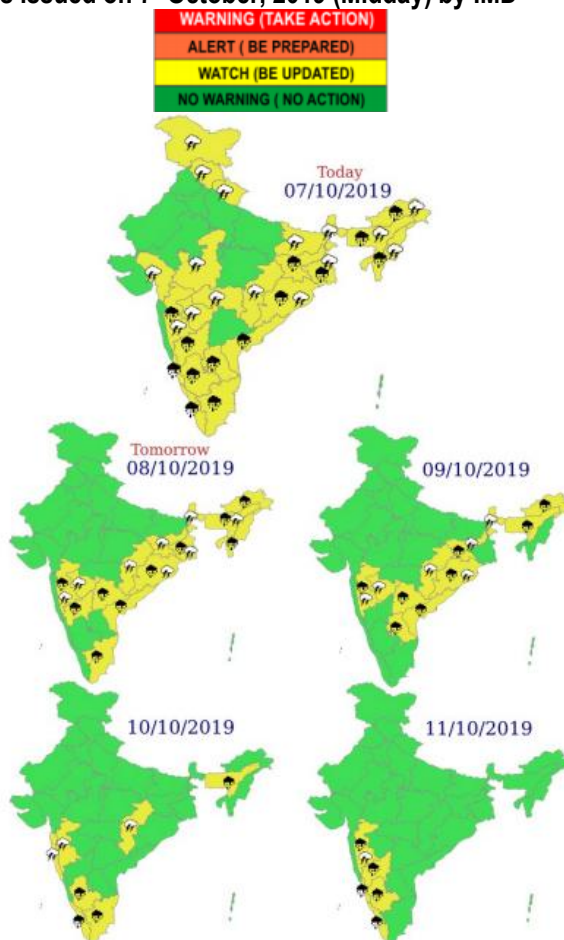

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2.1.1 Bihar

River Levels in most of the north bank tributaries of Ganga in Bihar are falling slowly. River Ganga at Patna Gandhighat is flowing at 48.77 m at 1600 hrs with falling trend which is 0.17 m above its Danger Level and is expected to fall to 48.63 m by tomorrow morning. At Bhagalpur, the river is flowing at 33.97 m with falling trend at 1600 hrs which is 0.29 m above its Danger Level and is expected to fall to 33.8 m by tomorrow evening. At Kahalgau, the river is flowing at 32.04 m at 1600 hrs which is 0.95 m above its Danger Level and is expected to fall to 31.85 m by tomorrow night.

2.1.2 Uttar Pradesh

As the rainfall has reduced, River Ganga at Ballia continues in Severe Flood Situation with falling trend and is likely to fall further but still continue to flow in Severe Flood Situation for another 1-2 days.

2.1.3 Jharkhand and West Bengal

River Ganga at Sahebganj in Sahebganj District of Jharkhand and Farakka in Murshidabad District of West Bengal are flowing in Severe Flood Situation and are expected to fall slowly.

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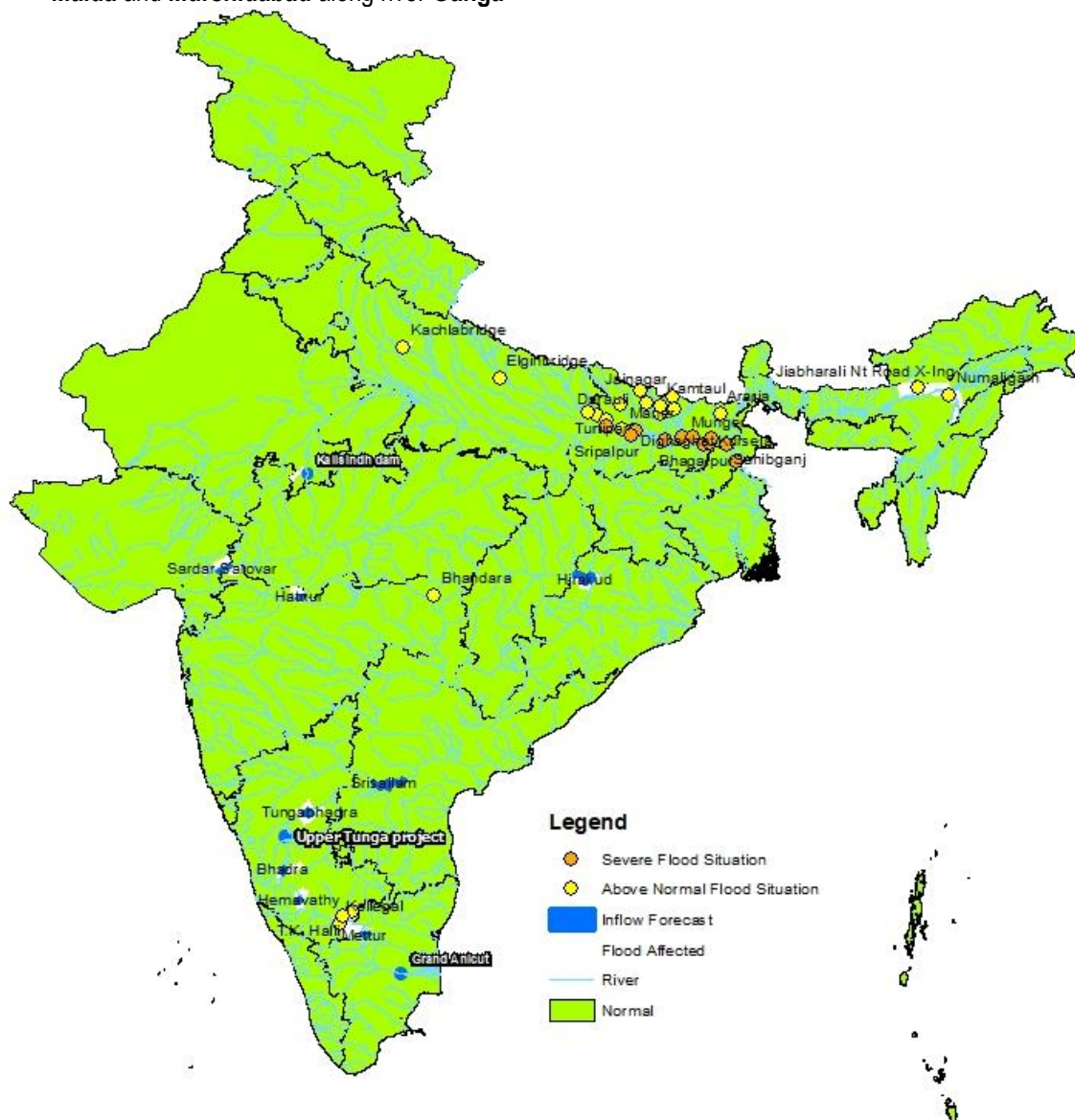


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2.2 Flood Affected Districts

Uttar Pradesh: River Ganga at Ballia
Bihar: Districts along course of River Ganga from Patna to Bhagalpur
Jharkhand: Sahebganj District along river Ganga
West Bengal: Malda and Murshidabad along river Ganga



2.3 Cessation of Daily Flood Situation Report cum Advisories (DFSRCA)

There is no major rainfall warning in any of the river basins and almost all the rivers are in falling trend in most of the basins. The South West Monsoon is likely to withdraw from North West India in the next 2-3 days, this will be the last DFSRCA for the year 2019. However, Daily Flood Bulletin will continue to be issued till 31st December 2019 from the Central Flood Control Room, New Delhi. In case of any significant flood situation, Special Flood Advisories will be issued during the period of floods.

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
