.), Patna, Munger, Bhagalpur (Bihar), Sahibganj (Jharkhand) & Murshirabad (West Bengal) with falling trends.

River Ghaghra in **Ayodhya**, **Ballia** (**Uttar Pradesh**) and **Siwan** (**Bihar**) districts is flowing in severe to above normal flood situations. River Rapti is flowing in severe to above normal flood situations in **Balrampur**, **Siddharth Nagar & Gorakhpur districts** (**U.P.**).

Currently, River Kosi in Supaul, Khagaria & Katihar (Bihar), River Punpun in Patna, River Bagmati in Sitamarhi, Muzzafarpur & Darbhanga (Bihar), River Gandak in Kushinagar (U.P.), Gopalganj & Muzaffarpur (Bihar), River Parman in Araria (Bihar), River Adhwara in Darbhanga, Rivers Kamla & Kamlabalan in Madhubani, River Burhi Gandak in Muzaffarpur, Samastipur & Khagaria, River Mahananda in Kishanganj, Purnia & Katihar in Bihar are flowing in severe to above normal flood situations. In upper reaches of these rivers the water levels are expected to rise as heavy rains have been predicted over rivers originating from Nepal from 27.08.2021 onwards for 2 to 3 days. Rainfall is expected to increase in almost all districts of Uttarakhand and Arariya & Kishanganj districts of Bihar hence alert may be kept in Parman river and Mahananda river, as it is already in severe flood situations. Flood situations may exist in the lower reaches of these rivers in the coming days as the main stem of Ganga is in above normal to severe flood situations from Patna to Murshirabad.

#### 2.2.2 Brahmaputra and its tributaries, Barak and Others - Assam

Due to past 4 to 5 days rainfall, Brahmaputra main river is flowing in above normal flood situations to severe flood situations in Sonitpur, Goalpara, Dhubri, Dibrugarh, Kamrup & Jorhat districts (Assam). Also tributaries of Brahmaputra namely Beki river in Barpeta district, Jia-Bharali river in Sonitpur and Sankosh river in Dhubri (Assam); Torsa river in Coochbihar, Teesta river in Jalpaiguri (West Bengal); Siang river in east Siang (Arunachal Pradesh) are flowing in above normal flood situations to severe flood situations.

River Kushiyara is flowing in above normal situations in Karimgani (Assam).

IMD has predicted heavy rainfall, hence alert may be kept in districts Baska (West Bengal); South Sikkim, East Sikkim (Sikkim); Chirang, Kokrajhar, Barpeta and Kokrajhar (Assam); North & East Kameng, Upper & East Siang and Lower Subansiri (Arunachal Predesh). Hence heavy rainfall is expected in upper and middle Brahmaputra basin and tribuatries such as Teesta, Sankosh, Jaldhaka, Torsa, Manas, Beki, Raidak, Aie, Kaldiya, Puthimari, Dhansiri in next 2 to 3 days due to this, the river levels in many of these rivers are likely to rise.

#### 2.2.3 Krishna basin-Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka

Most of the dams in Upper Krishna Basin are having very high storages. Almatti, Narayanpur and Thunghabhadra Dams are more than 90% filled up. Dams P. D. Jurala, Srisailam, Koyna, Warna, Musi & Veer are also having high storages (more than 80%). Round the clock watch has to be maintained for proper reservoir operation. Releases from any of these reservoirs may be done as per rule curve and standard operating procedure by prior informing the lower riparian areas.


#### 2.3. Flash Flood Guidance

IMD has issued flash flood risk over few watersheds and neighborhoods of Arunachal Pradesh met subdivisions.

## 24 hours Flash Flood Risk (FFR) Outlook Till 1130 IST of 26.08.2021:

Moderate to High Risk likely over few watersheds and neighborhoods of Arunachal Pradesh met subdivisions in next 24 hours.

Surface runoff/ Inundation may occur at some fully saturated soils & lowlying areas over AoC as depicted in map due to expected rainfall occurrence in next 24 hours.



3.0 Storage Position in Dams where Inflow forecast is being issued by CWC as on 25<sup>th</sup>August, 2021
Reservoirs shown in red are having gross storage capacity more than 80% and those in orange are having gross storage greater than 60%. Close watch is to be maintained at these reservoirs whenever Very Heavy Rainfall (Orange) and Extremely Heavy Rainfall (Red) warning in next 120 hours are given below:
